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HARDING COLLEGE

For 23 years Harding College has been sending graduating classes out from her campus. These young men and women are not ordinary college graduates. They are the finished products of a unique institution—the exceptional products of an unusual and important kind of higher education. At Harding College these young people have had every opportunity to develop the finest in Christian character. They are well-trained specialists in some field of human endeavor, but the important thing about them is that they have acquired also a knowledge and understanding of the finer things of the spirit.



Facts You'll Want To Know

- Purpose and Aims?**
Harding College was established in 1924 to provide education of standard quality in a wholesome social environment, and to build real Christian character. Stressing Christian living, Harding combines an enrichment of mind with a professional training that equips young people for real service.
- Management?**
The college has its own independent, self-perpetuating Board of Directors. It receives no regular church contributions, and belongs to no denomination. Its management is composed of plain Christians, who believe in the virtues of the Christian religion, and who strive to be undenominational.
- Atmosphere and Spirit?**
Spirit of the College is delightfully friendly, democratic, Christian. Every teacher is a personal friend, and you are shoulder-high with every other student on the campus.
- Enrollment?**
Approximately 700 students are now enrolled. They come from more than 33 states and 4 foreign countries.
- Courses and Departments?**
All departments of the liberal arts college, including the arts, sciences, fine arts, and some professional fields.
- Degrees Granted?**
Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Music.
- What Vocations and Professions?**
Students go into scores of professions as a result of training in twenty basic departments such as Art, Bible and Religion, Business, Education, Fine Arts, Home Economics, Journalism, Sciences, Social Sciences, etc.
- Standing?**
Fully accredited by the State Department of Education. Application to the North Central Association pending. Students now transfer to universities with full credit.
- Success of Graduates?**
Thoroughness of training and individual attention enables our graduates to fill with honor instructorships and research fellowships in the universities, and to hold positions of responsibility and trust in many vocations.
- What Preparatory Work?**
The College maintains a fully accredited High School and an Elementary Training School, all with the same high standards.
- Summer School and Acceleration?**
A full summer quarter permitting students to complete the four-year course for the degree in two years and nine months.
- Faculty?**
A faculty of scholarly men and women, with advanced training and degrees, each a specialist in his department and ready to give assistance to any student.
- Library and Laboratories?**
A growing library of 25,000 volumes, carefully selected. Unusually complete laboratories add new equipment constantly.
- Campus and Student Accommodations?**
Pattie Cobb and Godden Hall for girls. East and West Halls, a group of hutsments and several houses for single men. Apartments are available for married veterans. Excellent meals in the college cafeteria cost \$25 per month.
- Student Activities?**
Every type of clean, wholesome, cultural activity: dramatics, speech, debate, journalism, chorus and glee clubs, social organizations, and all sports.
- Health and Care?**
Health program includes services of trained nurse, hospitalization, medical care, all covered in regular fees. Physical education includes every type of healthful activity—basketball, tennis, baseball, softball, swimming, riding, etc.
- Scholarships and Prizes?**
Scholarships for valedictorians, salutatorians, and to certain others by special arrangement. A number of prizes and awards offered yearly.
- Expenses?**
Total costs run from \$823 to \$542 per year, covering board, room, tuition, and all regular fees.
- Employment and Student Loans?**
Student loans are available, especially to juniors and seniors who expect to be employed upon graduation. Student employment also available.
- Growth?**
Because Harding College has stood for thorough work, clean living, high personal and civic ideals, it has become well and favorably known to educators and to the business leaders of America.

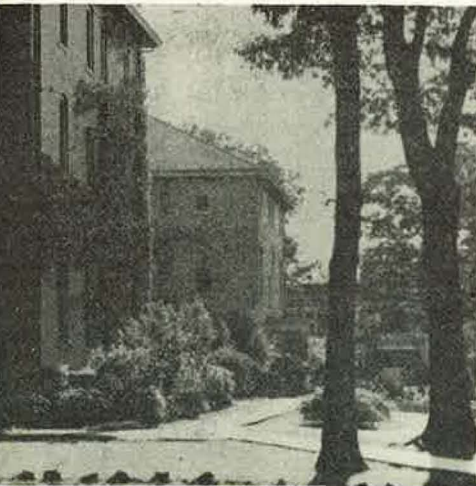
ABOUT ENTERING HARDING

About Our Building Program

Dear Friend:

You will want to know what Harding College is doing to meet the increased demands that are being placed upon present-day Christian education. We have not been idle at Harding College. The institution has already grown to meet the swell of incoming students, and further expansion is contemplated.

However, it is not our plan to make Harding into a "big" college. We'd rather stay small—that is, within the size where we can be of greatest service to the largest number. We want to stay small, so that our faculty can give its best in individual and personal instruction. With approval of the Board of Trustees the enrollment for next year is limited to 700. But we do want to improve and increase our facilities.

Harding College's building and expansion program, first announced in 1940 and delayed soon thereafter by the war, is being started anew.

A new and modern library building sufficient to hold 100,000 volumes will be the first new, permanent-type structure to go up. As conditions permit, these buildings will follow: gymnasium, student center, industrial arts, auditorium, and additional dormitory space. The money is on hand for these structures.

Two dormitories, housing 75 men each, are virtually complete. Emergency housing projects of a semi-permanent nature also are underway. Additional facilities are under construction by the veterans' program. These include a chemistry laboratory, classroom building, and infirmary.

As time goes on, Harding College will be still better equipped to do an important job in an efficient and successful manner.
