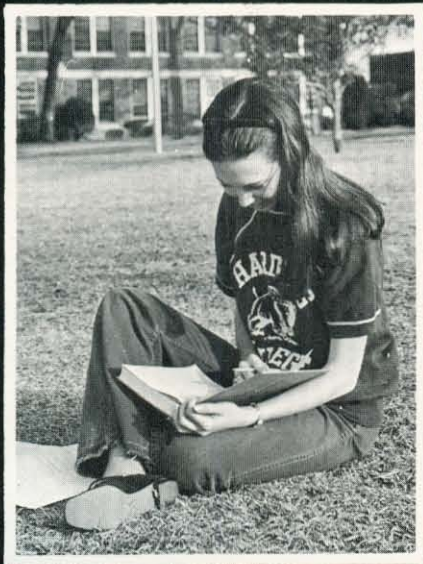

The Cover: sub-four-minute-miler Jim Crawford / Executive Business Games national championship trophy.



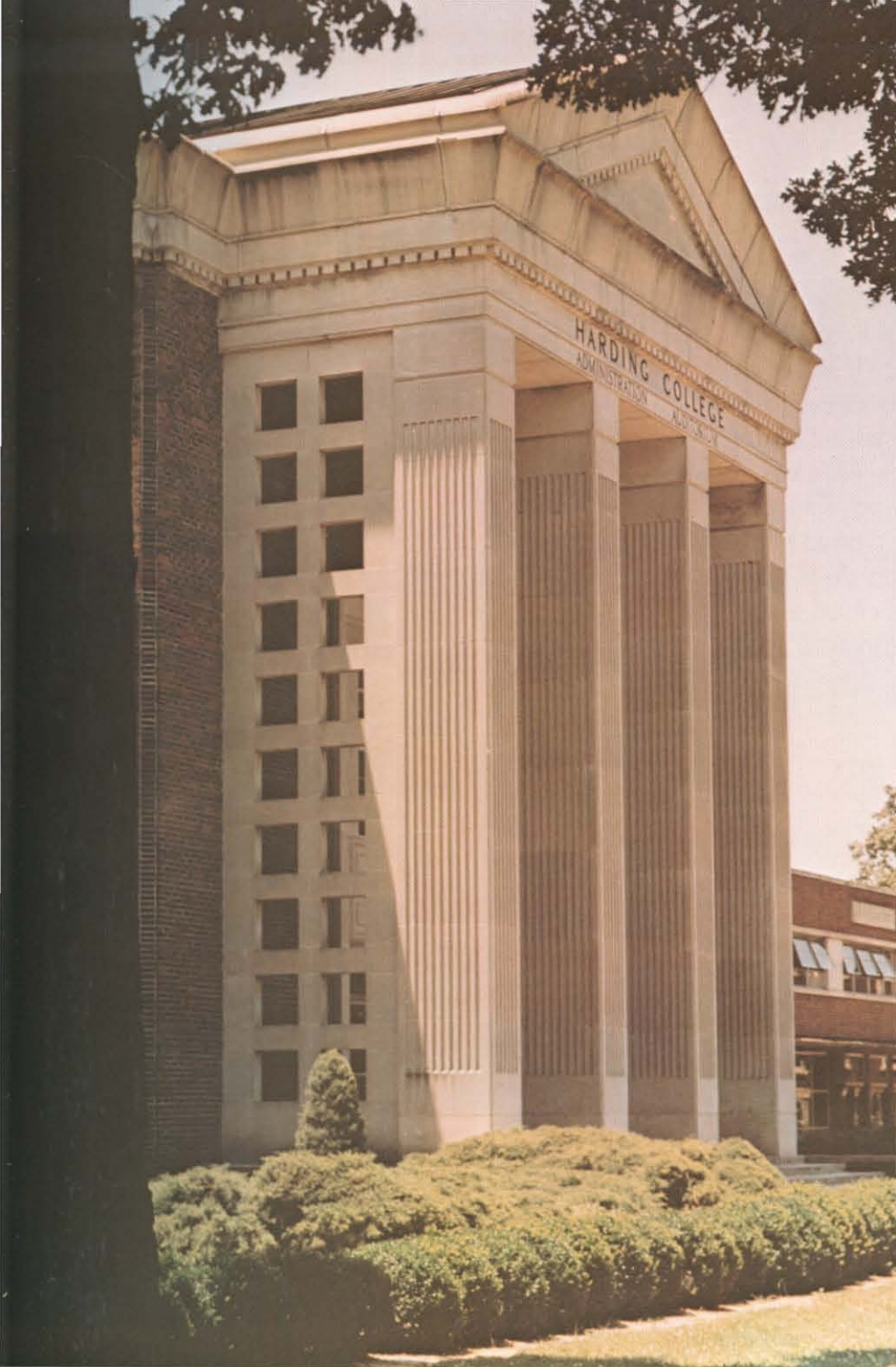
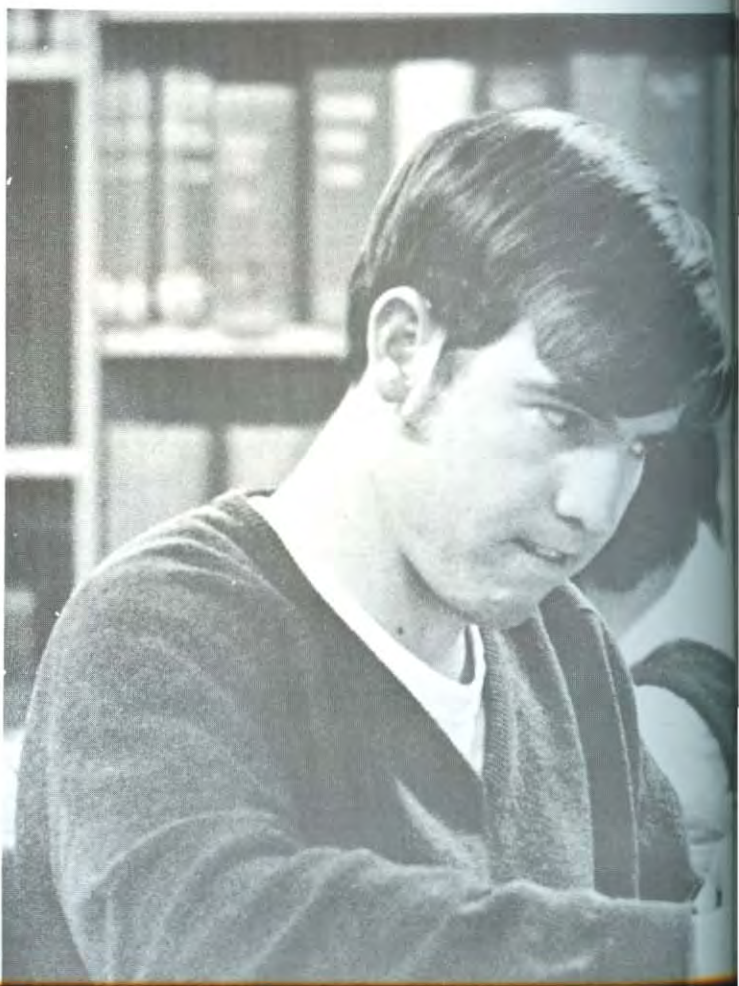
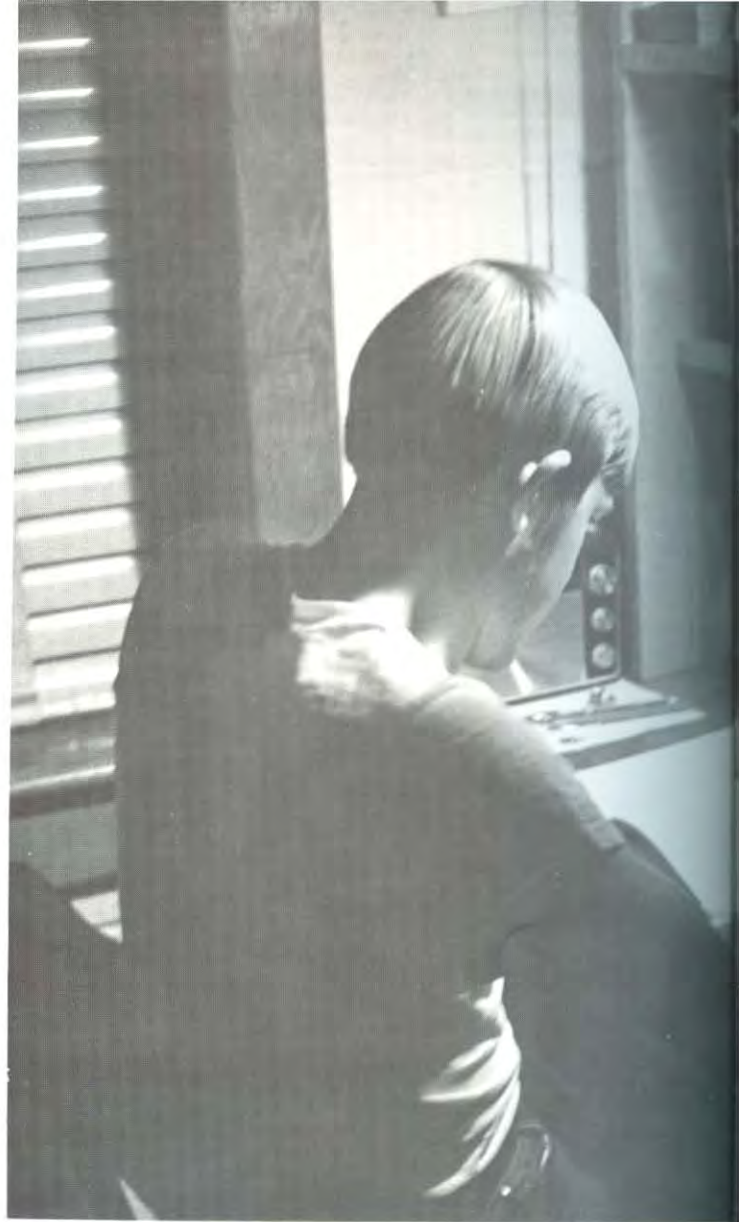

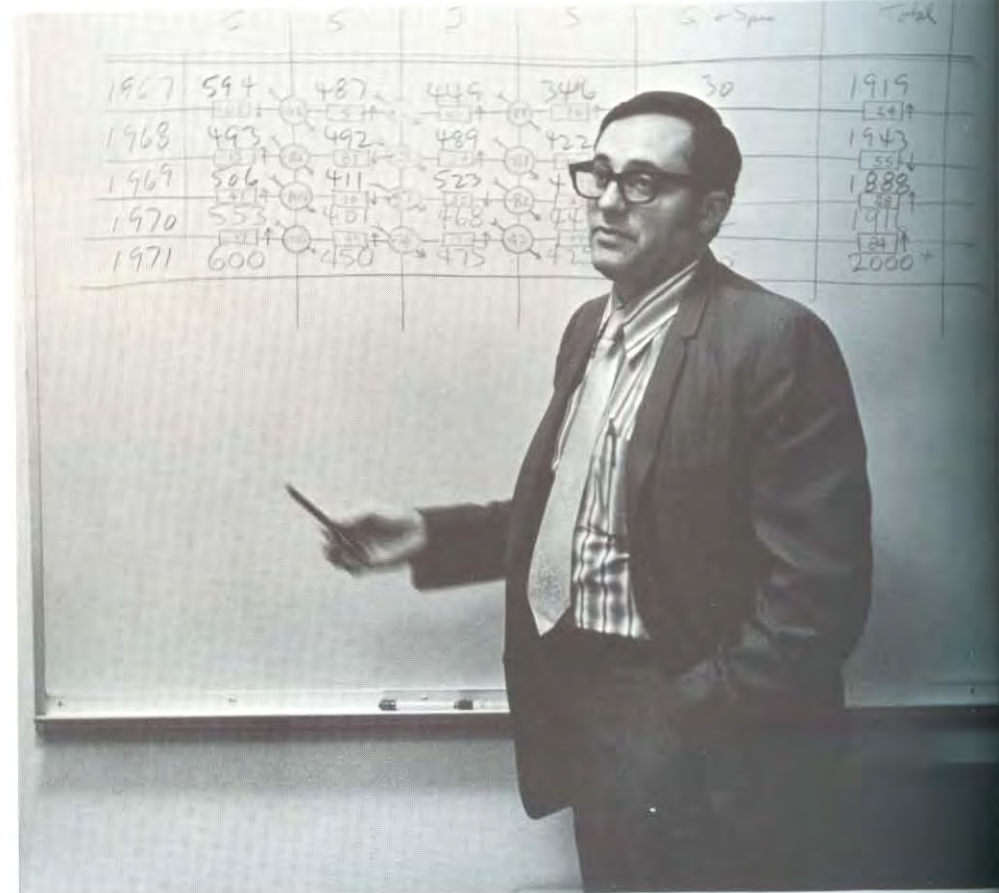

ACADEMICS

Faculty reflects genuine interest, personal approach

The major objective of an institution of higher learning is that of training its students and Harding had a genuine interest in helping young people to develop character, spiritual resources, maturity, and emotional stability. Students were guided in their educational experience by 105 Christian men and women. The student-faculty ratio of 18.2 emphasized Harding's commitment to the personal approach in education. This was more important than ever as students sought direction in forming life-long values.

During the 1969-70 school year an extensive self-study was made for a re-evaluation by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The report of the examiners commended Harding College for the clarity of her objectives, effectiveness in implementing the objectives, and the achievements of the students.

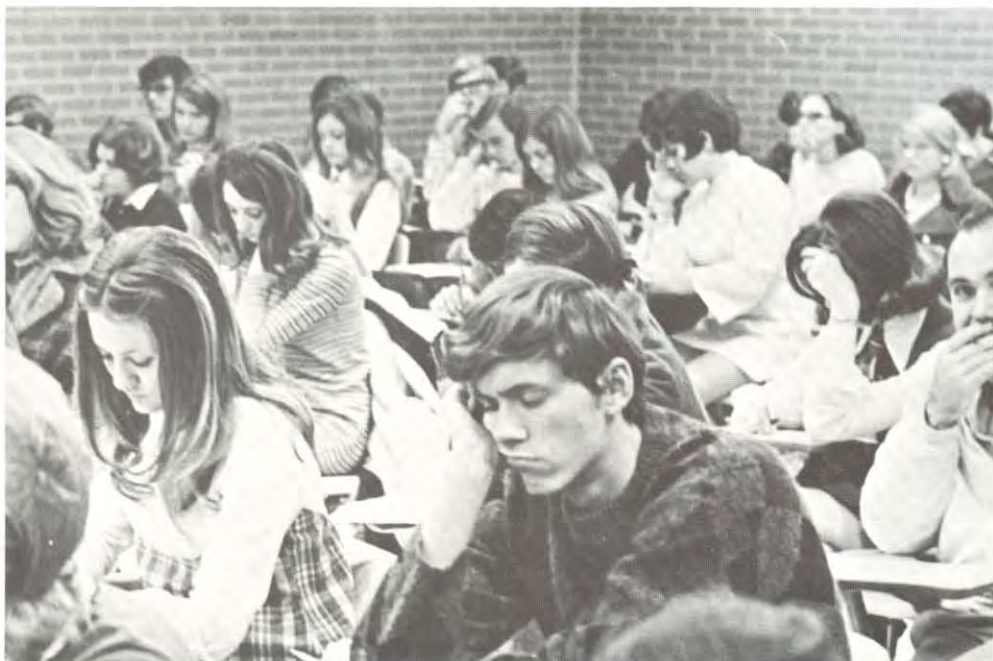

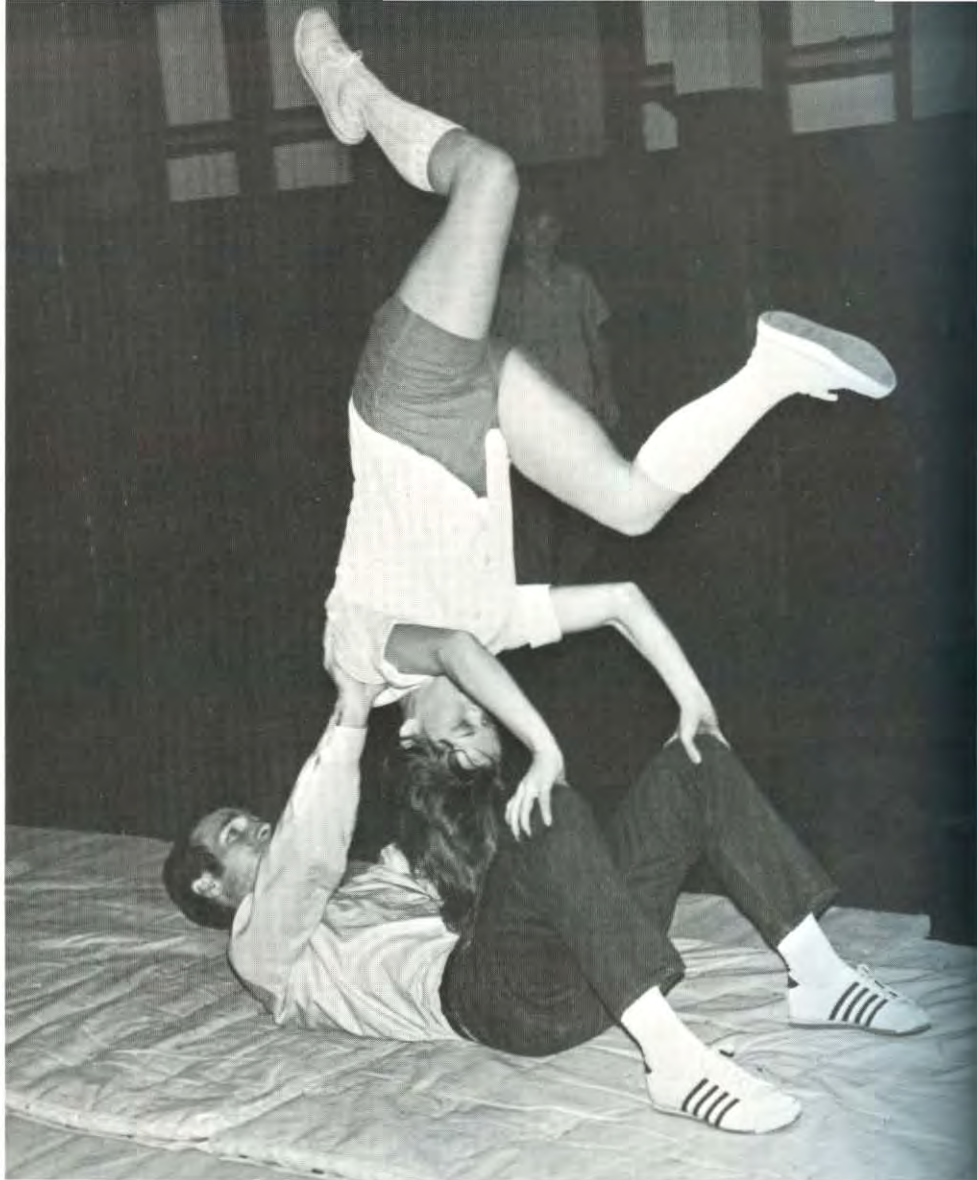
EDUCATION

New policies and equipment update media facilities

Teachers from every department benefitted from the new equipment and policies of the Educational Media Center. Instead of just making machines available, every effort was made to help the teacher with the preparation of teaching materials. In this way, the equipment was utilized to its fullest extent and very much to the advantage of the student. Jerome Barnes completed work on his doctorate and directed the center.

Practicality and concern for the development of skills that would be called upon in subsequent career choices were objectives of the division, especially for the Department of Education. In March, the program underwent its regular ten year evaluation by the National Accreditation of Teacher Education.

With the cutback of funds for space research, the research center was fortunate to continue to receive support from NASA. A total of \$45,000 was granted and twenty members of the faculty participated in a study to find "Methods of Achieving Physical Fitness in Men Whose Ages are Comparable to the Astronauts."

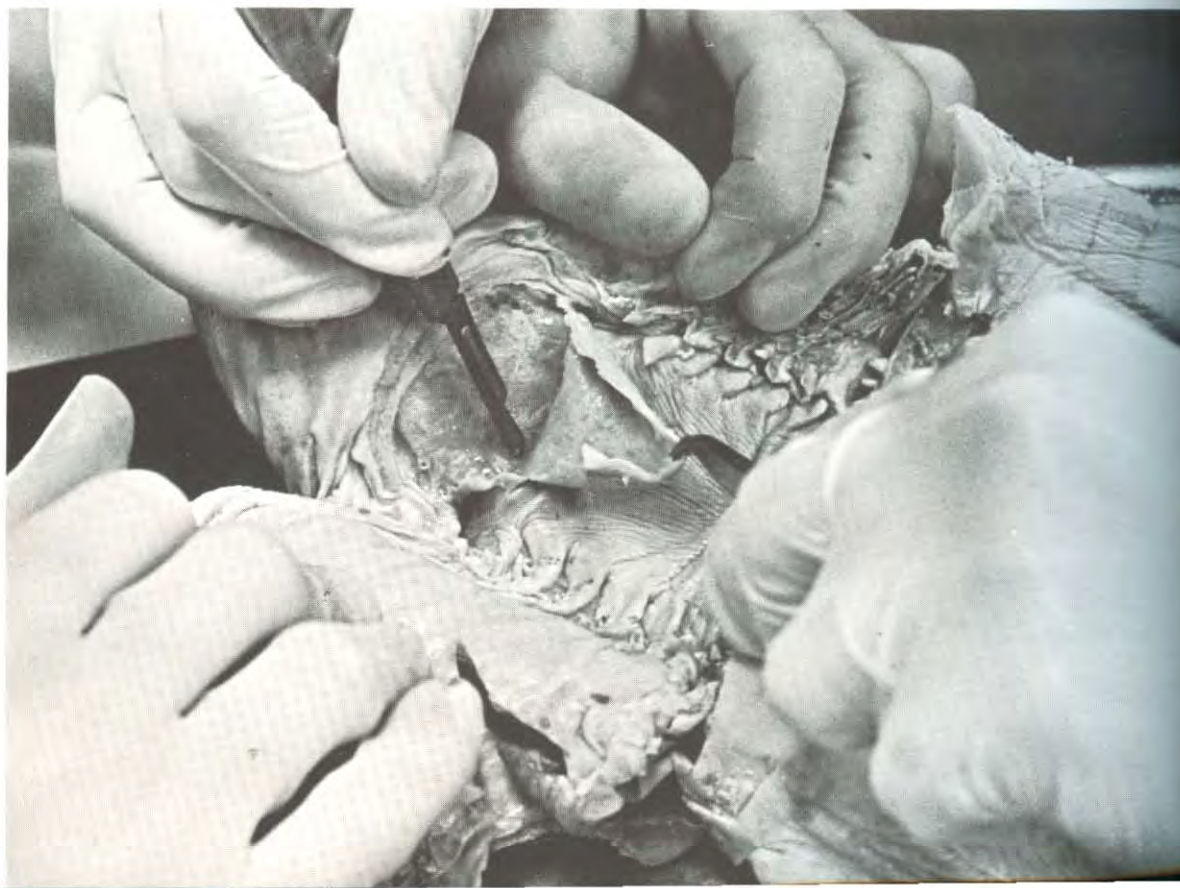

ANATOMY of the catfish shark is probed with careful hands and close attention.

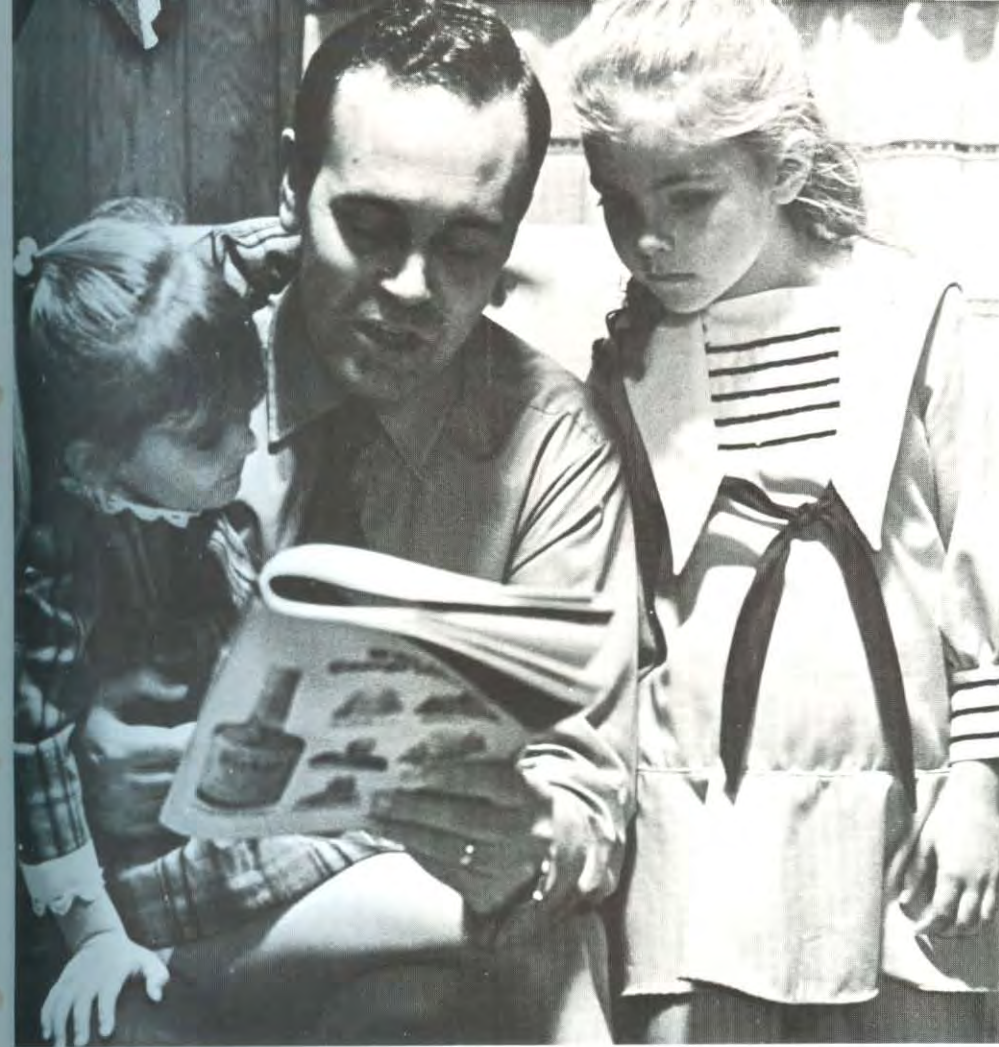


NATURAL SCIENCE

Mission/Prepare conducts Foreign Evangelist study

Faith in God and a zeal for New Testament Christianity were strengthened by opportunities for personal involvement in the Division of Religion. Evangelistic campaigns took students and teachers around the world to Japan, India, Peru, Russia, Germany, and France. Recognizing the continuing need for willing and prepared workers here in the states, several teams traveled to the Northeast and Southwest. The Mission/Prepare Research Bureau, directed by Joe Hacker, completed a study in the motivation, training, and experience backgrounds of foreign evangelists. Evertt Huffard, Visiting Professor of Bible and Missions, and his family were here from Jerusalem to offer first hand experiences to those students interested in eventual full-time mission work.

Dr. Neale Pryor, a 1970 winner of the Distinguished Teacher award, co-ordinated the 47th annual Harding College lectureship. Theme lectures and forums discussed the "Bond of Peace."

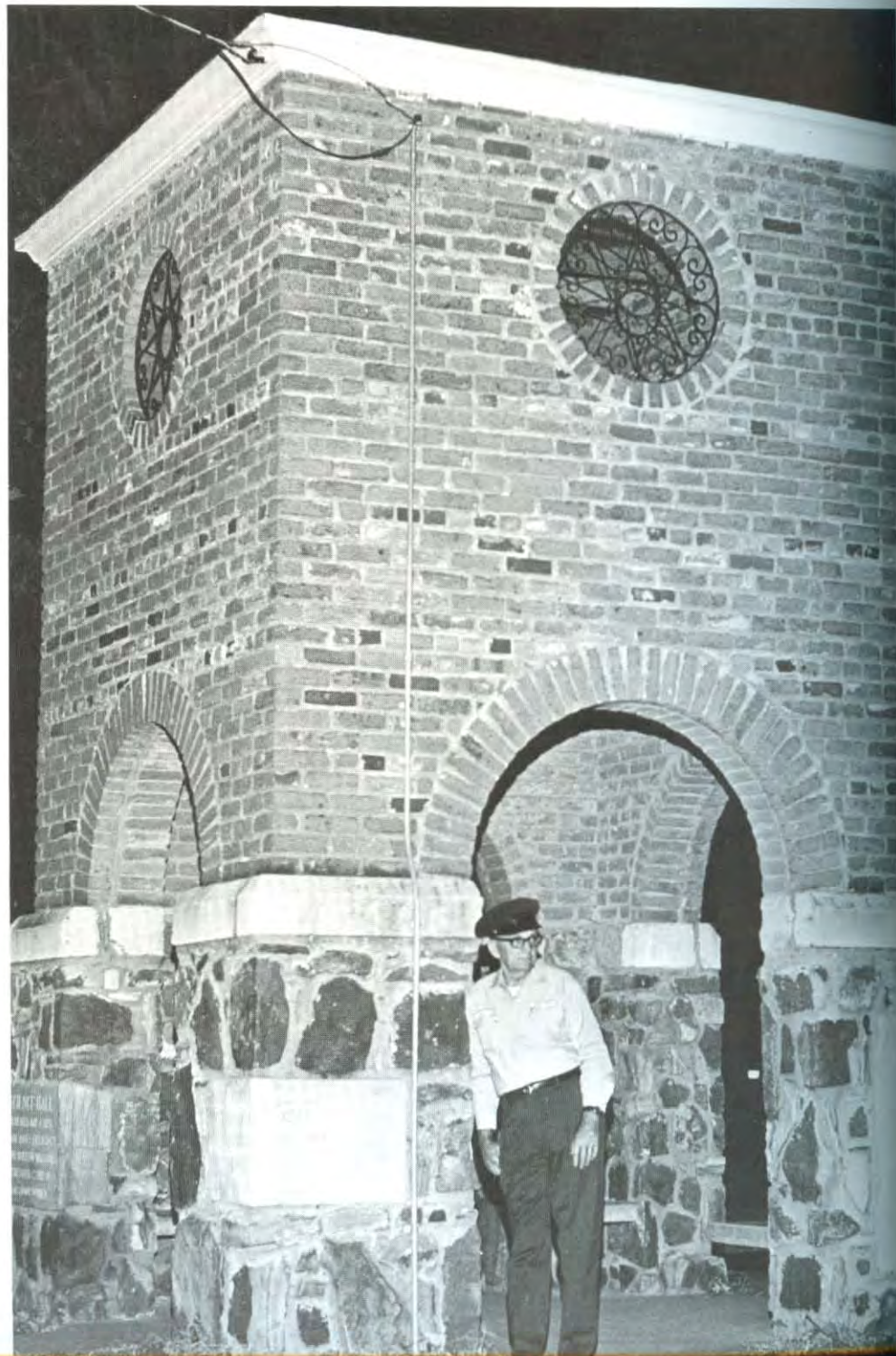

Carving inroads into mainstream fills first weeks

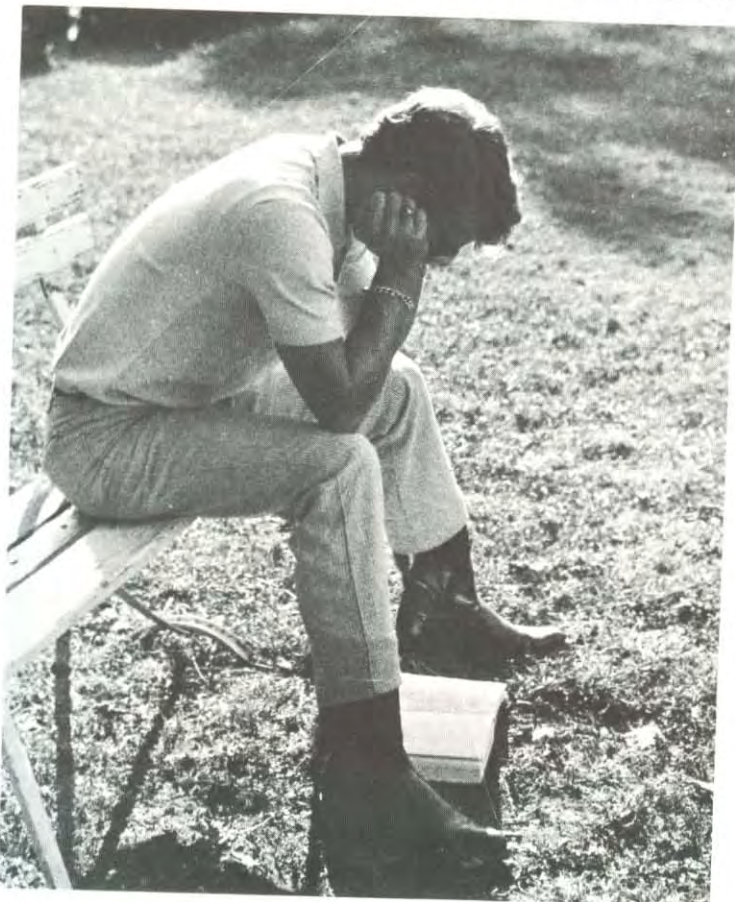

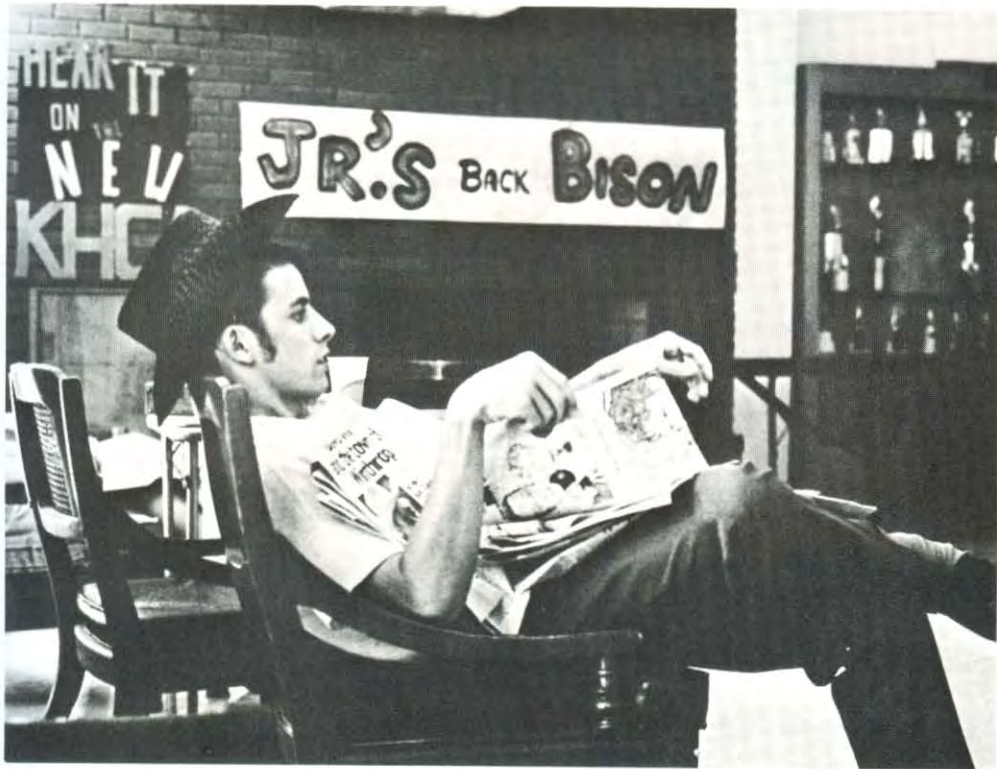

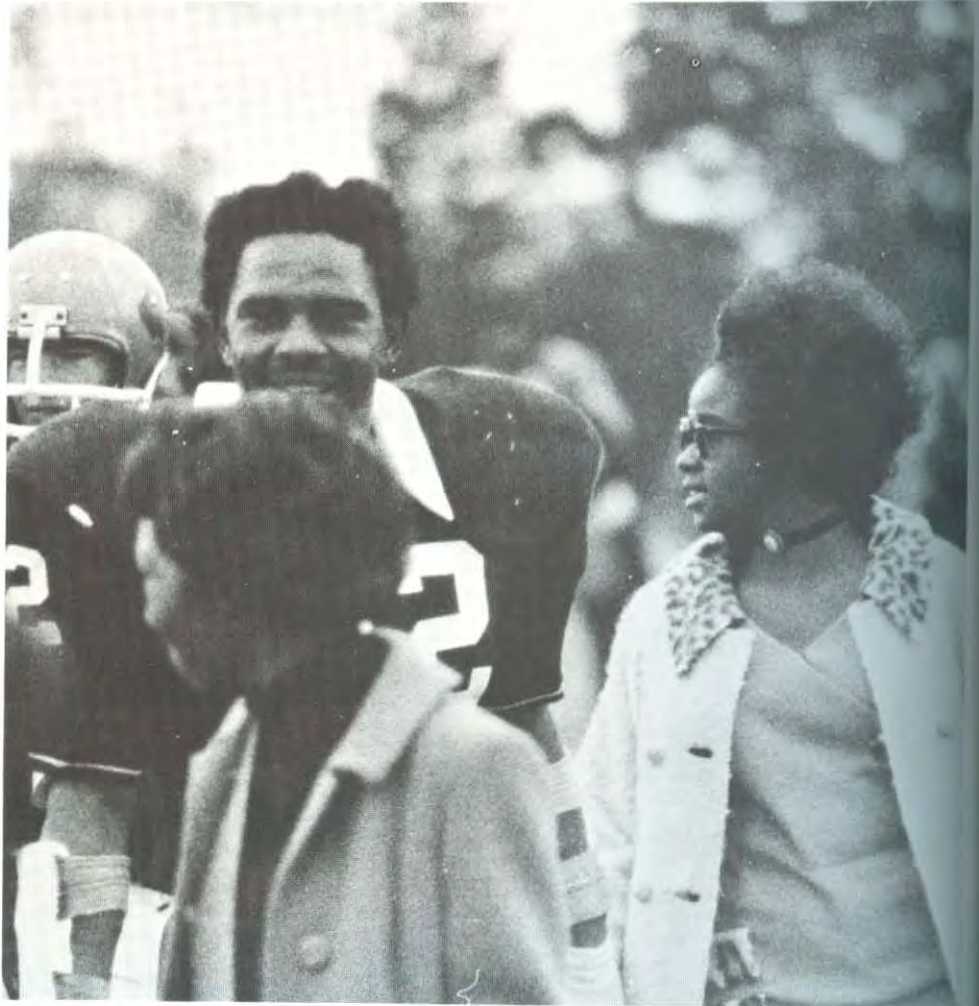

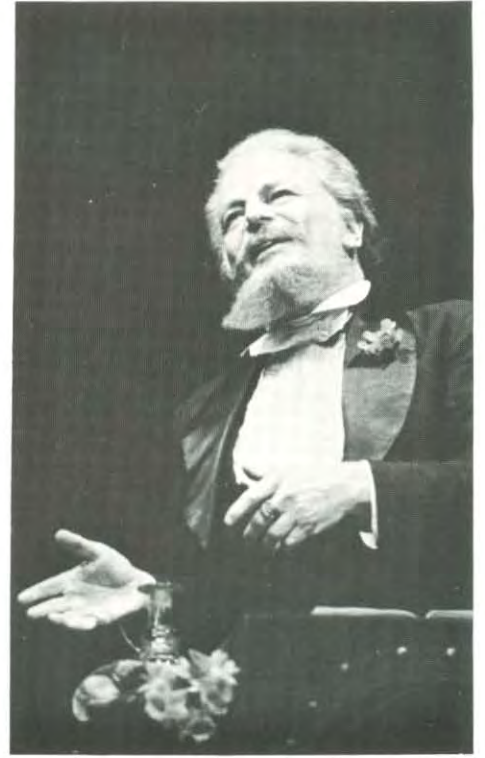

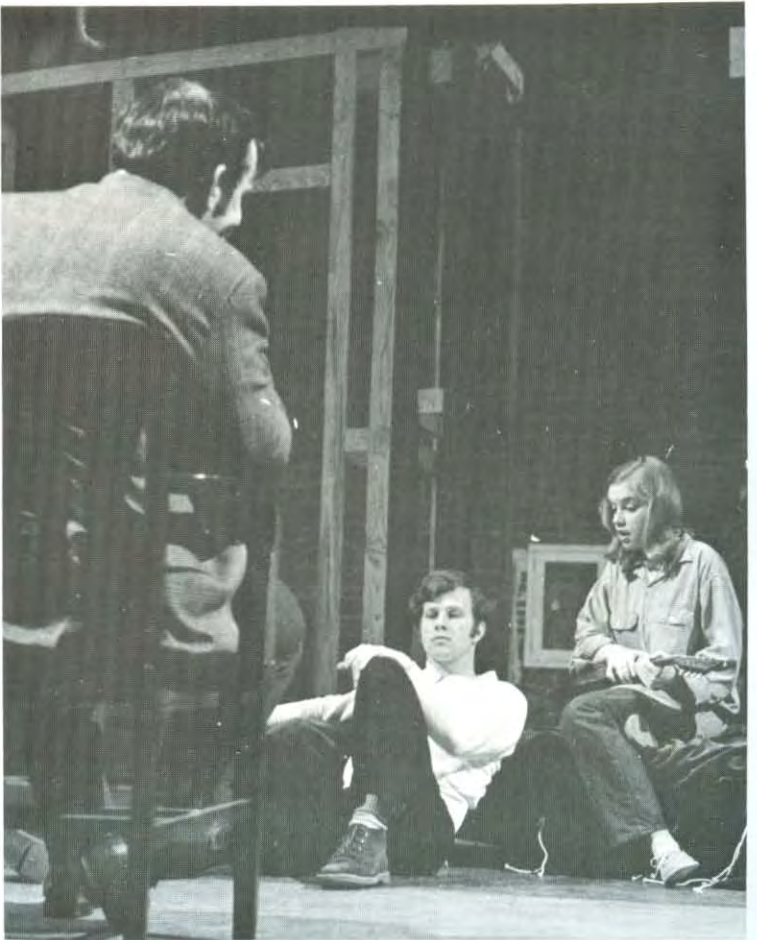

Wallace was awarded the honorary doctor's degree. Billy Ray Cox delivered the baccalaureate address.

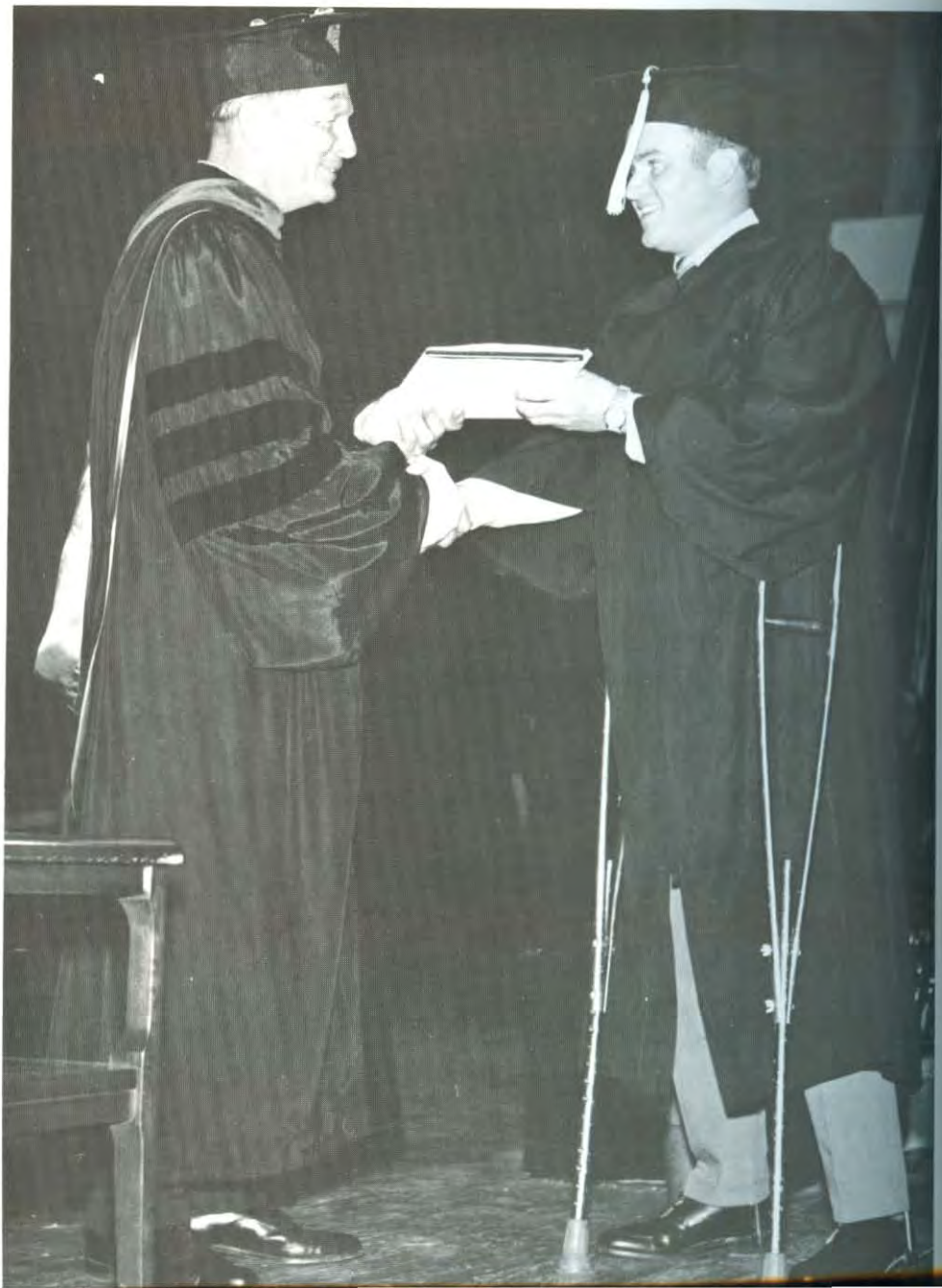

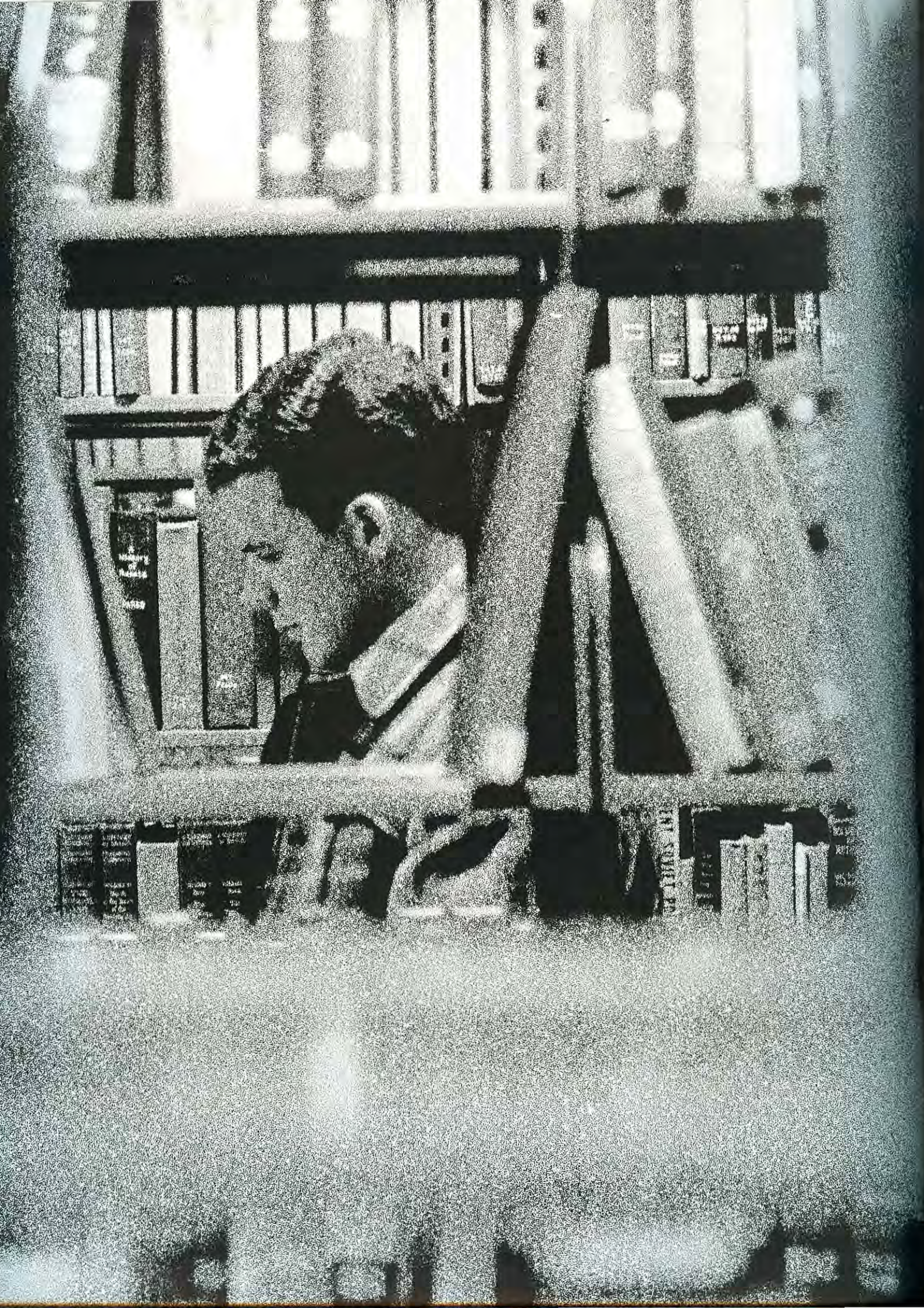

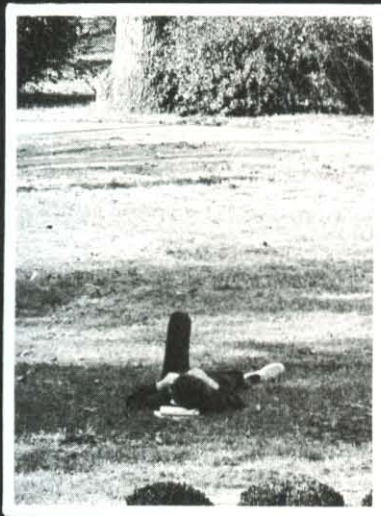

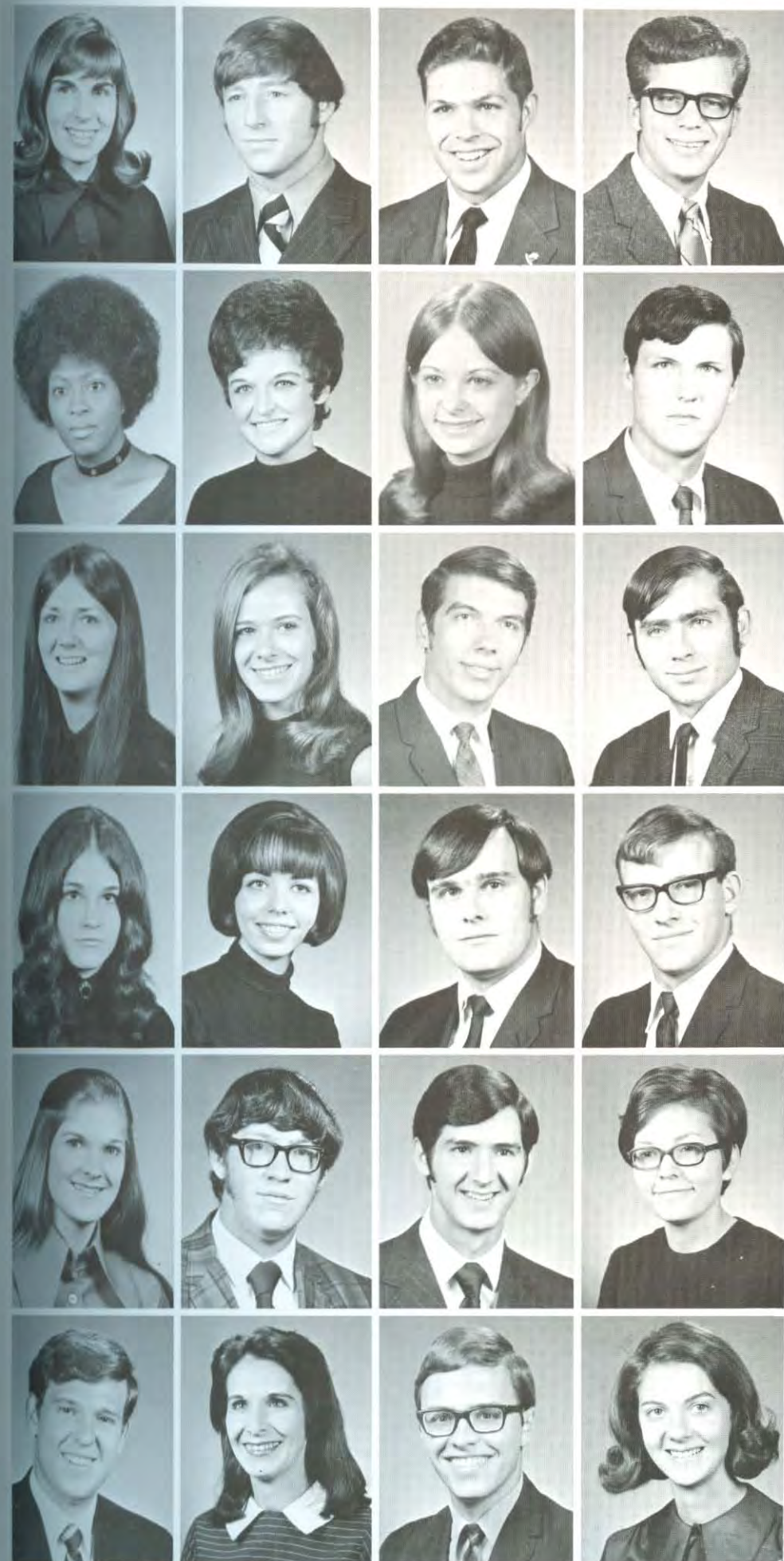
Officers elected, sponsors chosen as year begins

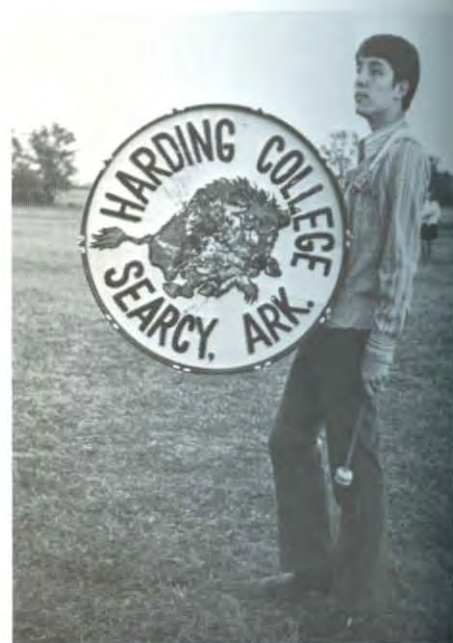

The Bisons opened their football season with a shut out over the Moundbuilders from Southwestern College, Kansas. Defense was the dominant aspect of Harding's play. The defensive unit allowed only 102 total offensive yards by the Southwestern team and intercepted four passes, one for a score. Terry Brumley, junior defensive back, scored first for the Bulls on a 39-yard interception return. Harding's second score came in the second quarter on a 21-yard run by freshman Tom Ed Gooden. Ronnie Peacock, the Bisons fine split end, scored the final touchdown on an eight-yard pass from quarterback Terry Welch.

Peacock ended the game with eight receptions for 111 yards. Co-captain Charles Caffey led all players in rushing with a 4.5 yards per carry average on 15 attempts.

Harding 13 Millsaps 12

The Bisons put together fine teamwork and an exciting game-winning touchdown in the final seconds to win their second game of the season. A Terry Welch-to-Charles Caffey pass with 36 seconds left in the game gave the Bulls a 13-12 victory over Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi. The game left Harding with a

2-0 record.

Harding scored first in the second quarter when quarterback Tommy Lewey threw to Ronnie Peacock for a four-yard touchdown. In the third quarter the defensive unit held the Majors inside the Harding two-yard line for three plays in succession without allowing a score. With 3:30 remaining in the game, Welch engineered the final winning touchdown drive of 52 yards.

Welch completed ten passes for 93 yards, while Lewey connected on nine for 90 yards. Peacock grabbed nine passes for 79 yards.

Harding 14 Southern State 25

In Harding's AIC conference opener, Southern State, with a freshman substitute quarterback at the helm, stopped the Bisons 25-14 at Magnolia. Scoring first was Harding on a one-yard run by Tommy Lewey in the first period. Halfback Tom Ed Gooden scored on a two-point play after the touchdown. The Muleriders scored two touchdowns in the first half to take a 15-8 lead at the half. In the second half they added another touchdown and a field goal. With a minute remaining in the game, Ronnie Peacock caught a touchdown pass from Lewey in the far corner of the end zone.

Coach Prock's Bulls rolled up 305 yards rushing to go with Tommy Lewey's 140 yards in the air. Freshman Alan Dixon from Fitzgerald, Georgia gained 159 yards rushing in 31 carries. Junior Ronnie Peacock included five receptions for 107 yards and one touchdown. The five-yard pass he caught for a touchdown in the second quarter gave him four for the season, a school record. Terry Welch added three extra-point kicks.

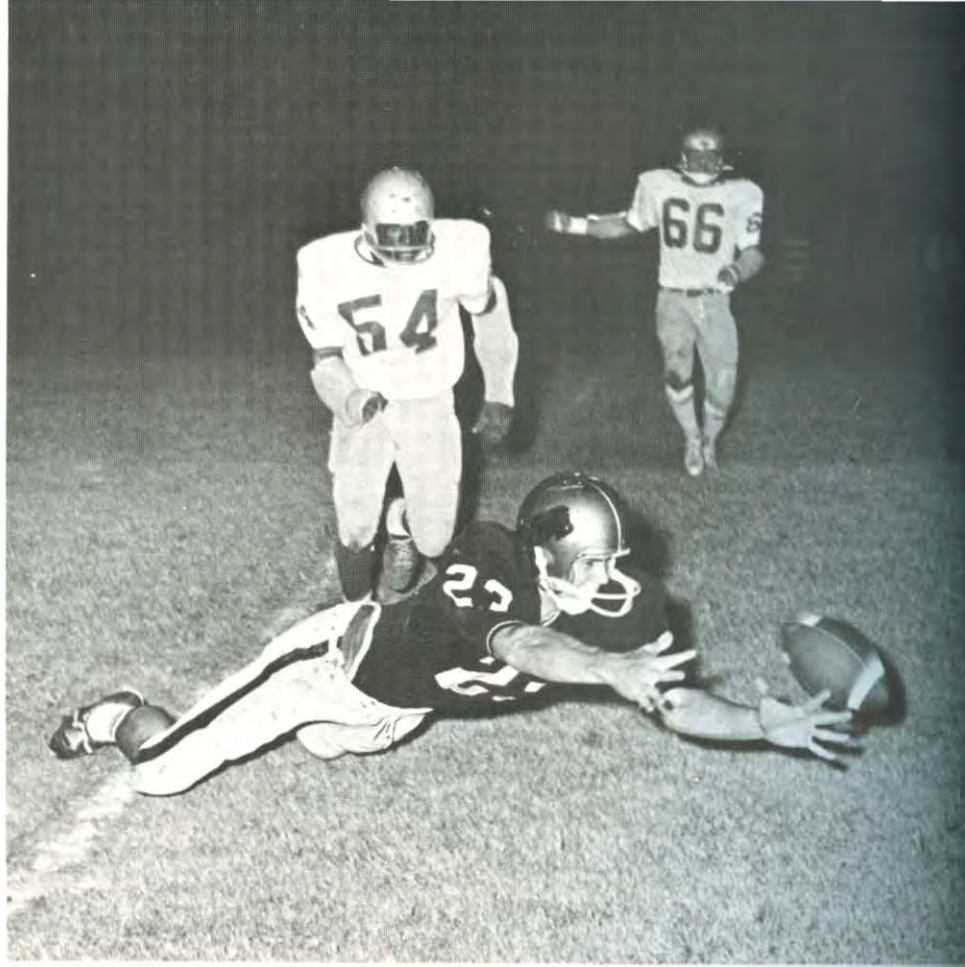

In the first football competition between the two schools, the Golden Lions of Arkansas AM&N downed the Bisons 16-6 in a non-conference contest. The team from Pine Bluff scored two touchdowns in the first ten minutes of play on a 47-yard interception return and 21-yard pass.

The Bison defensive crew, led by the inspired play of senior linebacker Ken Merritt, shut off Lion scoring after the first quarter except for a fourth quarter field goal. Merritt was credited with 19 unassisted tackles, 12 assists, and one pass breakup in the second period.

With Harding's air game limited by the fine play of the Lion's pass defense, the offensive unit relied on its rushing strength. Tailback Alan Dixon rushed for 122 yards on 22 carries and had a 66 yard touchdown run called back by a penalty. The AM&N defense held All-AIC end Ronnie Peacock to only three receptions.

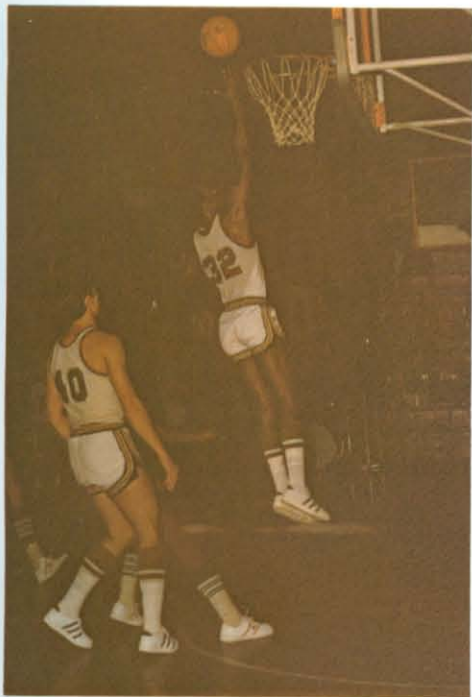
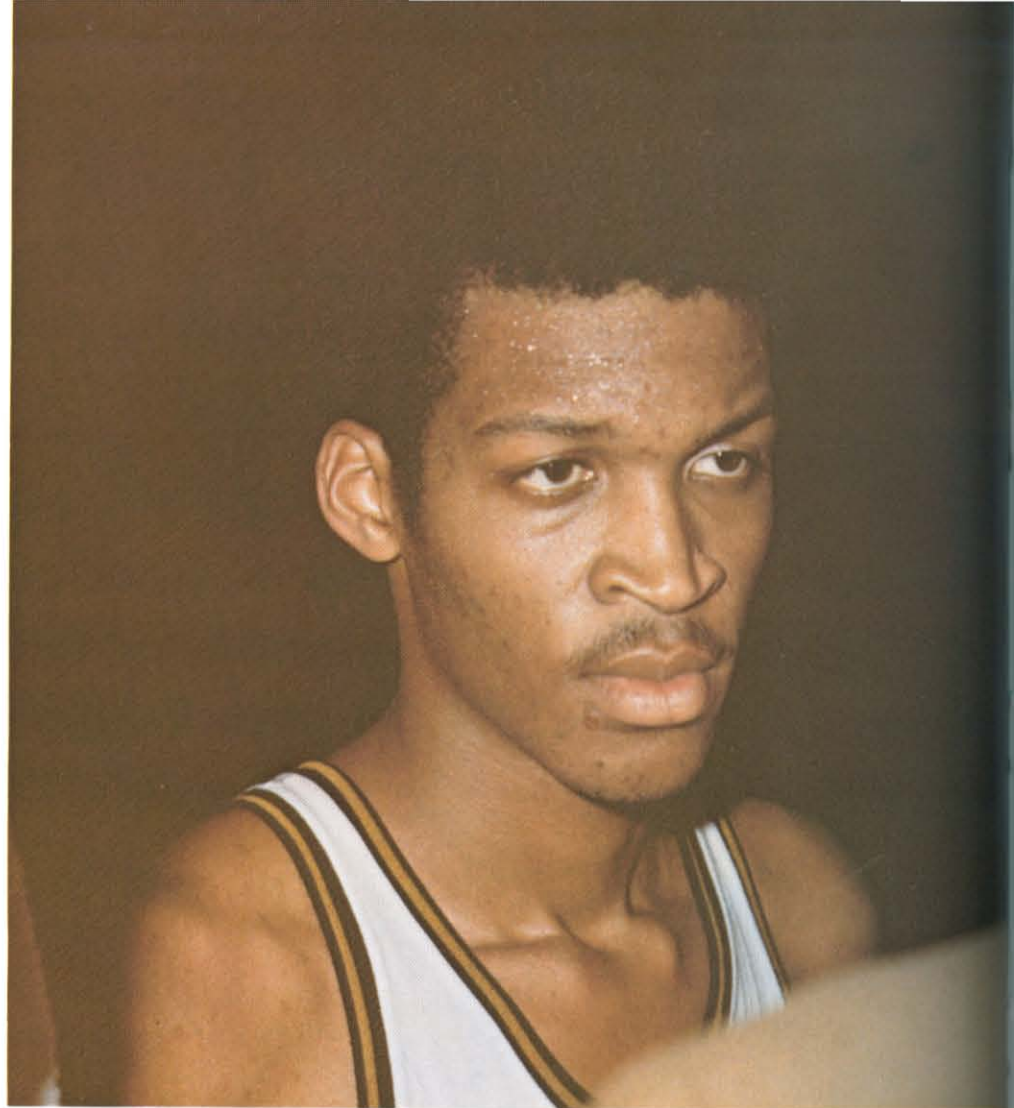

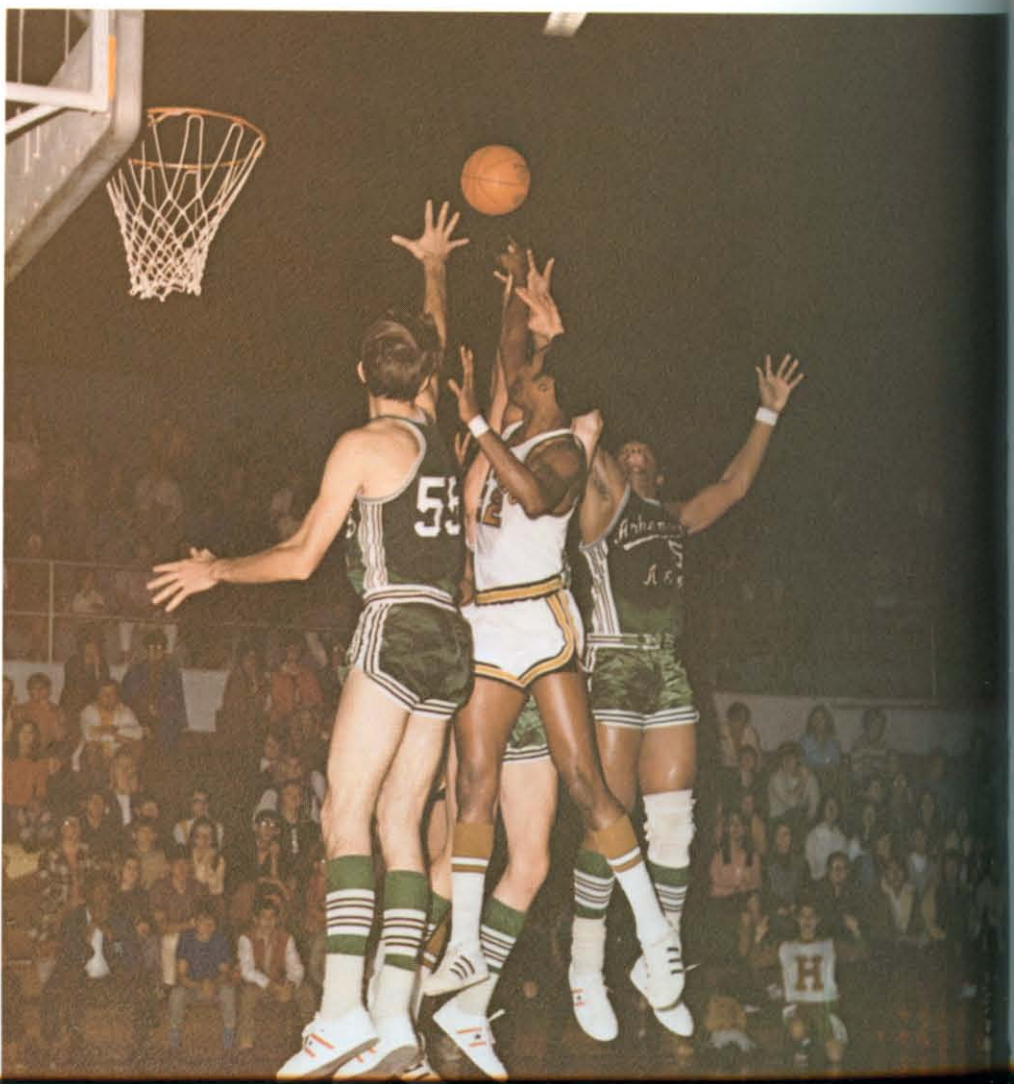

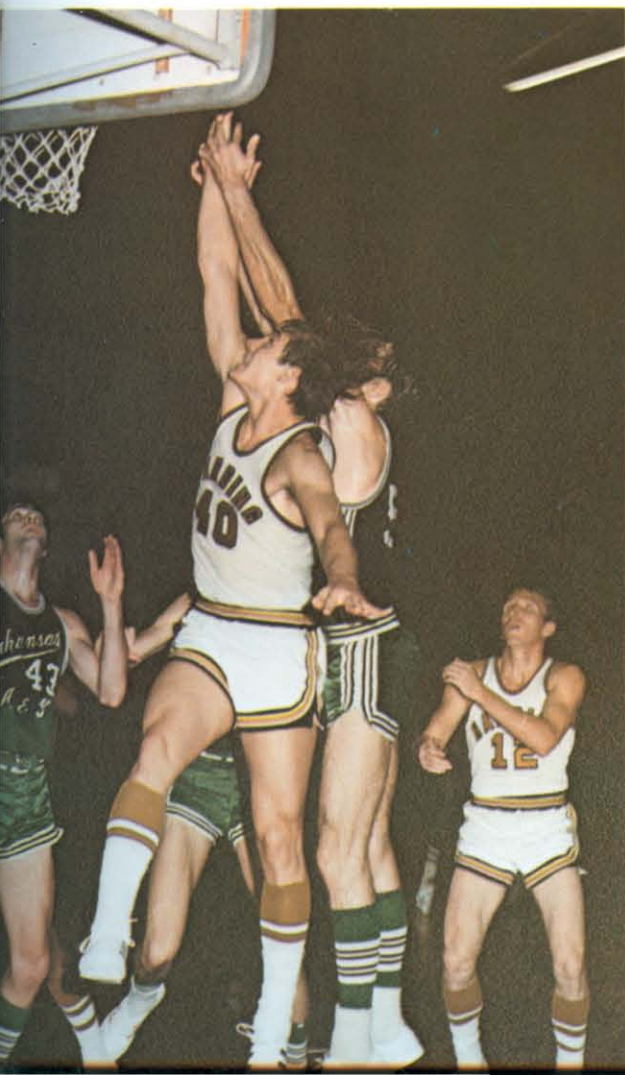
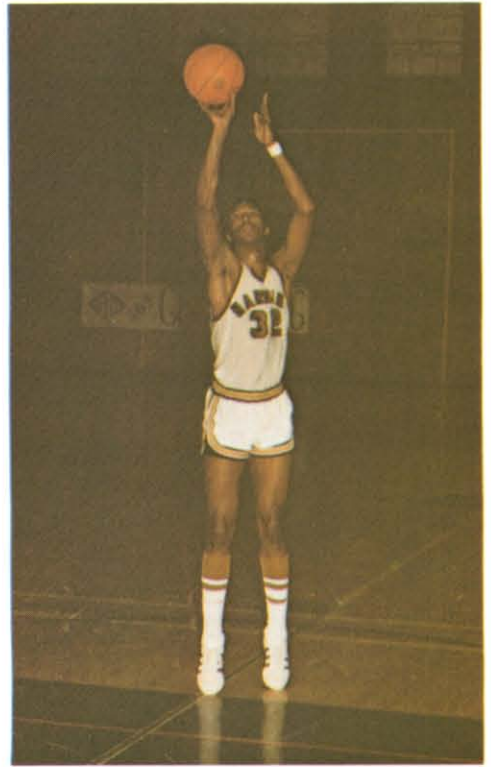

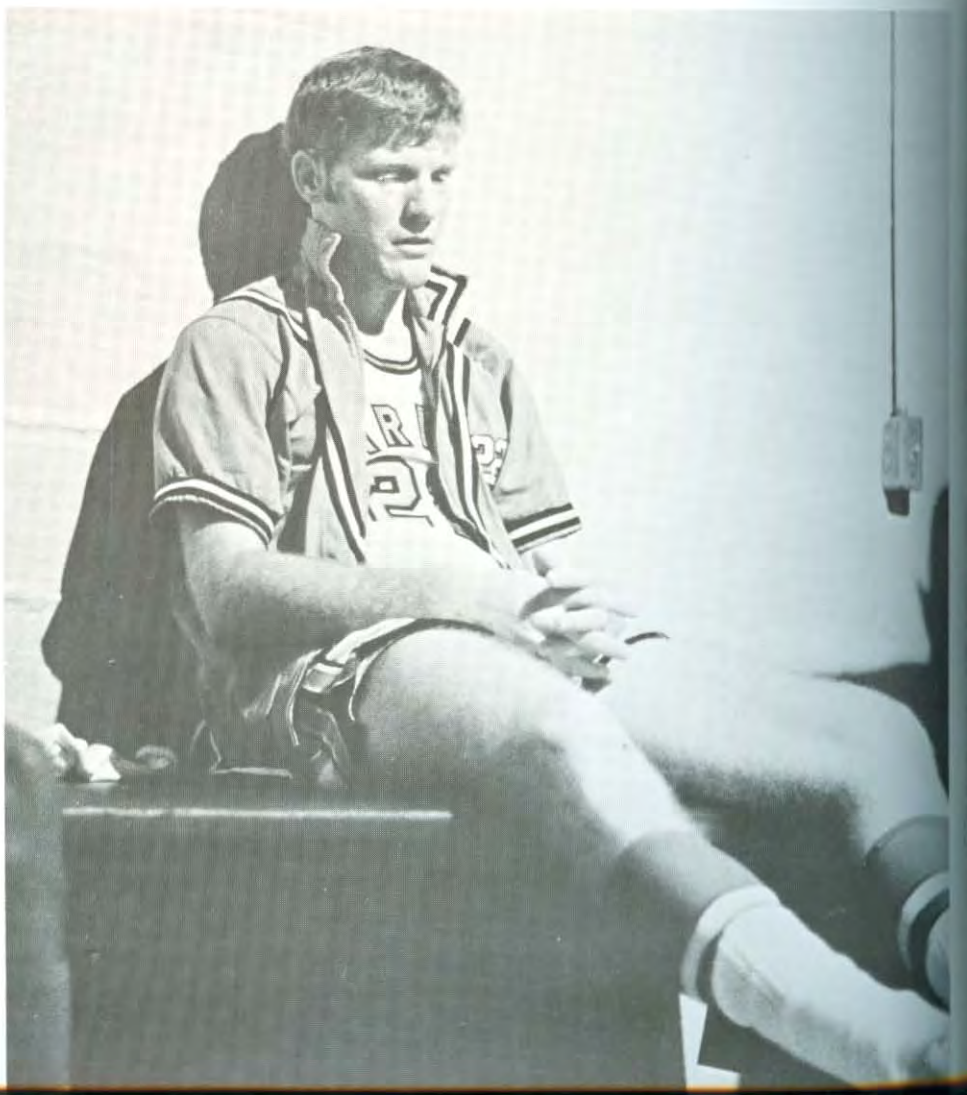

Four performers average over ten points per game

Despite a poor season's record, the Bison basketball team had four competitors among the AIC's top thirty scorers. All of these players averaged 13 or more points per game for Harding.

Junior Bill Chism, the squad's offensive leader, led all performers with an 18.3 scoring average. The fine outside shooter from Clarkton, Missouri achieved 13th place in the AIC scoring title and was honored by being chosen a NAIA District 17 honorable mention member. 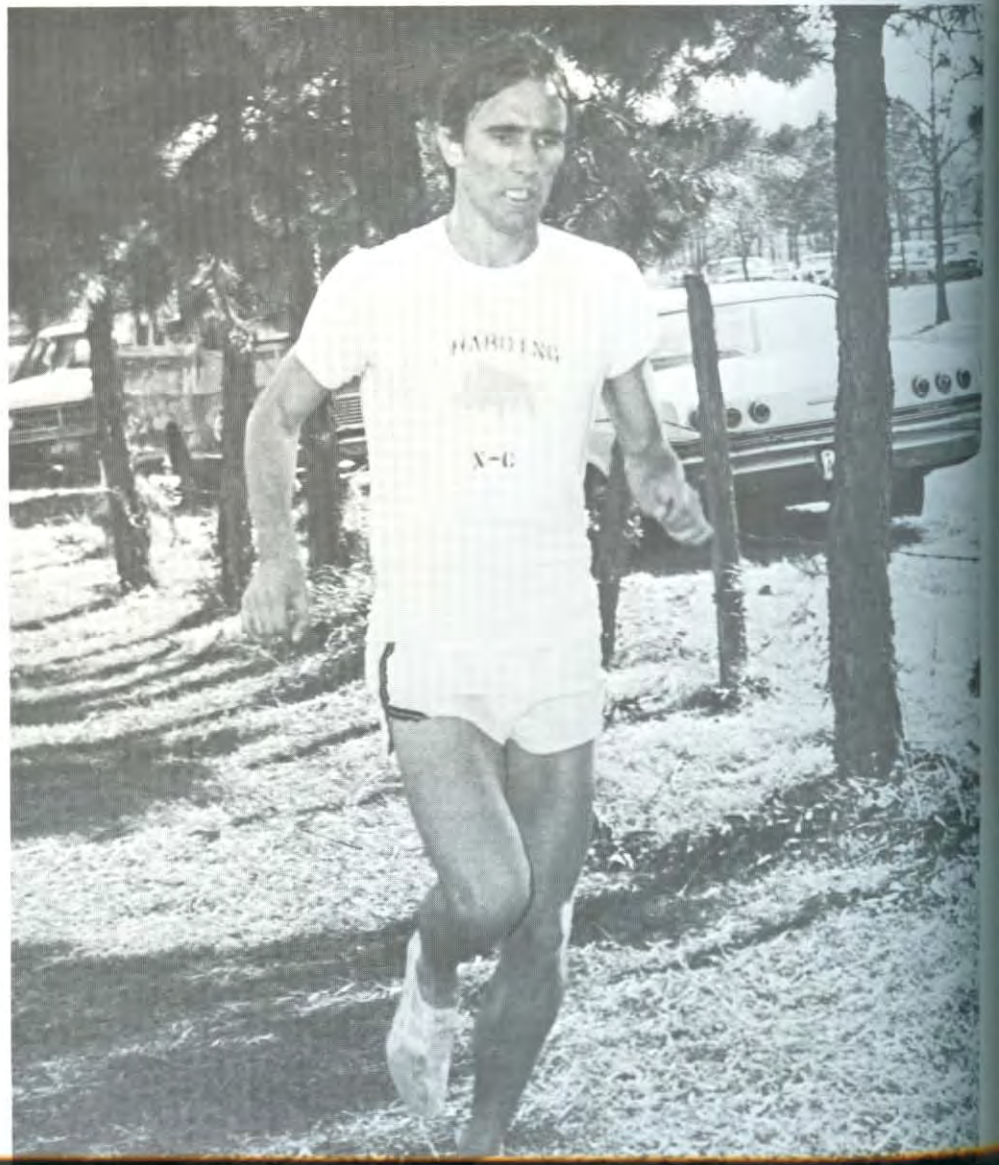

These athletes depend not only on ability, but have the desire to excel and the initiative to work harder. The Harding College intercollegiate program includes several of these talented men. We honor twelve of these athletes and present their varied sports and previous honors awarded them.

Freddie Marsh successfully defended his AIC singles title and also was a member of the champion doubles duo. Senior trackman Jim Duncan's achievements include a record AIC shot put toss of 60'1", two AIC titles, and a fourth place finish in the NAIA meet. Freshman Marv Francisco attained a 5-1 pitching record and was awarded two baseball honors. A 202.1 pin average was achieved by bowler Charles Burt in capturing the national singles title for a second time. Diver Roger Shuffield tallied just over 200 points in optional diving to set several marks. Six football competitors were honored: tackle Mike Watson, defensive back David Treadwell, Co-captain and defensive end Eugene Johnson, end Ronnie Peacock, who set an AIC record with 62 receptions. All-American guard Jerry Cook, and freshman tailback Alan Dixon, who totaled 882 yards in 10 games for the Bisons. In cross country John Ratliff shared the AIC title with a time of 26:17 for the 5-mile course.

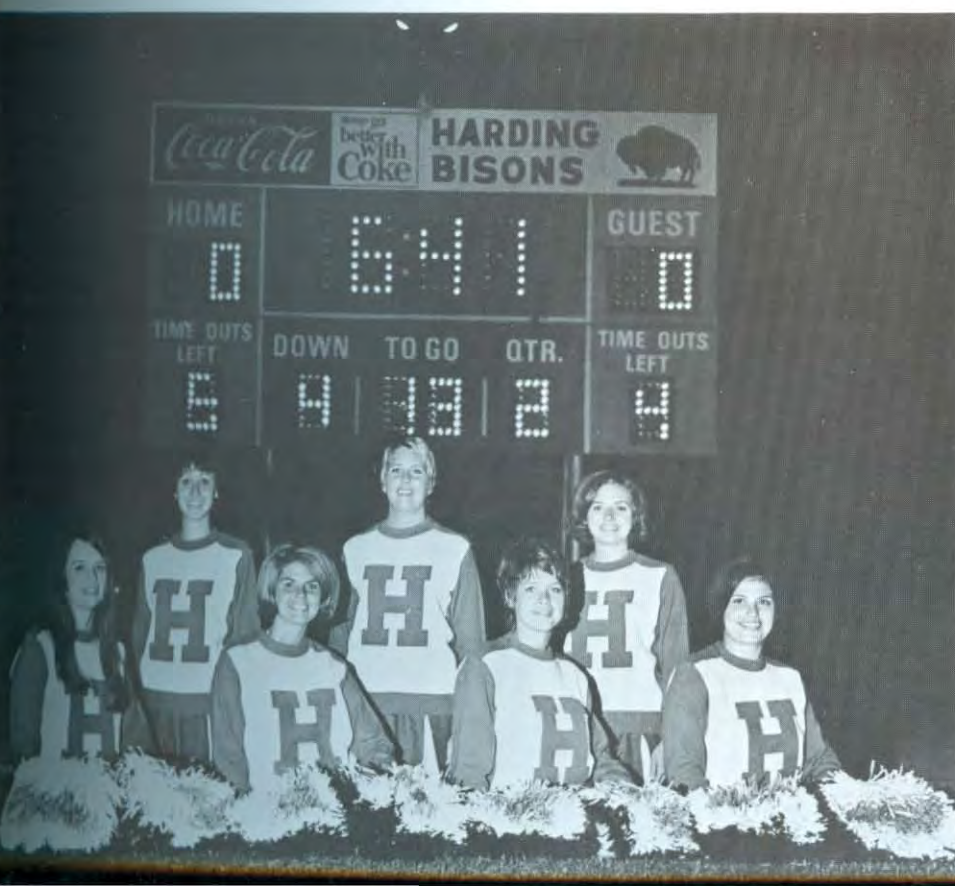

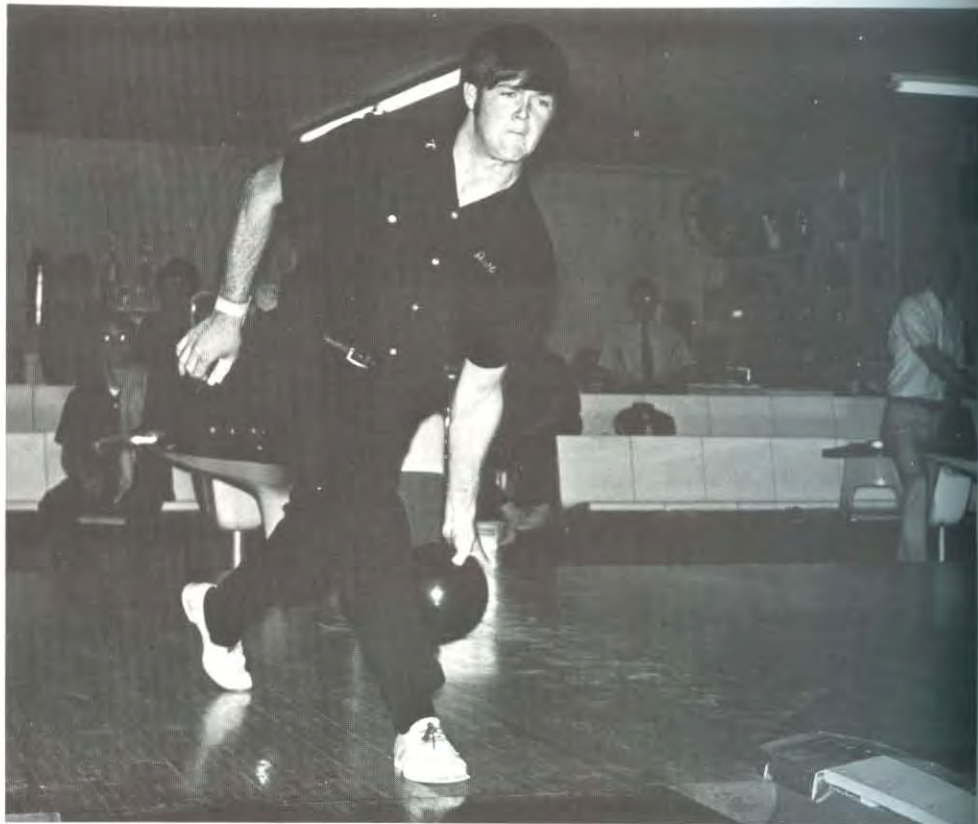
BOWLING

National bowling title captured by Bison kegglers

With senior Charles Burt winning the singles title to lead the way, the 1970 Bison bowling team attained first in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics bowling championship in Kansas City, Missouri. After a fourth place finish in 1969 and a second the year before, Harding's victory was the first national championship ever won by a member of the AIC and NAIA District 17. The team earned its way to the tournament finals with its sixth straight AIC victory and wins in two regional tournaments.

Four of the five experienced team members finished in the top ten individual pin-fall for the meet. Charles Burt's singles victory, his second national title, was paced by an average of 202 pins per game and a high score of 227 in the final match.

The bowling team excelled impressively during the season with improving scores. The members did well in other bowling tournaments throughout the area.

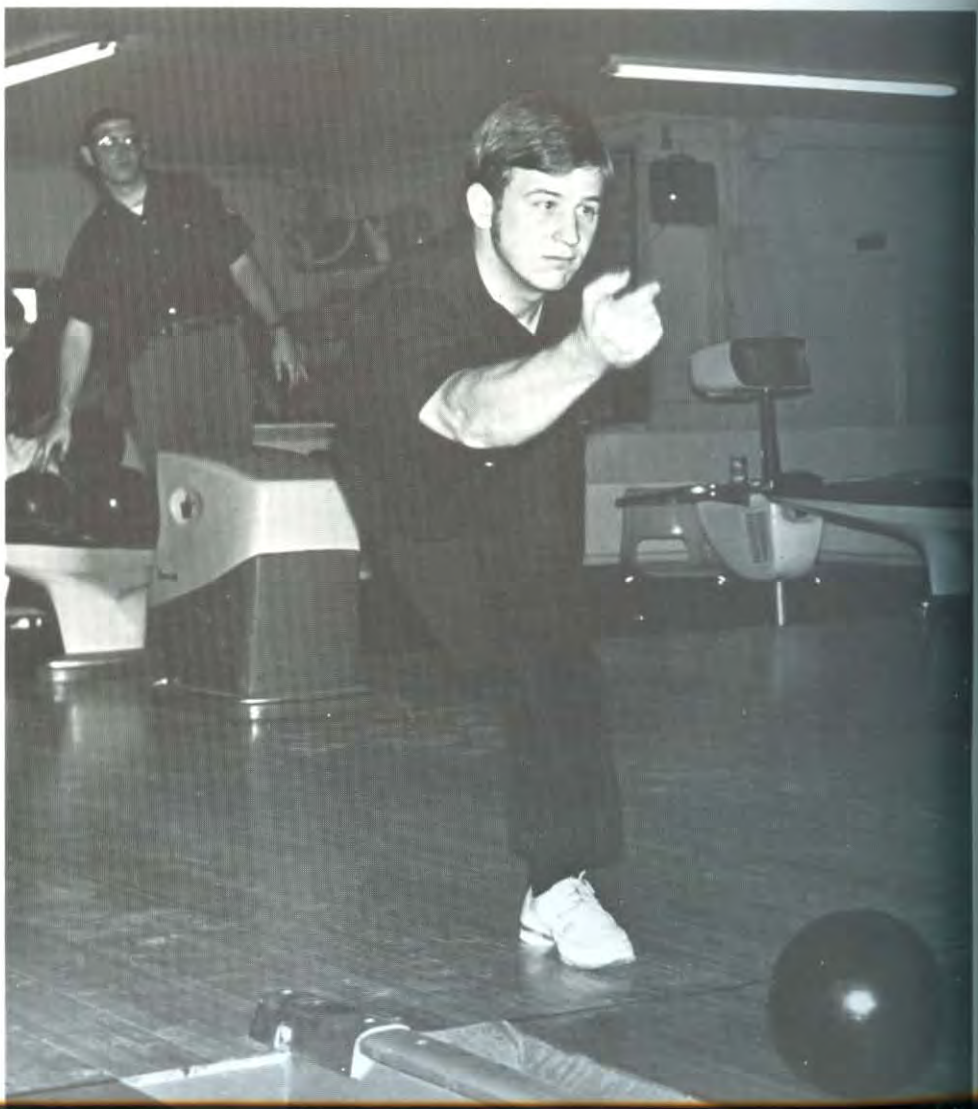


SOPHOMORE team member Dave Hudson's expression captures the great concentration necessary in developing his left-handed game, resulting from an injury incapacitating his right hand.

Frustrating year for team despite high-quality play

The Harding baseball team completed its season with a record of 15-11, with the majority of its losses occurring in conference play. Coach Johnson's crew included several excellent hitters and pitchers, but there was no consistent play by the members of the team.

Freshman Marv Francisco was the only Bison ballplayer named to the All-AIC first team. He also attained the honor of being chosen to the All-District 17 team. Catcher Denny Dotson, pitcher Ken Merritt, and third baseman Jerry Moore were selected to the All-AIC second team. Previous All-American shortstop Roy Steele led the team in batting with a .333 batting average, while Francisco compiled an impressive 5-1 pitching record. His earned-run average of 1.93 ranked among the leading pitching averages in the conference.

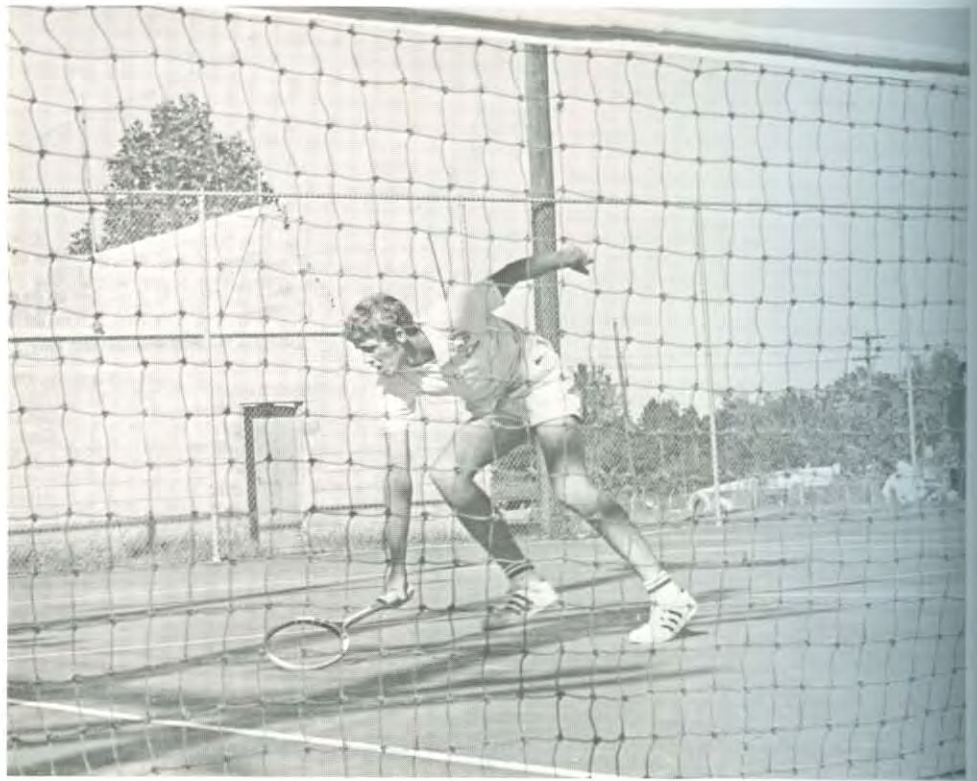

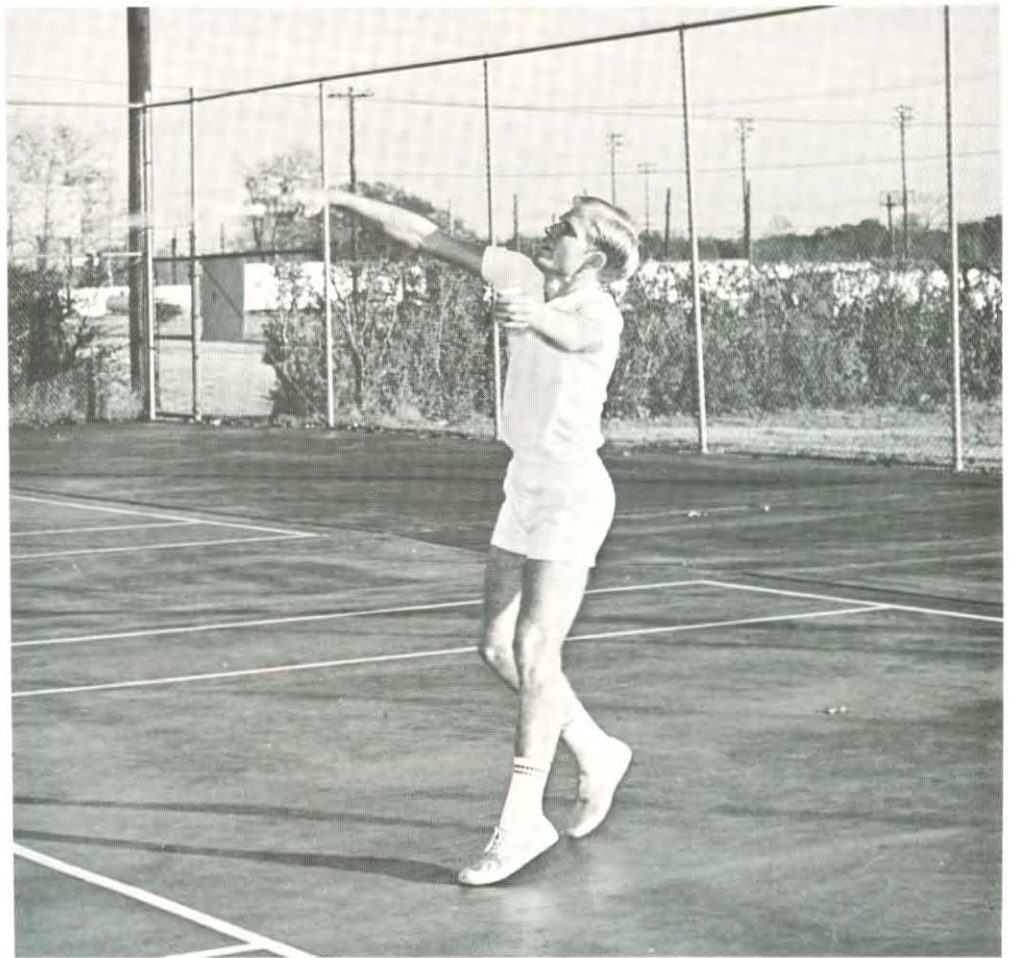

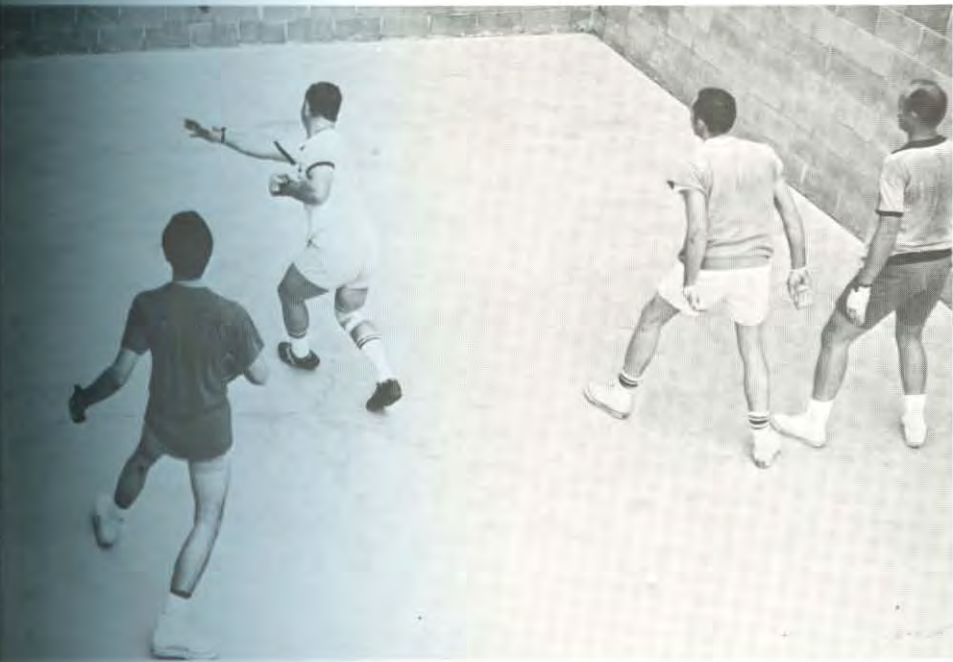

Clubs contribute toward building strong characters

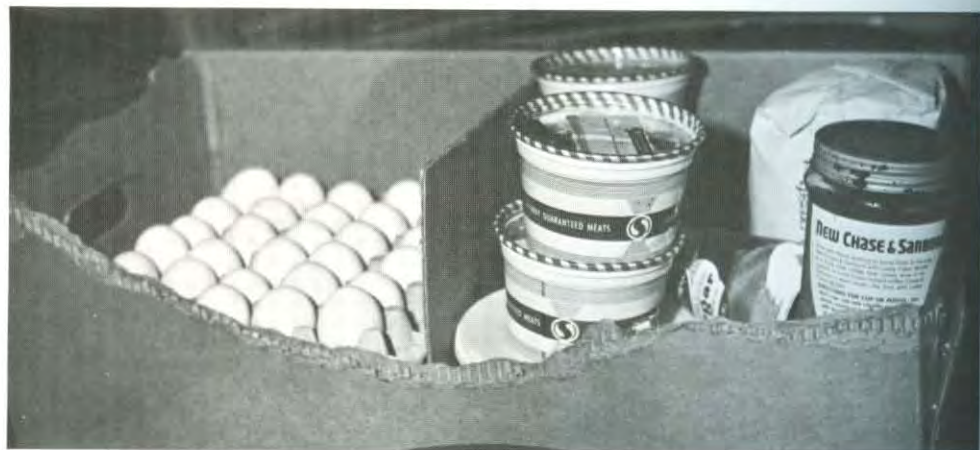

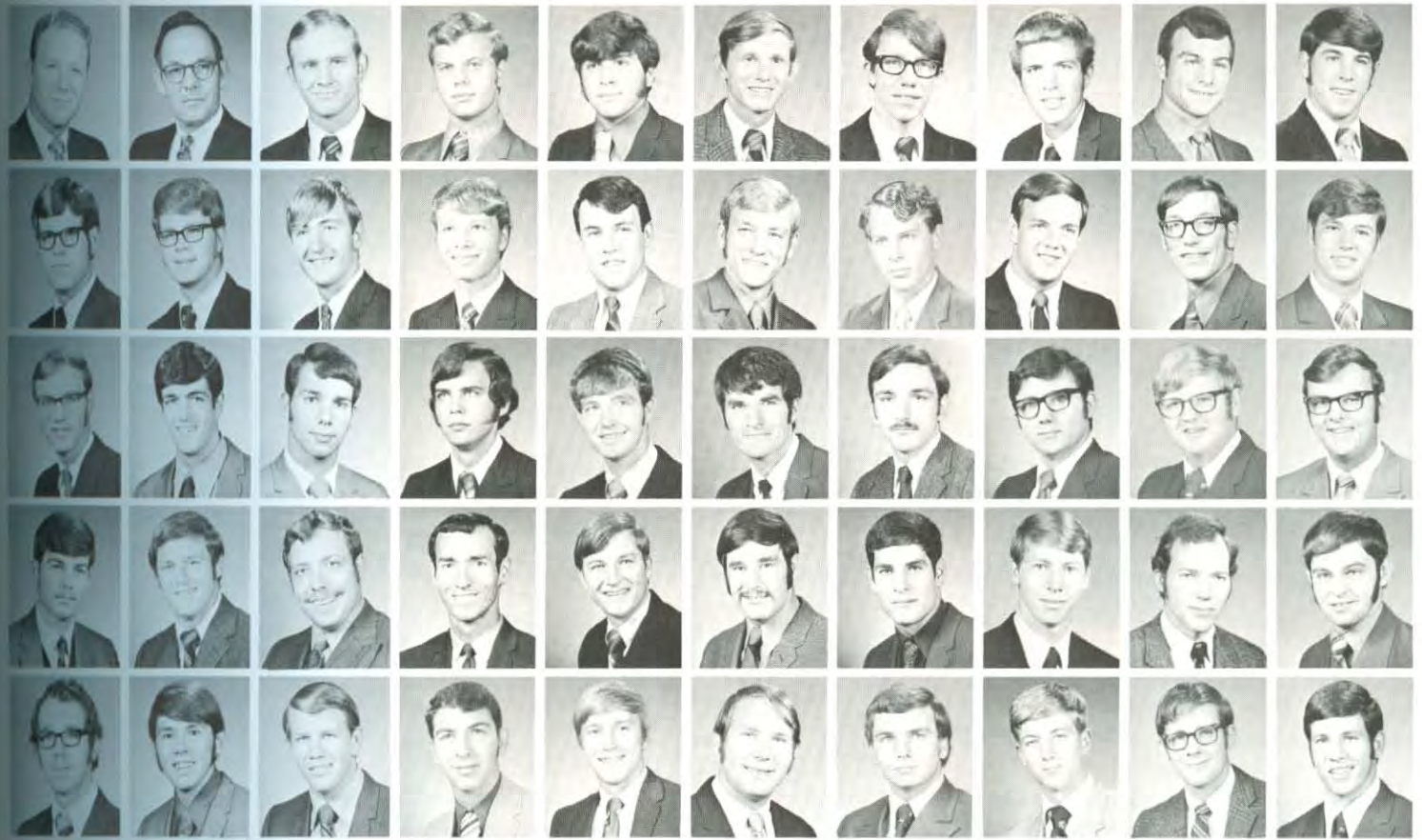

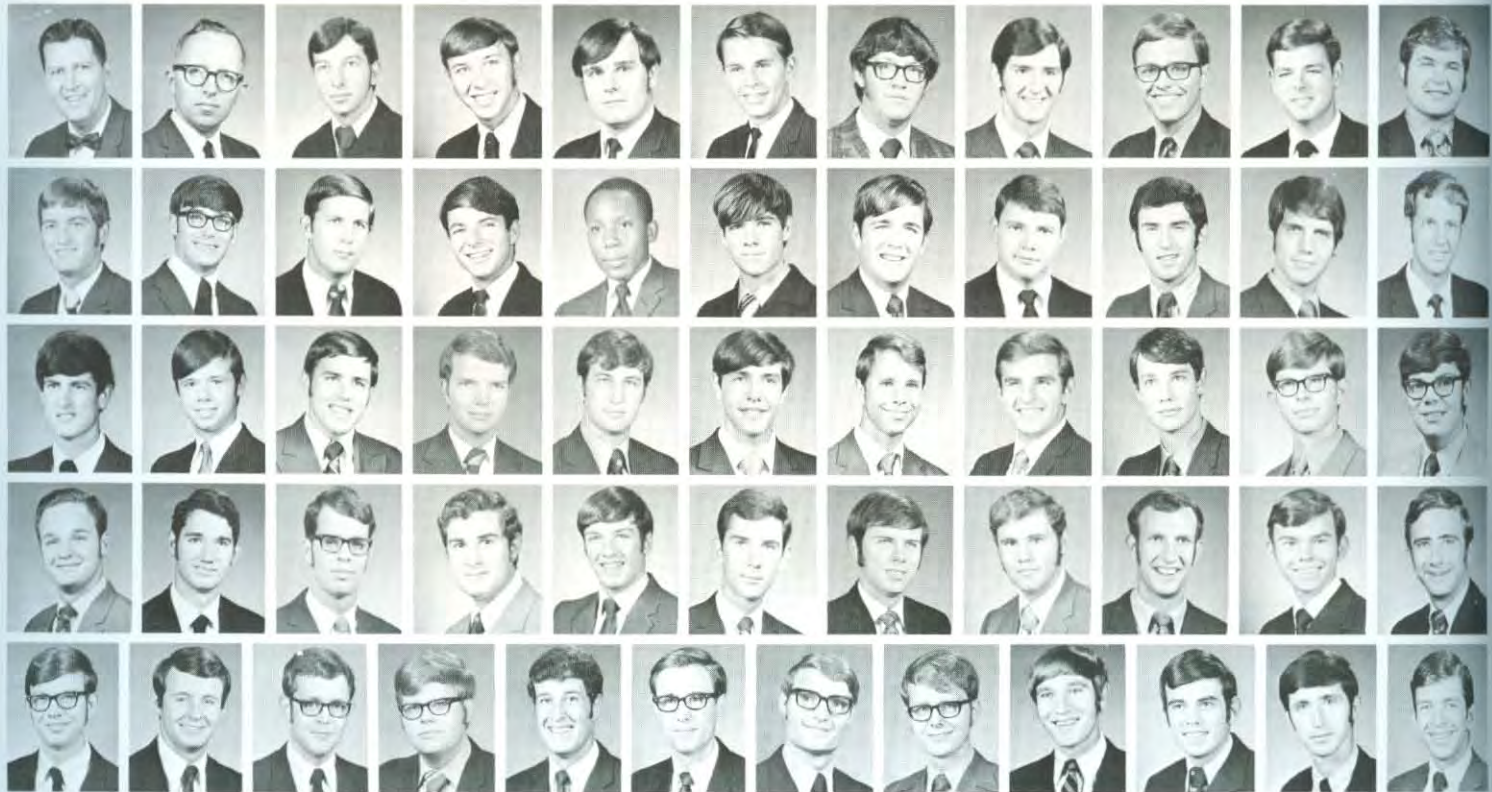

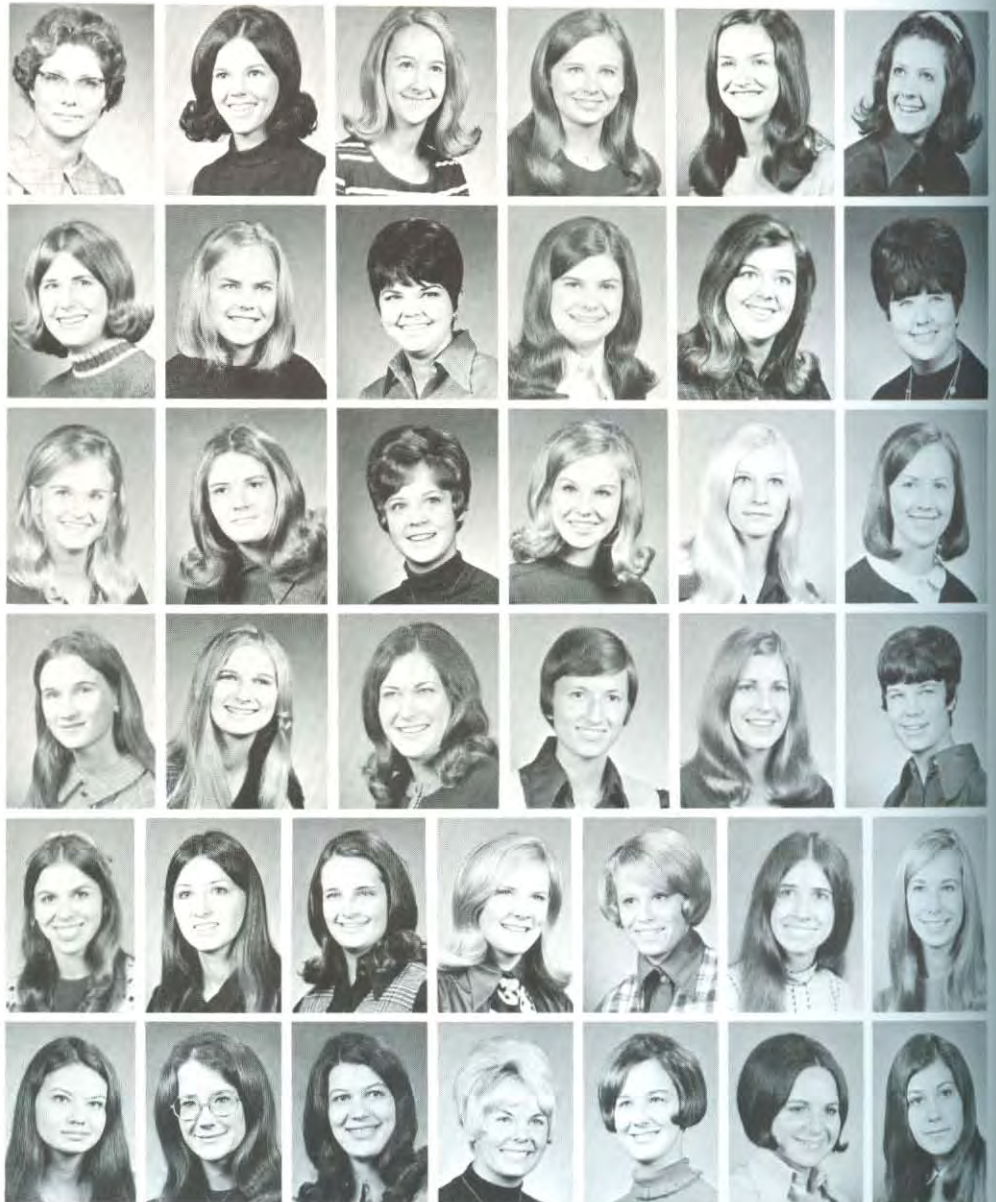

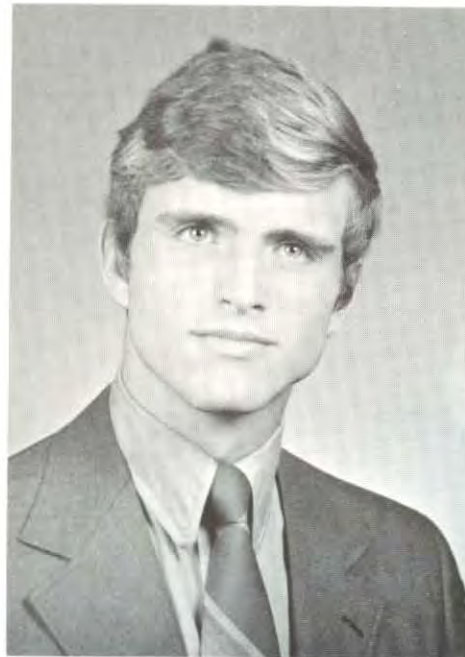

Five new members and new sponsor join Sub-Debs

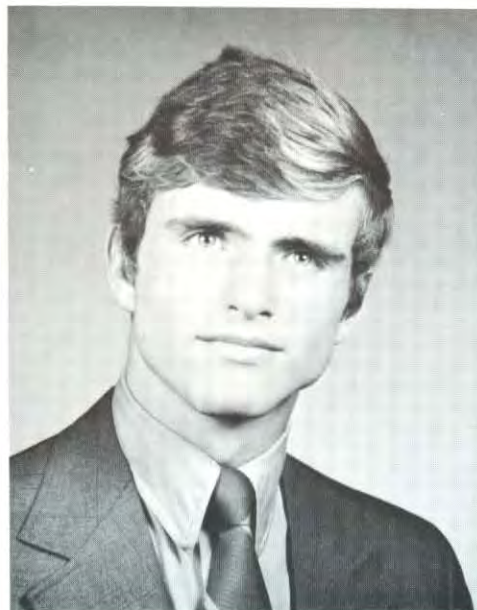

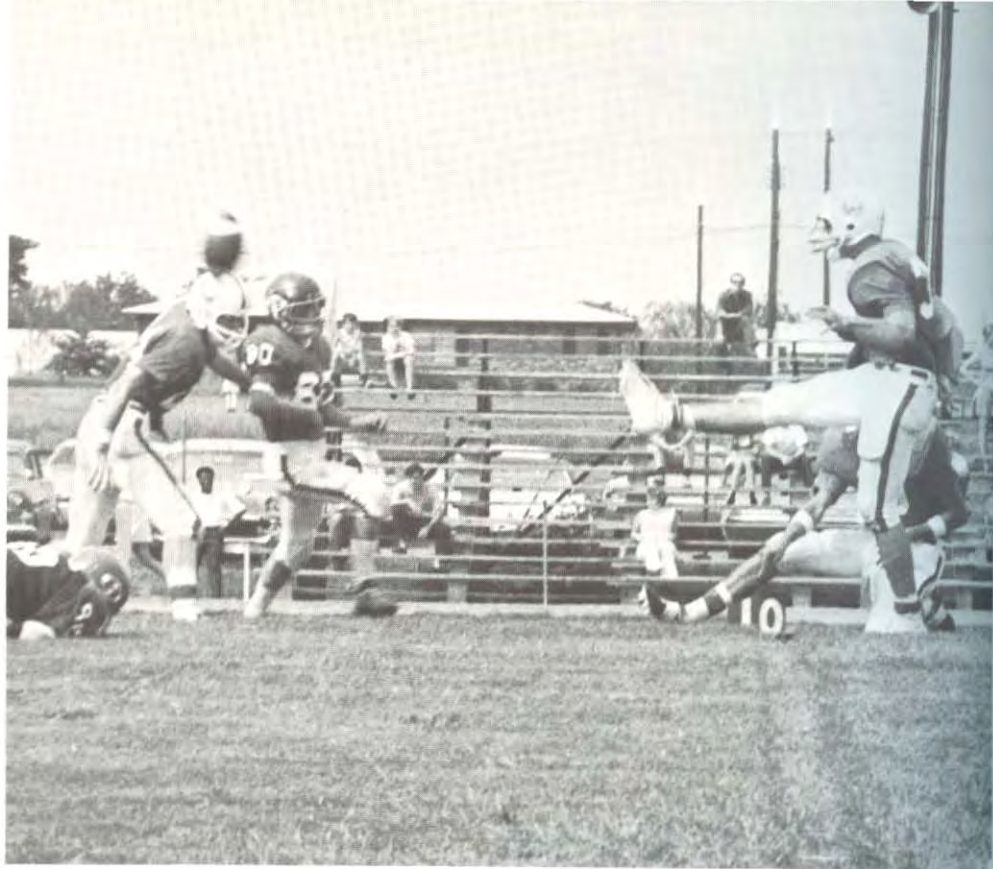

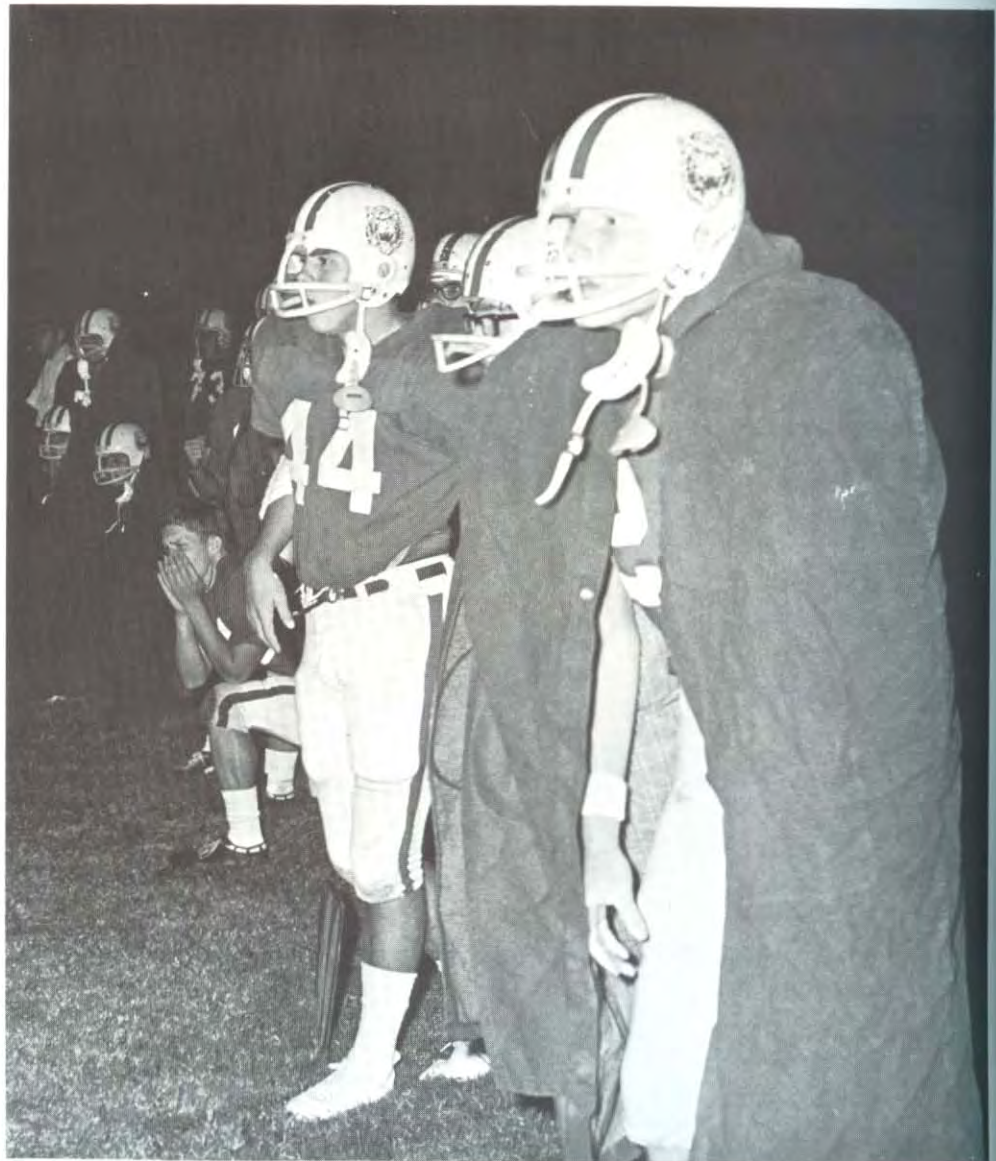

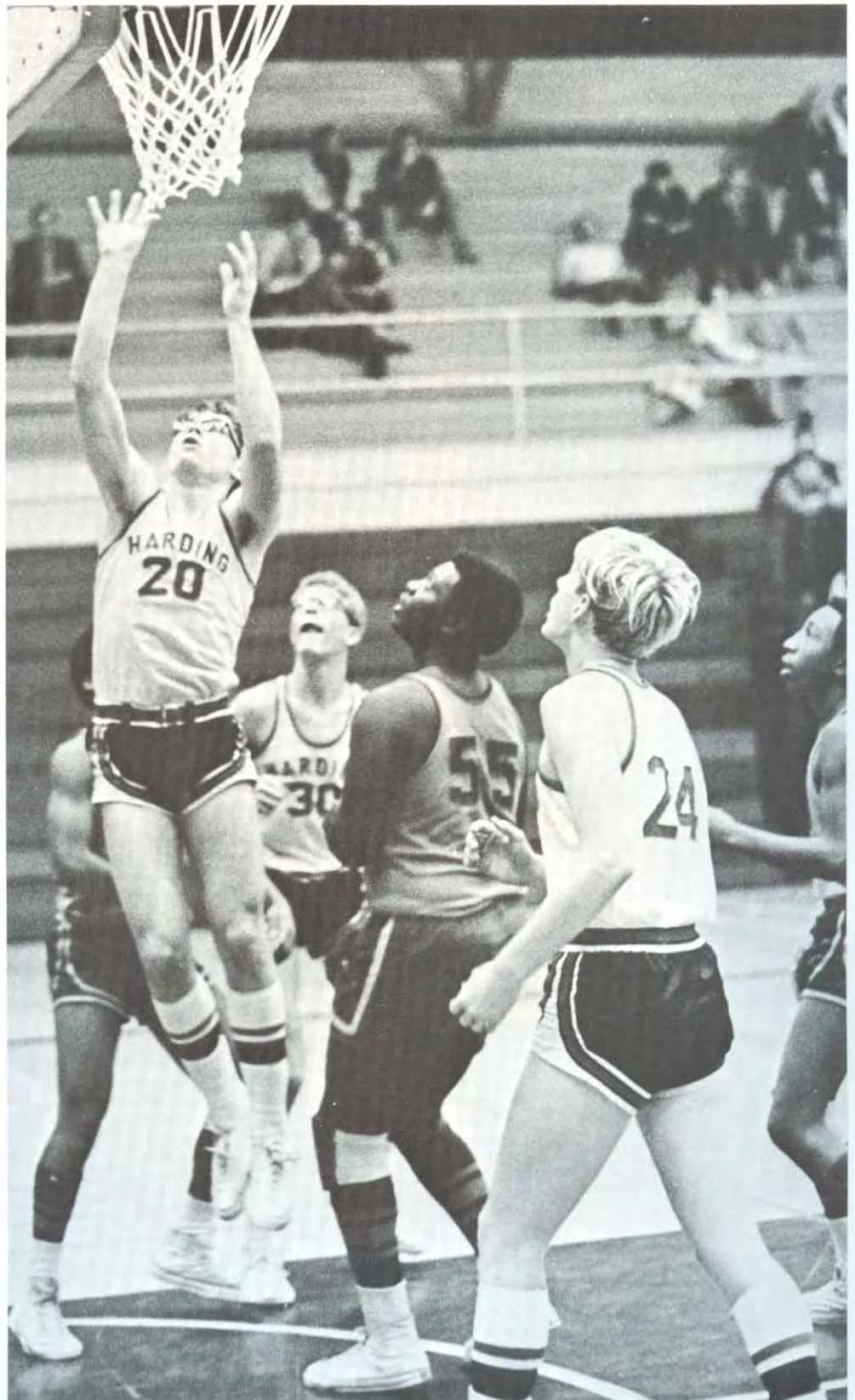

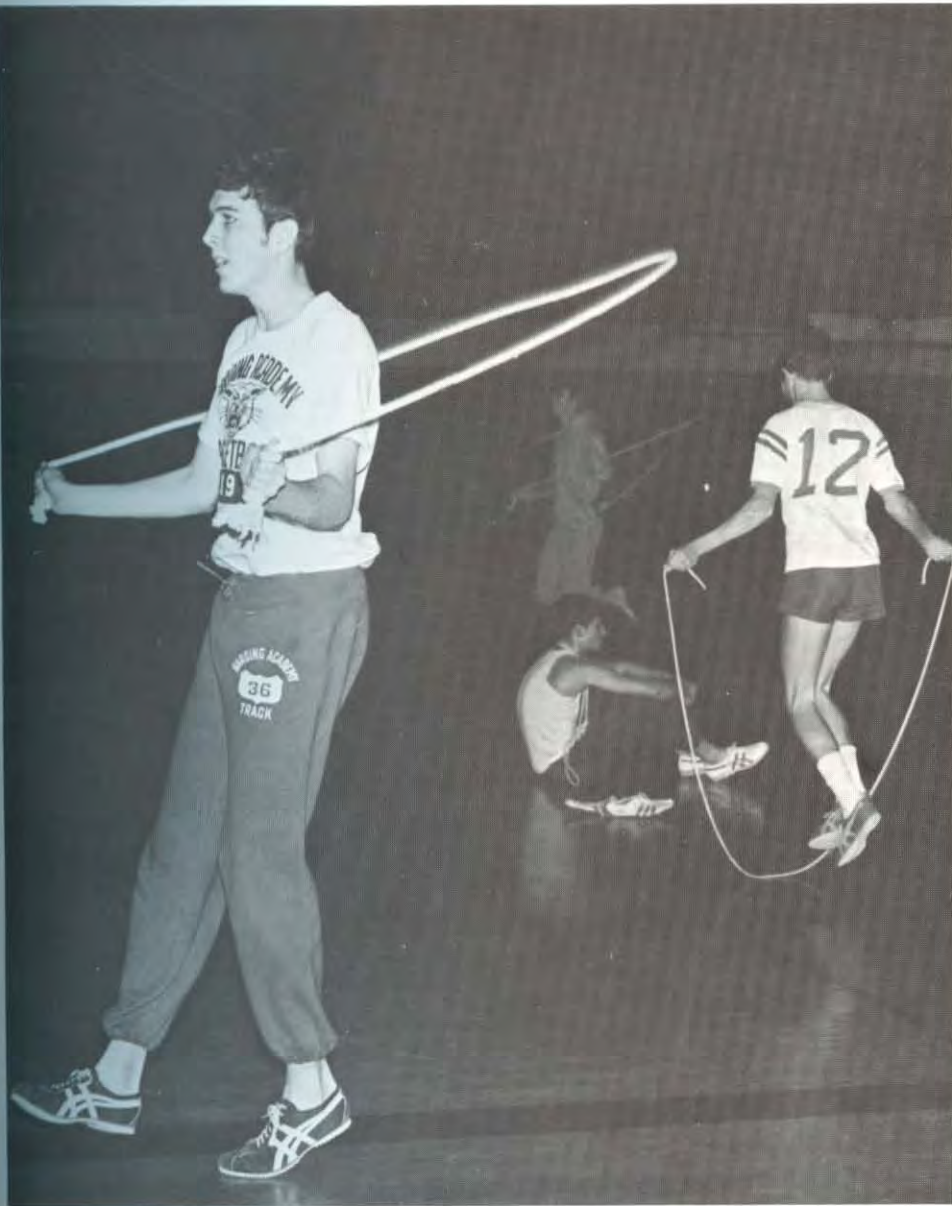

Finding time to work as teacher aides in a school for retarded children, spending their vacations working in campaigns for Christ, and donating blood in a local Red Cross drive are only a few examples of the personal involvement found in Harding's student body.

The ability to combine the classroom with extracurricular activities to produce the well-rounded student is education at Harding.

IN MEMORIAM

HARRY B. RISINGER

1920-1970

Harry B. Risinger gave fifteen years of unselfish, dedicated service to Harding College, joining the staff in 1955 as pilot of the college plane. He also performed other valuable services to the college — first, as a refrigeration engineer and, later, in sales and public relations for the College Farm Dairy. His skill as a pilot was evidenced by the hundreds of flights he made carrying Dr. George S. Benson and Dr. Clifton L. Ganus on missions for Harding College to all parts of the coun-

try. He was recognized in the community for his integrity of character, pleasant disposition, and enthusiastic support of Harding College. He is survived by his three children, Mrs. Jim Stanley, Harry "Bud" Risinger, and Amanda, and his wife.

Born November 13, 1920, Mr. Risinger attended Harding elementary school and academy while the college was at Morrilton. He served approximately five years in the U. S. Air Force as a pilot during World War II, flying many missions in

the Pacific theater. He died of a heart attack at his home on July 17, 1970.

He was appointed an elder of the College church of Christ in 1966. He took the lead in developing and implementing a zone plan to serve resident members and a group plan to serve college students. He also took a special interest in serving the needs of elderly people and the sick. It has been said that the best sermon that can be preached is a godly life. Harry B. Risinger preached a powerful sermon.

The task of depicting a year in the life of an institution and its members is no small one. However, within these pages a concerted effort was made in that direction. Initially the task seemed monumental and problems emerged. Yet as the year progressed the staff gradually saw the realization of its dreams.

Sincere appreciation goes to John Clark, Ben Red, Herman West, and their staffs, each of whom made significant contributions to the technical aspects of the book through their patience and advice. But especially to Dean Pryor, the staff, and my friends do I owe a special degree of gratitude for their much needed help and patient understanding.

At the end of another chapter in our lives we look out at the world to see what lies before us. The view is different for each. All that is certain is that it has been good for us to have shared our experiences together.
