

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Donors make significant impact on the University

his issue of HARDING magazine is a very special one. In it appears a lengthy list on pages 19 through 29 that I hope you will take a few minutes to scan. This is an important list of the University's donors who had a significant impact on Harding during 1992.

During the year these donors gave a record \$7.5 million, which allowed Harding to complete several capital projects, award more scholarships to students, provide a Christian education second to none for more than 3,600 students, and to finish fiscally in the black for the 56th consecutive year.

Each is a great accomplishment, and I hope all of the donors take pride in their part in the record total and the part they had in one of the greatest years in the school's history.

It is important for donations to increase because Harding is growing and expanding its realm of services and influence. But equally significant last year was the number of different donors to the University — 5,914. That total was an increase over the previous year and was just shy of an all-time high. Included in the number were individuals, churches, corporations and foundations.

All of the constituencies support Harding for one reason: They believe in Harding's mission to provide a Christian atmosphere while providing an academically challenging education for tomorrow's scientists, church leaders, teachers, business executives and other professionals.

One group of individuals has been extremely supportive of Harding and deserves special recognition. Harding alumni in 1992 contributed \$1.19 million and represented the largest single group of donors. The 1992 total marked the fifth consecutive year that alumni giving has topped the million-dollar mark. That is quite a record of sustained support by this group that knows Harding so well. Last year was also the third

consecutive year that the percentage of alumni contributing had topped the 35 percent mark.

We are appreciative of the support of all groups, including alumni, parents, faculty/staff members, church friends, students and other individuals. This broad base of financial support is so important to us, and it has almost become a trademark of Harding. That base of support was never more evident than in our "Beyond Excellence" campaign begun in 1988.

On June 30 we will conclude the "Beyond Excellence" campaign. Once the pledges are paid and the gifts received, Harding will have surpassed the campaign's \$25 million goal for current and capital gifts. This campaign has been the largest ever undertaken by the University and its supporters.

During the campaign 15,588 different individuals, corporations, foundations or other donors had a part in its success — a statistic that indicates the nature of our base of support. That number and that level of support is truly significant for Harding.

1992 is behind us and, for the most part, so is the "Beyond Excellence" campaign. Now we are turning our sights to new challenges, which you will be reading about in the coming months. One thing is certain: Harding will still need the help of all her constituencies. One of our primary goals during the next five years will be to broaden our base of support.

If Harding is to reach new levels of service and achieve even higher levels of academic excellence, then we will need to have the support of more and more individuals who share the Harding dream and believe in the school's mission of "educating for eternity." H

The challenge was issued on a two-for-one basis to secure funds for the new McInteer Center, which is scheduled to begin construction this spring. Under the conditions of the challenge, Harding has until February 1994 to raise \$4 million in gifts and pledges. The 63.000-square-foot McInteer Center will be the largest classroom facility on the Harding campus.

The challenge grant is the largest foundation grant ever received by Harding and is the third donation

made by the Iones Trust. Previously, the trust had given \$100,000 to Harding's School of Nursing and \$400,000 to the University's "Beyond Excellence" campaign.

Early in this century Harvey and Bernice Jones established a trucking company that developed into a major competitor in the trucking industry in the South and Southwest.

Mr. Jones served 19 years as president of the Springdale School Board. The Jones Trust annually awards scholarships and has extended support to public schools in the Springdale area and other educational institutions throughout the state. Mr. Jones died at age 88 March 30, 1989.

One of the couple's biggest projects was the establishment of Har-Ber Village near Grove, Okla., in 1968. The village is a 100-building complex containing authentic collections and antiques personally selected by the Ioneses.

President David Burks described Mrs. Bernice Iones as "a genuine, giving and caring person. The entire Harding family salutes her for helping make this project and the new marriage and family therapy program possible."

rooms will be directly linked 3,428: Spring enrollment sets new record

Registration for Harding's spring semester totaled 3,428, which set a record for spring enrollment figures. Last year's spring semester enrollment was 3,350.

The record spring figure includes approximately 100 students who are enrolled in college for the first time and 30 students in the School of Biblical Studies. Also, more than 4 percent more applications were accepted than were last spring.

The University's 10 residence halls are at a greater rate of occupancy, with more than 100 additional students living in the dorms than at this time last year. Students in residence halls now number 2.050.

Represented in the enrollment are 49 states, with only the state of Rhode Island not included. A total of 160 students list foreign nations as their residence with 30 countries represented, including Austria, Denmark, Hungary, Norway, Romania and several Central and South American countries.

The spring number is a drop of 252 from the fall's record count of 3,681, but about 170 students completed their degrees and received diplomas in December graduation ceremonies.

"We're excited about the figures for this semester," said Mike Williams, director of admissions. "The great interest among high school students is really encouraging to us."

Classes for the spring semester will conclude May 14 with graduation ceremonies to be held May 15 in Benson Auditorium.

Harding bosts Christian College Choral Festival

The 27th annual Christian College Choral Festival took center stage in Benson Auditorium Jan. 9.

More than 550 singers representing 11 colleges and universities participated in this year's event, which rotates each year to a different senior Christian college. Harding was well represented with 175 students in its three choral groups - the Chorus, Singers and Concert Choir.

The Chorus, directed by Dr. Cliff Ganus III, performed "Spanish Shepherds' Song" (arr. Goff Richards) and "Blind Man" (arr. Diane Loomer), and the Singers, also directed by Ganus, performed Alexander Gretchaninoff's "Holy Radiant Light" and Joseph Shabalala's "Rain, Rain, Beautiful Rain" (arr. Everett). The Concert Choir, directed by Dr. Arthur Shearin, performed "The Reason" (Kauflin, Nalle and Coates) and "Precious Lord" (arr. Arnold Sevier).

As in 1986, when Harding

last served as host for the festival. attendance at the event and the level of participation by Harding students were noteworthy.

Shearin said, "Harding's hosting of this event is always the largest because of the more central location of Searcy and because of the outstanding choral tradition here. Not only does Harding have more singers participating, but many of the other schools' choral directors are Harding alumni." Indeed, this year's choral directors from David Lipscomb University, Faulkner University, Freed-Hardeman University. Michigan Christian College, Southwestern Christian College and York College were all Harding alumni.

Each year at the end of the program, all participants in the festival gather together as the Festival Chorus and sing several selections, directed by a guest clinician. Serving as guest clinician this year was Kenneth Davis, director of choral activi-

ties at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas.

In addition to directing the three well-known and awardwinning choral groups at Texas Tech, Davis served as choral director for the Chautaugua Institution, a summer arts community in western New York state, in its 1991 and 1992 seasons. He also has studied privately with Roger Wagner, has sung and recorded with the Atlanta Symphony Chorus, and performed in a select 48-voice ensemble with Robert Shaw at the Robert Shaw Institute in southern France.

The joining together of all the colleges' choral voices is always a highlight of the Choral Festival evening. "I was certainly pleased with the quality of the festival this year," Shearin said, "but the thing that pleases me most is the wonderful spirit of goodwill that exists between the different schools and chorus members involved. They participate together without a feeling of competition, which is the intended tone of the occasion."

The ceremonies were held Dec. 19 in Benson Auditorium with Stan Bratcher, minister of the Westside Church of Christ in Searcy, as speaker. Bratcher started his preaching ministry in 1956 and has served congregations in Texas and Oklahoma. He and his family moved to Searcy in 1986.

In the College of Bible and Religion, 11 received the bachelor of arts degree. In the College of Arts and Sciences, 51 received the bachelor of arts, 19 the bachelor of science, and one the bachelor of music edu-

From the School of Business. 40 received the bachelor of business administration, and 10 received the bachelor of arts. Twenty-two students completed the bachelor of arts from the School of Education. Four earned the master of education degree, and three the master of science in education. Eight were awarded the bachelor of science in nursing degree.

Chorus travels to Jamaica in January

Thirty-nine members of Harding's Chorus toured Jamaica Jan. 2-8 as part of the group's spring semester tour schedule. The Chorus is under the direction of Dr. Cliff Ganus, professor of music.

The group presented a total of five concerts sponsored by local churches and city officials in the cities of Kingston, Port Maria and Montego Bay. Their performances had great attendance, with four of the five concerts having standing-roomonly space available.

"We saw a side of Jamaica that most tourists don't get to

see. In some ways it is almost a Third-World country when you consider some of the island's living conditions. Nonetheless, the people were extremely nice and very receptive to us," Ganus said.

Part of the tour included a three-day workshop on music and worship, which the Chorus conducted at the Jamaican School of Preaching. "The school only has 20 students, but more than 30 individuals attended. We were pleased with the outcome and that it was well received," Ganus said.

The trip highlight was when

the Chorus sang before 600 people in Kingston at the University of the West Indies. The Jamaican representative of the Queen of Ireland attended the performance, as did the mayor of the city.

The group also performed for children at a local Kingston school and recorded a performance at the city's television station. The week-long trip provided an opportunity for members of the Chorus to learn about another culture and to be introduced to possible mission efforts available in the Caribbean region.

Applications represent 13 percent increase over 1992

Applications received from high school and transfer students for admission for the fall 1993 semester represent a 13 percent increase over the number received at the same date in 1992. Enrollment figures from the University's Admissions Services Office have consistently shown an increase of between 12 and 14 percent each week for many months.

Admissions reports for expected fall registration reflect a 15.5 percent increase in the number of students who have already been accepted when compared to this time last year. More than 550 of those accepted to date will be freshman students in college for the first time.

Admissions Director Mike Williams has urged high school students planning to make application to begin the process as soon as possible to assure necessary time for all requirements to be fulfilled.

"We appear to be headed to another capacity enrollment. We're continuing to accept students at this point, but the acceptance process is complicated through delay," Williams said. Counselors and advisors are available to assist with inquiries, Williams added.

The fall semester will get under way Aug. 19 with the official ceremony of the President's Reception for Faculty. Student Impact will begin Aug. 21, registration will begin Aug. 23, and classes will begin Aug. 25.

May Keller dies at 86

Long-time supporter of Harding

May Keller, a long-time supporter of Harding, died Feb. 8 in Hayti, Mo., at the age of 86. Keller was born in Yell County, Ark., near Dardanelle but had lived in Hayti since the early 1920s.

A men's dormitory built at Harding in 1967 was named in honor of Keller in 1971. The Albert and May Keller Residence Hall was dedicated Oct. 29, 1971. The 42,000-square-foot facility provides space for 210 male students. Keller's uncle died in January 1964, and the building was also named in



his honor at the dedication ceremonies.

A plaque mounted in the lobby of the Keller dormitory states that Albert and May Keller were "people who cared about others. Through a back-

ground of hard work and sacrifice, they developed a genuine love for both God and man. This building is dedicated to them and to their desire to share their blessings with others by providing a home for many young men who will learn similar lessons in years to come."

Berryman trains students for mission work

Mark Berryman's dreams have changed dramatically during the last 20 years. Once in training as a college basketball coach, he now trains college students for lifetimes of mission work and service to God.

Berryman is Harding's missionary-in-residence, a position he has held since the 1990-91 school year. The program is designed to enhance Harding's overall missions focus by exposing students to experienced missionaries and instilling in them a desire to be long-term missionaries themselves.

Having worked for five years in 18 different countries of Africa, Berryman is teaching the course "Seminar in World Missions: Africa" this semester. He also travels to Memphis twice a week to take courses at Harding's Graduate School of Religion, where he is finishing his master's degree in missions and church growth.

Berryman received his bachelor's degree from Northwestern State University of Louisiana, where he was trained for his long-time dream of coaching college basketball. He then received his master's degree in education with an emphasis in physical education from Harding during the 1977-78 school year.

While at Harding he and some friends were discussing methods of missions one night, and Berryman decided to talk with President Emeritus George Benson about his mission experiences in China. Although Berryman had no intentions of pursuing a career in mission work, Benson told him about Africa and the need in Zambia for a teacher, and soon afterward he showed Berryman some slides about Africa. Four months later Berryman was teaching New Testament, Old Testament, world history and African history in Zambia.

He soon found that teaching

was not his forte, but that he loved working among the people in the villages. He began preaching some, and in 1980 he visited Kenya for the first time and witnessed an excellent on-going rural churchplanting program. There he realized the value of teaching others by conforming as much as possible to their own cultures and settings.

Berryman returned to the States, working briefly as a girls' basketball coach. He then helped a friend start a company that sold bank/savings and loan equipment. The company prospered, and soon Berryman was running it. But the fire in his heart had been lit, and he found himself being pulled back to Africa.

Over the next few years with the financial help of his supporting congregation, the Airline Drive Church of Christ in Bossier City, La. - Berryman worked with Nigerian Christian Hospital and taught at the preacher training school there; lived in Kenya, working with church-planting missionaries, and helped host some Harding students and Bible professor Van Tate; and teamed up with associate Phil Palmer for a year, researching the best areas in which to establish new churches in Africa.

That last experience took Berryman to the countries of Uganda, Tanzania, Zaire and Ivory Coast, and to 15 tribes and six major cities. Soon he was being asked by Christian colleges and universities to visit and tell about his experiences.

In the spring of 1988, Berryman was asked by Pepperdine and Abilene Christian University students to take a group of them to Africa — an event that would become an annual tradition for him and involve students from several different colleges. Fifteen students accompanied him to Africa that

Berryman moved to Searcy in January 1989, and that summer he, along with visiting missionary Monte Cox, took 21 Harding students and a few from other schools to Kenya. Although he suffered health problems during the trip and spent a month in a Nairobi hospital, he was ready the next summer to take 25 more Harding students to Africa.

Twenty more students went with him in the summer of '91. The next summer, because of political unrest in Kenya, the trip was canceled. But this did not stop Berryman. He instead traveled to French-speaking countries of Africa with student Nick Fouts, researching locations for future mission teams.

Berryman is again planning to take about 20 more students to Kenya this summer. It is gratifying for him to know that more than 65 Harding students have traveled to East Africa with him so far and, of those, more than one-third of them have committed to long-term mission work in countries where the churches of Christ are very few.

"God uses all of us - researchers, supporters, missionaries and Africans - to encourage students to return to Africa as missionaries. It is God's mission, and we are participants with Him."

But Berryman's work has just begun. "Our goal is for thousands to go to Africa during our lifetimes," he said, "but we would also like to see Africans being missionaries to Africa. We need to spend more time urging them and showing them where they need to go in their own continent."

In the meantime, Berryman will continue to affect the lives of countless college students this year at Harding while fanning the flame of God's message to the world.

Dr. Don Diffine (business) will teach an "Economics for Banking" course May 17-21 in Memphis, Tenn., for the Board of Regents of the Mid-South School of Banking. The course provides special emphasis on macroeconomic and microeconomic topics of importance to bankers.

Crockett also attended the Southern Early Childhood Association state meeting in October. She presented a session titled "Art for a Creative Tomorrow," and was appointed to co-author a history of the organization.

National Leadership Forum slated for June

For 37 years Harding has provided a week of leadership education each summer for about 400 youths from Arkansas and its neighboring states. The National Leadership Forum, previously known as the Youth Citizenship Seminar, is part of Harding's American Studies Institute.

This year the new name was given to the summer seminar "as part of our effort to stress the leadership qualities of our youth," said Bob Reely, director of the program.

The forum is scheduled this year for June 13-18 and is open to students of outstanding character and leadership ability who are entering the 10th, 11th or 12th grades. The students will hear presentations about free enterprise, foreign policy, family values and the environment, and they will examine the issues of AIDS, the homeless and drug/alcohol abuse.

The program was started in 1956 by Civitan Clubs in Alabama and Florida as a program to encourage good citizenship. It grew rapidly and is now sponsored by many different civic clubs and state and county Farm Bureaus with the cooperation of Harding University's American Studies Institute. The students are housed in dormitories and utilize the ASI Conference Center for the presentations that are

Through lectures, films, research, and association with recognized authorities and speakers, the goal for the participants attending will be to become better acquainted with the American scene and motivated to a more forceful expression of pride in America's traditions and ideals.

Speakers for this year's forum include Tommy Thompson, a general who has been stationed in Russia and Eastern Europe, who will speak on "The Changing World in Which We Live:" Mike Huckabee, a preacher who entered the realm of politics when he recently ran for a seat in the U.S. Senate; Joe Buehrle, who will relay his tragic story of drug abuse; Dith Pran, whose personal experience was the focus of the movie "The Killing Fields"; and Gene Antonio, author of The AIDS Coverup.

"I believe we've prepared an experience for these students that is unparalleled in this nation. This is the only way that we can preserve America's principles and ideals and make sure it is passed on to each oncoming generation," said Reely.

Gospel Explosion weekend expanded

Gospel Explosion '93, the annual weekend of music and fellowship featuring regional minority singing groups and information for prospective Harding students, was held Feb. 19-20.

In the past, Gospel Explosion had been a relatively small pany, and attended a devotional on the steps of the Administration Building. Games and other activities were scheduled Saturday morning, and after dinner that evening, guests attended the Gospel Explosion concert featuring all the participating groups.

The event was sponsored by Ujima, the 40-member group geared toward the interests of minorities on campus. "Ujima" is Swahili for "collective work and responsibility by all"; it was chosen a year ago as the new name for the group formerly known as Skotia, which formed in 1983. Ann Brown, instructor of English and writing coordinator for Student Support Services, serves as Ujima's faculty sponsor.

Marcus Grayson, a senior radio/television major from Kansas City, Kan., is president of Ujima this year. He said that Ujima gives minority students an outlet for activity similar to the campus social clubs through mixers, hayrides, parties and events such as Gospel Explosion and chapel presentations during Black History

"We appreciate the help from the admissions office in helping us reach more minority congregations for Gospel Explosion," Grayson said. "We're trying to be the minority conscience on campus, and there are a lot of ways to help raise that consciousness. Gospel Explosion is one of those ways."

Third Alumni College scheduled for October

This year's fall session of Harding's Alumni College week is scheduled for Oct. 17-23. The new program, which debuted last fall, has enjoyed great success, both in the October 1992 session and in the April '93 session.

Alumni College brings alumni and friends 50 years of age or older to the campus for a nostalgic week of instruction, fellowship and fun. Three courses, which are not for academic credit, are taught by faculty members during the week with no homework, exams or grade, and participants may attend daily chapel programs with University students as well.

The week of activities begins on Sunday afternoon and ends the next Saturday morning. In between are scheduled classes, meals, outings and tours, oncampus programs and free time. All expenses for classroom instruction, three meals a day in the University cafeteria, and lodging in the on-campus Heritage Inn are included in the \$260 program fee. (Single rooms are available to participants at a modest additional charge.) All lodging, classes and meals are housed conveniently in the American Heritage Conference Center.

Dr. Jimmy Carr, Alumni College coordinator, said that the response to the program from alumni and friends has been so overwhelmingly positive that an increase of one or two sessions per year may be in store.

During each session three of Harding's most successful instructors are selected to teach relevant courses to Alumni College participants. Scheduled for the October session are Dr. Billy Mattox with "The Psychology of Staying Young," an examination of a psychological approach toward good nutrition and physical well being; Dr. Tom Howard with "Gov-

ernment by the Minority," a review of political attitudes and participation in the American democracy; and Dr. Clifton L. Ganus Jr., chancellor, with "Our Heritage of Freedom," a discussion of the American concept of freedom and its fundamentals and development from colonial times to present.

The concept for Alumni College is based on the national Elderhostel program, coordinated in Boston. Harding has

been successfully involved in that program for 11 years and now conducts six Elderhostels per year for students 60 and older. The Alumni College idea grew out of the desire for a similar program tailored for Harding alumni and friends.

Nicky Boyd, men's basketball coach, resigned March 4. The announcement of the resignation was made by Dr. Harry Olree, athletic director.


Boyd, 46, had served as head coach since 1990. His career record as Bison head coach was 24-62. His 1992-93 squad finished the season with a 4-23 mark.

FOCUS ON FACULTY RESEARCH

One mark of a distinctive university is its faculty's involvement in research. Harding is making its own such mark, as faculty members campus-wide involve themselves in various research projects in their fields of study. Some particularly noteworthy projects have recently involved members of the physical sciences, nursing and computer science faculties.

us. Such is the case with Dr. Ed Wilson, professor of chemistry,

whose research conducted for his doctoral dissertation in 1968 has experienced a recent resurgence of interest by the scientific community.

Wilson's dissertation described a new method of determining the amount of water found in a material by measuring the amount of heat the material produces in a chemical reaction. Years later a graduate school friend of his happened to meet representatives from Sanda, a company that makes scientific instruments, and told them about Wilson's research and method.

Soon after, Wilson saw an ad for Sanda's new instrument, the titration calorimeter, which measures water content using the method based on his research. Wilson was flattered.

"It was very pleasant to see someone practically using something I'd researched," he said.

Wilson's method is now known as the Sadtler-Wilson method (Sadtler is the owner of the Sanda Co.). Wilson explained that his

istory often comes back to haunt method, which can determine water content in materials ranging from fuming nitric acid to motor oil and choco-

late, has great advantages over the traditional Karl Fischer method, and it is these advantages that will be the subject of an article he has been asked to write for the Journal of Analytical Chemistry.

> These advantages will include the fact that his method is easier to execute than the Karl Fischer method; that it determines water content in some materials the Fischer method cannot; and that it uses chemicals that are safer, easier to store, do not have an offensive odor, and are environmentally friendly. He added, however, that no method is 100-percent applicable and that, in order to cover the entire spectrum of testing, both methods are needed.

Like his water-content research, one of Wilson's other recent projects involves previous work. For the last three summers, he has been participating in an ongoing study at the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville's department of chemistry and biochemistry.

The project involves the study of how electrons are

transported through proteins, and it is funded by a sizeable, multi-year grant from EPSCoR, the Experimental Pro-

gram to Stimulate Cooperative Research. This program, initiated by Arkansas Rep. Ray Thornton and Congress several years ago, helps to fund projects in states lacking a great deal of active research and gets them to a level at which they can compete nationally.

To detect the speed at which electrons move across proteins, Wilson and his fellow researchers use a laser to energize the proteins, and the light given off by them is measured as a fraction of time. Wilson built the detector that makes this measurement. He also has made compounds used in the research with these proteins and has constructed a cyclic voltammetry instrument, an electrochemical device that the researchers are interfacing with a computer to capture data. He is now working on yet another molecule that is needed for this continuing

Back in the classroom, Wilson is also busy working with several students on their own research projects.

Wilson, who received his bachelor's degree in chemistry in 1962 at Auburn University, earned his master's degree in 1965 and his doctoral degree in 1968 from the University of Alabama.

r. Cathleen Shultz, dean and professor of the School of Nursing, is one of Harding's most active faculty members. She's a strong believer in continued professional development and is involved in projects of different kinds that keep her current in her field.

A recent and personally meaningful project for Shultz actually began in 1986 with a study of loneliness and its effects on the elderly. This study soon progressed into a full-fledged research project, about which she has written extensively and made numerous presentations.

Shultz first published her thoughts concerning the subject of loneliness when she was asked to write several chapters of the 1988 edition of a nursing textbook, Mental Health Psychiatric Nursing: A Holistic Life-Cycle Approach. Revisions of her chapter about loneliness now appear in the just-released 1993 edition. She said her personal interest in the subject really began to grow while working on this

manuscript, and she continued to become particularly interested in loneliness' effects on the elderly.

She noticed that most published research concerning loneliness among the elderly seemed one-sided. The studies' conclusions were not based on all the various psychological indicators that allegedly contribute to an older person's loneliness; rather, most tested only one or two of the indicators and based the results on them. Most scales were "normed" on nonelderly groups.

Utilizing input over five years from more than 500 participants aged 65 to

Five-year Study. Dr. Cathleen Shultz's loneliness studies have been published in several journals and have been the subject of numerous presentations.

103 from 28 states, Shultz and her interdisciplinary research associates conducted their own pilot study. They used several standard loneliness-scale questionnaires, which enabled them to explore the relationship of loneliness in their subjects with the presence of four psychological indicators: age-related losses, including close relationships lost through death, the declining of physical health, and the moving away of children and ending of a career; hopelessness, the belief that continual loss is inevitable; self-transcendence, one's ability to look beyond

self-concerns in order to remain actively involved in relationships, activities and life in general; and spiritual well-being.

Most of the study's subjects were relatively healthy, well-educated, independent older people of varied religious backgrounds who were attending spring and summer university classes. This, coupled with the inclusion of the four loneliness factors, helped Shultz in developing several new and revised loneliness scales "normed" on the well elderly.

Results of the study showed lower loneliness scores to be associated with

> fewer age-related losses. Higher hopelessness scores were found to be associated with higher loneliness. Lower loneliness scores were associated with higher scores of spiritual well-being and self-transcendence.

Shultz's research has been published in journals, including Nursing Research, Archives of Psychiatric Nursing and Journal of Women and Aging. She also has presented the materials to national conventions of Sigma Theta Tau Inter-

national, the nursing honor society; the National League for Nursing; the Southern Nursing Research Society; the Southern Council on Collegiate Education for Nursing; and the National Gerontological Association.

Shultz is particularly interested in the relationship of loneliness to hope and despair, and to spiritual well-being. "By determining what lonely people can do to help others, they can help alleviate their loneliness," she said. "It's fascinating what loneliness can do to a person's health if not minimized. Our study showed that

when your mind is kept active, you're never bored — and you're less likely to be lonely."

Shultz received her bachelor of science in nursing degree from the University of South Carolina, her master's from Emory University, and her doctorate from Vanderbilt University's George Peabody College for Teachers. She was inducted as one of the state's first Fellows of the American Academy of Nursing in 1992.

he NASA/University Joint Venture (JOVE) is a national program designed to involve new academic researchers with the nation's space program. It involves 55 institutions in 37 states and Puerto Rico.


Harding is one such participant in the program. Participating faculty members include Dr. Lambert Murray and Dr. James Mackey, professors of physical science, and Dr. Steve Baber, professor of mathematics and computer science.

JOVE sponsors faculty research at institutions where research is not the major focus. The partnership requires that universities match the NASA support by obligating faculty members research time and student support. Student participation is encouraged by JOVE because it invariably enhances their interest in science-related course work.

JOVE-sponsored research equipment is very diverse. As it is an ongoing program, Harding has participated in several different projects. Murray explained that current JOVE research is composed of three solar projects. Each utilizes students as an integral part of the work, which is performed in conjunction with 1970 Harding alumnus Dr. Jim Dowdy of the solar branch at Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Ala.

The first project involves both the study of the far ultraviolet end of the solar spectrum and the development of a software package that will analyze photographic data taken of the region. By studying data collected by Skylab in 1974, the ultimate objective is to create software that can analyze future data from that same spectral region using instruments now being manufactured. Phil Joyner, a senior physics and mathematics major, is heavily involved in the project.

Another student, senior physics and mathematics major Paul Finley, is working extensively with the second project. He is plotting magnetic field lines on the surface of the sun using

data recorded by a magnetograph, an instrument for comparing the intensity and direction of magnetic fields. Plotting the magnetic field lines helps researchers identify solar activity in connection with solar flares.

The third JOVE project involves computer science majors Tyler Cutshall, a senior, and Dave Anderson, a junior. The goal of their work is to use the maximum entropy algorithm to improve solar images also taken by Skylab.

To do this they first are reworking software for their lab computer, enabling them to test the algorithm, which is a mathematical "package" that attempts to best fit a curve to a set of data points. By doing so they hope to pick up on small-scale variations on the surface of the sun in order to achieve an accurate image enhancement. The Sun microcomputer work station was provided by NASA and is designed specifically for image manipulation.

Because Harding's involvement with the JOVE program is an ongoing arrangement, five freshmen have be-

gun to work with the various projects.

Murray said that a major player in Harding's involvement with the JOVE program has been Greg Lindstrom, lab coordinator and researcher, who graduated from Harding in 1988 and is now working on his master's degree from Texas A&M University. Lindstrom's math and computer experience have made him a valuable resource in assisting the student groups with their projects.

Senior students who are involved with the JOVE project work during the summers as paid assistants, and each year new students are recruited for the program. NASA's ongoing grant supplies JOVE project funds for student work, faculty travel and several scholarships. Additionally, NASA supplied the computer

Internet network connection on campus that enables project workers to communicate via computer directly to Marshall Space Flight Center.

hese three research projects are but a few of the many endeavors being undertaken by Harding faculty members. The projects attest to the fact that some of the finest scholars in the nation are at work on the Harding campus, and through these faculty members, students are receiving some of the most professional instruction their tuition dollars can buy. \mathbb{H}

TUESDAY MORNING, 9:00. The bell rings, and chapel begins as three men climb the stairs to the front of the Benson Auditorium stage. One of them takes his place at the podium to begin the morning's devotional as more than 3,000 students stare back at him, listening quietly.

These students form a common group with a common purpose and itinerary for the morning — yet they are distinctly different. Each one has his own story, his own reason for being in chapel at Harding University on Tuesday at 9:03 a.m.

But perhaps most interesting are not the stories of those who hail from the towns and cities across the United States, but of those who chose to leave their home countries for study abroad at a Christian university in Arkansas. These are Harding's international students - 139 of them to be exact. And they come from 30 countries and six continents.

TAKE RUZICA DAKOVIC, for example. Today she is a Harding sophomore, 25 years old — and half a world away from the wartorn plains of her homeland. Croatia. As the civil unrest so familiar to us on the evening news works to erode economic and family life in her country, Ruzica is studying to complete her computer information systems degree at Harding.

Ruzica comes from a Christian family. After working one year toward a law

degree in a university in the city of Zagreb, Croatia, she decided that a business and computer career would be more to her liking. But she was looking for an even bigger change in her life at that time, and she decided that transferring to an American university was as big a change as anything.

Ruzica was influenced to attend a Christian university by her American college roommate in Croatia and by her uncle, who had attended two American Christian universities. She also became very familiar with American culture through them and other family members, so she moved to the States and, after a brief enrollment at another Christian college, transferred to

"I believe God's hand led

me to Harding," said Ruzica. "Whereas all the doors seemed shut for me at other schools, all doors were open for me here. It really meant a lot to me to know that everyone was so interested in trying to help me. Also, Harding is very missions-oriented, and that's very important to me."

Ruzica is trying to stir interest in Croatian mission work — and she knows firsthand that it is needed. Last summer she traveled home as a missionary to help refugees, displaced by the war, and spent days with children who had lost their families and everything they owned. Even the town where Ruzica was born, on the border of Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina, has all but been destroyed.

"Day-to-day living has become hard," Ruzica explained. "Some people are making \$50 a month or less, and unemployment is high. Many are not only caring for their immediate families, but for extended family members who are refugees."

Ruzica's immediate family — including her parents. two brothers and a sister now lives in Austria. Her mother's family remains in Croatia.

"It's difficult being so far from home," Ruzica said, "but you never know where God's going to lead you, and I believe He's led me here."

A FOREIGN EXCHANGE PROGRAM led Ketty Jensen from the cool, flat islands of Denmark in Northwest Europe to the warm hills of Arkansas.

Ketty lived in Bentonville, where she was enrolled for her senior year of high school and attended the Church of Christ there with her host family. She soon became involved with the church and, at the end of the school year, became a Christian while at Green Valley Bible Camp with the youth group. During the year she had also visited Harding for Spring Sing Weekend, and the idea of one day attending the University became a dream for her — one that she believed to be impossible.

After graduation Ketty returned to Denmark for a year. The next fall, Ketty's dream became a reality when the church in Bentonville offered to sponsor her

education at Harding for four years. She again left her home village of No in Ringköbing for Arkansas where, like Ruzica, she is now a sophomore computer information systems major at Harding.

Ketty said she really had no trouble making friends because so many of her friends from Bentonville also came to Harding and helped introduce her to others. One such friend is Fernando Ugalde, a student from Ecuador who also is sponsored by the Bentonville church.

Ketty stays very active, especially with the cross country team. Her biggest challenges involved language and adjusting to classes, although she did study English for several years in high school.

"It's a victory for me to understand everything," Ketty explained in her rich Danish accent. "I work very hard at it."

Ketty has made some interesting observations concerning the differences between Americans and Danes.

"Here in the U.S., people tend to be outspoken, outgoing and affectionate — with lots of hugging! People at home tend to be more reserved. Also, you call your teachers by their last names and say, 'Yes, sir' and 'No, sir' to them. I'm not used to that!"

The mild but humid, rainy climate of Arkansas was different for Ketty as well. Denmark, with its 482 islands and flat terrain, usually experiences windy, quickly changing weather. And although Denmark is the smallest of the Scandinavian countries — and less

than 1/3 the area of Arkansas — its population is 5.1 million.

"I'm having a great time here," Ketty said. "And when I go home, I have to remember to shake everyone's hand; I'm used to all the hugs now!"

ANOTHER MISSION GROUP brought the "good news" about Harding to the ears of Nita Popaescu in Bucharest, Romania, where most of the population is either Romanian Orthodox or Roman Catholic. The group

was involved in the "Let's Start Talking" program, which shares the Gospel by teaching English using the book of Luke. In the group were several from Harding, including long-time choral director Dr. Kenneth Davis, who retired in 1988, and his wife, Betty. Nita became very close to the Davises and others from Harding, and they helped make arrangements for her enrollment at the University.

Nita is now a sophomore majoring in English and French. She is unsure as to what her future plans may be, but because of her strong belief in the extent to which society is affected by education, she is certifying to teach. She is also interested in missions and social work.

Several adjustments were in store for Nita when she left Romania, the republic in Southeast Europe on the Black Sea, and headed for Searcy. First, Searcy's small population was a change for her, as she is from Bucharest, the crowded capital city of 2 million people located on the Dämbovita River.

Also, in an attempt to limit air pollution, most people in Bucharest walk or ride the subways rather than drive cars. In Searcy Nita saw that most people had cars and drove even short distances — and she understood why when she tried to take a long walk on an extra-humid day!

"I really had culture shock when I got here," Nita explained. "I had heard bad things about the United States at home — corrupt morals, the Hollywood movie-star image — and I was extremely pleased with what I found here. The people were so nice! I had reverse culture shock when I went back to Romania last summer!"

Nita has made many friends and has learned much about a culture she had never before experienced. But at Harding Nita has also learned about herself

"I've learned so much in and out of the classroom, noticing people's attitudes and ways of thinking. I see that I was very limited in my thinking before coming here. Being here has really broadened it."

Nita said her family had doubts about her attending

Harding, but that now they are very supportive of that decision. She was able to go home last summer and took a videotape she had made about Harding, Searcy and her friends.

"My family said they could tell that I've changed a lot at Harding — for the better!"

RICARDO MAIA WAS
RAISED as a Catholic in the
Southeast Brazil city of Belo
Horizonte, which is home
to 3.5 million people.
Through his brother, he
came to know the Lord's
church. Having been accustomed to the formality and
impersonal nature of the
Catholic church, he was
touched by its friendliness
and warmth.

Ricardo became a Christian in 1981 and began working with the Belo Horizonte congregation in 1986 as an apprentice minister. He then worked as youth minister for three years, an important job considering the fact that 70 percent of the church in Brazil is made up of young people. During his years of work with the Belo church, he has seen its attendance grow to about 275.

When Ricardo began to feel the need to go to school and deepen his study of the Scriptures, he chose Harding.

"I believe my decision to come here was made through God's providence," Ricardo explained. "This is the best place I could have come. I've made the best friends of my life, and the University has become family to me. With the great body of teachers and fellow students I encounter daily, it truly is a great experience

for me."

When Ricardo completes the requirements next year for his degree in Bible and psychology, he plans to re-



turn to the Belo congregation, where he hopes to form a team of natives who can work to plant churches in the interior cities of Brazil. Ricardo calls for more aggressive evangelism in Brazil, which he described as a large mission field whose people are very receptive to the Gospel.

"Brazilians are searching for something because the traditional church for them is not fulfilling their needs," he said.

Brazil is the fifth-largest country in the world in area, covering nearly half of South America. It is also very populous, with nearly 150 million people. Ricardo's mountainous home state of Minas alone is about the size of Texas and has a population of nearly 15 million. Brazilians are very friendly, and prejudice is virtually non-existent. Congregations of the Lord's church have been established only in the capital cities.

Ricardo's family, including his parents and five

brothers, all live in Brazil. His mother and two brothers are Christians.

"I want to encourage Christians here to be faithful and to take the Word of God seriously," Ricardo said, "because it is the guide for our lives and will judge us in the end."

All of us can take his words to heart.

THE EAST-WEST FOUNDA-TION, which introduces Japanese students to American colleges, brought Shinobu Kurakazu from the mountains and islands of Japan to the plains of Nebraska and York College in 1989. When she graduated from the two-year college in 1991, she transferred to Harding.

Shinobu grew up in a Christian family in the northern part of Japan. This fact is unusual because only 1 percent of the country's population is Christian; most of the people practice Shinto or Buddhism.

Japan itself, located off the coast of East Asia, is small in area, but is 2,000 miles long and made up of 3,500 islands and 190 volcanoes. Its 120 million people make it the world's most densely populated country. About 80 percent of the country is mountainous, and the climate is monsoonal. Japan's literacy rate is the highest in Asia, contributing to the country's status as a leading industrial superpower.

Shinobu, now a senior art major at Harding, said she longed to be educated in a Christian environment where she could learn as much as possible about the Bible. So, naturally, she chose a Christian university.

"I like Harding very much," Shinobu explained in soft, broken English. "I've learned so much, and I'm still learning. Many cultures are represented here, many international students; I have a lot in common with them because we are all in a strange country, experiencing it together."

Shinobu has made friends easily at Harding, and she is able to speak in her native language most of the time because 12 other Japanese students are enrolled with her.

"There were few foreign students at York, and none from Japan, so I had to really concentrate to speak English," Shinobu said. "Actually, I got so used to talking in English that I almost forgot how to speak Japanese!"

Not only has Shinobu

learned to appreciate more her own language, but also her homeland. Through her daily experiences in America, she has learned more about Japan and sees it from a different view and she has noted some differences between the two countries.

"Japan is more crowded," she explained. "There are

many more people, and everything is smaller smaller cars, smaller houses, even smaller people."

Another difference she has noted is the larger number of churches, Protestant and Catholic, that are found here. She said that her city of 240,000, Hachinohe, has about the same number of churches that are found in Searcy, a city of about 15,000.

These differences and others add to the excitement of attending college in a foreign country. And in a short time, Shinobu will take her Harding memories with her, back to the islands of Japan.

HARDING IS PROUD of its large pool of international students, which has greatly grown in number during the last several years. As a matter of fact, international students are a strong force in Christian colleges across this country. Among the 20,106 students attending the six largest universities affiliated with Churches of Christ, 887 of them, or 4.4 percent, are from foreign countries.

Countries most represented at Harding are Canada and Mexico, with 14 from each. Honduras and Japan are next, with 13 from each. A few of the other nations represented on campus include Australia, Ethiopia, Singapore, Scotland, Russia, Norway, Peru and Venezuela.

Harding students are an interesting melting pot of cultures and personalities. They are diverse but united. Different, yet in many ways the same.

And they're all counted absent if they miss chapel. HI For fourth-generation student

Traditions can mean many things to a family, whether it's a special Christmas activity, a family reunion, a Thanksgiving feast or a yearly vacation destination. Many families even pass down heirlooms to the next generation in hopes of keeping a memory alive.

One certain family, however, has passed down a heritage of another sort — a college choice that has with time become a tradition. Harding welcomed a student last year who became the only fourth-generation student ever to enroll at the University.

Jared Dockery, a 20-year-old sophomore from Fayetteville, Ark., became the fourth generation of his family to attend college at Harding University. It's a family tradition that started with his great-grandfather in the early

Jared's great-grandfather, William Hazlet, is now 97 years old and lives in a retirement home in Colorado. Hazlet is a 1923 graduate of Harper College, which was located in Harper, Kan., before its merger with Harding.

Harper College and Arkansas Christian College were two junior colleges that merged their facilities and assets in 1924 to form Harding College. At that time, Harding was located in Morrilton, Ark., and it moved to Searcy in 1934.

Jared's 65-year-old grandmother, Ida (Hazlet) Roberts, came to Harding in 1945 with the intentions of fulfilling her desire to become a nurse. Roberts was about 30 years premature for Harding's School of Nursing, and she left after a year to return home and attend a nursing school. Those plans were halted, too, when she soon married and gave birth to a daughter, who would eventually become the third generation of this family to attend Harding.

Roberts' daughter, Meredy (Roberts) Dockery, became a college freshman 18 years later when she came to Harding in the fall of

"I always knew I wanted to come to Harding," she says, "because my mother would always pull out her 1945 Petit Jean yearbook and show me pictures and tell me about her college days at Harding. I don't think I ever really considered another choice."

While at Harding majoring in art, Meredy met a gentleman who eventually became her spouse. "I was a student worker in the cafeteria, and he kept coming through the line where I worked. We started dating and were married six weeks after we graduated," she said.

She and her husband both graduated in

1971. They have made their home since that time in Fayetteville, Ark., where her husband, Robert, preaches for the Baldwin Church of Christ. The first of their three children, Jared, became a freshman at Harding last year.

"My parents had always hoped I would come here, and I guess that's the reason I always had a Harding pennant on the wall of my room as a kid. During my senior year they told me to make the decision about where I wanted to attend college," Jared said. After considering the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, he decided to attend Harding.

"I'm enjoying being here," he said, "because the ideology of this school is consistent with what I am and what I want to continue to be. I'm really glad I'm here." He added that he would like to see his sister, age 14, and his brother, age 9, at Harding one day as well

As a member of the school's debate team. Jared has traveled to many other schools for debate competition. "Traveling to stateschool campuses has made me really realize how unique and different Harding is," he

Harding holds fond memories for Jared's mother as well. "It's a really special place. One teacher in particular, Don Robinson, truly had a positive influence on me," said Meredy.

Although the memories have remained, Meredy confided that Harding has changed a lot since she graduated. "It's just so much bigger. When visiting the campus I can still find my way around, but the student center is no longer in the Ganus Building, and it seems strange for Pattie Cobb to be such a nice dorm instead of the cafeteria," she said.

Jared spoke about another change that has occurred since his relatives were here. "I've heard my grandmother's stories of walking to the movie theater on mass dates that had to be chaperoned. And my mother has told me how she and the other girls weren't allowed to wear pants," he says.

The passage of time has resulted in many changes on the Harding campus and, while rules may have been modified, the University's aim and purpose has remained uncompromised: educating for eternity. It is written that Harding University was named after James A. Harding because he gave his co-workers and associates an enthusiasm for Christian education that became a significant tradition. It seems to be a tradition that is passed down even today, through four generations. III

1992 donations reach record \$7.5 million

or the third time in five years, contributions to Harding reached a record level, topping the \$7.5 million mark.

The \$7,565,924 total in 1992 was a 13 percent increase over 1991 gifts of \$6,700,724. The previous record of \$7,300,296 came in 1990.

In 1992 Harding received \$4.5 million in current and capital gifts and \$3 million in deferred and restricted gifts. During the year Harding received gifts from 759 individuals, corporations or foundations who were making their first donation to Harding.

The record donations came in the final stages of the "Beyond Excellence" campaign. Harding began the campaign in 1988, raising a then-record \$6,048,463. The "Beyond Excellence" campaign had designated a \$25 million goal for current and capital projects and \$40 million in endowment needs. The campaign officially comes to a conclusion June 30.

One of the highlights of the year was the near-record number of donors. During 1992 a total of 5,914 different individuals, corporations, churches or foundations made a contribution. That total fell shy of the record 6,040 donors set in 1990.

For the fifth consecutive year, alumni donations topped the million-dollar mark. Harding alumni in 1992 contributed \$1.19 million. During the year 5,094 alumni gave, and the average gift was \$235. Last year was also the third consecutive year that the percentage of alumni contributing had topped the 35 percent mark.

A major increase in donations from foundations was one of the reasons for the record year. Contributions from this group reached a record \$1,986,322. Foundation giving in 1991 was \$631,817.

Corporate matching gifts were up 17 percent in 1992 to \$201,356. In 1991 the matching gift total was \$172,254. 🖽



Estate Planning – Facts and Misconceptions

BY DONALD KEE Many people have misconceptions about estateplanning fundamentals. Estate planning for you and your family can be reached only if those misconceptions are rectified and facts are relied upon. Listed below are five recurring misconceptions:

1. All assets are probate. Most estates are divided into two types of assets: probate and nonprobate. Probate assets are those that are going to be transferring the title through the probate process. Nonprobate assets are everything else. Nonprobate assets typically include life insurance, death benefits from retirement plans, IRAs, jointly held property, payable-on-death bank accounts, and so forth. This misconception interferes with coordinating the

two types of assets to effectuate your plan.

2. Life insurance is not taxable or subject to probate. Life insurance that you have any incidence of ownership - that is, you own the policy or you have the right to change the beneficiary is includable in the probate estate and is therefore not subject to probate. However, this may not be so. If your primary beneficiary is your spouse, and that spouse predeceases you, many policies state that the default beneficiary is the estate. In that case, it becomes a probate asset and goes through probate. Beneficiary designations should be checked.

3. Spouses that hold only jointly held property need not have a will since property passes to the other spouse by operation of law.

This misconception denies two good reasons to have a will. One, the will can designate a personal representative of your estate who would be responsible to any probate court and also would be responsible for filing any tax returns. Second, it denies the fact that your survivor at one time is going to die. Therefore, if you do hold everything jointly, then in jurisdiction where the property passes to the surviving spouse by operation of law, you still need a will.

4. Our estate is not big enough for a will. This misconception denies the primary purpose of probate, and that is to pass title from the person that has died to the beneficiaries. The threshold question is not, "How big is the estate?" but, "Is there any property that has title that must be transferred?" Transfer of title of probate assets can only be accomplished through the probate process.

5. I cannot sign a will until I know whom I want to designate as guardian of my children. For young couples with young children, this is the number-one reason for delay in signing a will. Many states, such as Arkansas and Texas, provide that the surviving parent of a minor may, by written declaration, appoint any qualified person to be the guardian of that child's person or estate. Therefore, the declaration need not be in the will but can be in a separate written instrument. You can sign your will and sign a written declaration regarding guardians of your children independently of each other, and one won't hold up the other.
