

#### Students Contribute 1,062 Christmas Gifts To Children's Homes

An array of toys, dolls, games, puzzles, stuffed animals, books and almost every child's gift imaginable filled the Student Association office the week before Christmas holidays began, the result of Harding's annual Toy and Dolly Drive.

Lucy, Snoopy, the Calico Cat, Hansel and Gretel, Leonardo the Lion and some 400 other handmade gifts were among the total of 1,062 items donated by Harding students and sent to Christian children's homes for Christmas. Twenty-five homes in thirteen states received the gifts.

The following are criteria:


The candidate must have achieved a degree of excellence and recognition in his chosen field of activity.
