

## From "A Tribute To Leonard Kirk" by Jim Bill McInteer

"Leonard Kirk was a great man because of the love he possessed for his family . . Greatness walked with him because of his love for children. . . He championed efficiency conceived of labor, . . Through his love for music he taught that music was expressing something—not just "singing them in" . . . He loved the truth: there was his strong faith in God in spite of every adversity. . . He was great because of the sheer weight of his personality. . . You wanted to be like him, but you had enough respect never to try to imitate. . . There was just one like him. . . . There was no hatred in his heart. . . . Those of us that he leaves behind he leaves enriched, empowered, and in love because the melody of his life has brought a blessing to our souls. . .
