



A brief history

Dating back to 1974, Spring Sing began when a group of students planned a small-scale musical showcase for campus guests. Performed with the glamour and excitement of a big-time production, tonight's show surpasses the imaginations of its originators.

Each club show is judged from four perspectives: choreography, costumes, music and originality. Winners receive cash awards, plaques and trophies after the Saturday evening performance based on the compilation of the judges' decisions. Two additional awards are presented—one to the club with the best percentage of club members participating and one to the club that best demonstrates the spirit of Christ during the Spring Sing process.

Last year, a new tradition began for the production as each club performed to serve a selected charity. This year will follow suit, with cash awards ranging from \$200 to \$1,000 presented to the charities dependent upon the show's rank in the John H. Ryan Award competition.







Renée French — staging




