### SPECIAL MEETINGS

A number of special dinners and luncheons are scheduled in connection with the lectureship. Some of these are included within this program, while others will be ar nounced at lectureship assemblies. ### EVENING LECTURES

Each evening there will be two speakers. One will be speaking in the College Auditorium while the other is speaking in the College Church Auditorium. The College Church is located at 712 E. Race Ave., two short blocks north and one block west of the main campus gate.

### LECTURESHIP PARKING

There is parking space behind and on the west side of the College Church building in the church parking lots. In addition to the large parking lot adjacent to the College Auditorium there is a larger new lot across the railroad track from the regular parking entrance.

Guests are free to park wherever they desire during

the lectureship period.

### **MEALS**

Meals may be obtained on campus in the two school cafeterias, one in Pattie Cobb Hall and the other in the American Heritage Center, as well as in the College Inn in the Ganus Student Center. Many fine restaurants are also available in the city proper, just a few blocks from the campus.

### HOUSING

Guy Petway, manager, American Heritage-Alumni Center, will take reservations for that building on a firstcome, first-served basis at regular rates for rooms there. Other housing is available in local hotels and motels. Because of dormitory conditions at the college this year, if will not be possible to furnish free housing to guests. Many people, as in the past, will continue to make their own arrangements with friends in Searcy.




