Nursing Program Receives Approval

Harding's recently approved Olen Hendrix Nursing Program has scheduled its first classes for the 1975 fall semester, according to Dr. James Carr, assistant to the president.

Harding has had a pre-nursing program for more than 25 years. In 1972, the college's premedical advisory committee recommended the initiation of a nursing program. Plans were begun and in November the Arkansas State Board of Nursing approved Harding's baccalaureate degree program in nursing.

After completion of four years and one summer of course requirements or the equivalent to 144 hours, students at Harding with nursing degrees will be eligible to take the Registered Nurse examinations of the State Board of Nurse Examiners.

Facilities for the new program will be housed in the renovated Olen Hendrix Nursing and Home Economics Center, of which 7,500 square feet will be devoted to the resources required for nurses training, according to Carr, who coordinated efforts to initiate the nursing program at Harding.

The third floor has been designed to provide the necessary facilities for the department, and will include two large classrooms, a multi-purpose medical preparation room, student conference and reference rooms and office space for faculty members.

Full study resources will be provided, Carr said, with nursing equipment and facilities in the Hendrix Center. Students will also use Little Rock hospitals and a local medical clinic for clinical practice.

Formerly known as the Old Science Building, the remodeled structure is named for Olen Hendrix, a member of Harding's Board of Trustees. The building is one of two buildings still standing which were a part of the campus when Harding moved to Searcy. Hendrix has taken an active interest in Christian education and leadership in promoting health care in Arkansas.

Since 1959, Hendrix has been a member of the Arkansas Senate, representing more than 55,000 Arkansans in a southwestern region of the state. Serving as president pro-tem of the Arkansas Senate, he has been active in prison reform in the state and has also served on the Arkansas Highway Commission and the State Hospital Board.

A. Michele Warren, a graduate of Vanderbilt University currently working toward her doctorate at the University of Michigan, heads the nursing program. Mrs. Warren is a

> member of the American Nurses Association and has served in the capacity of head nurse at hospitals in Royal Oak and Detroit, Mich.

> She taught at Highland Park College, Highland Park, Mich., from 1965 to 1973, and is a member of several professional organizations, including the ANA, the American Association of

Alumni Contributions Top \$290,000

Contributions by alumni increased by approximately \$26,000 during the 12-month period July, 1973, through June, 1974, according to the annual report submitted by Buford Tucker, executive secretary of the Harding Alumni Association.

Alumni contributions during the 1973-74 fiscal year totaled \$296,484, an increase of more than nine percent over the \$270,703 contributed in 1972-73. The number of alumni contributing (2,179) was 18.8 percent of the college's 11,561 alumni on file.

Tucker's report also revealed a significant increase in the average gift made by an alumnus. The average gift made during 1973-74 was \$136 as compared to the 1972-73 average of

Despite slight decreases in the number of alumni contributing and in the percentage of donors, alumni contributions during 1973-74 were the

second highest in the college's history. In 1972-73, 2,568 alumni or 23.4 percent made contributions.

During the first eight years of Harding's Decade of Development alumni contributions increased significantly. During fiscal 1965-66 alumni donations tallied \$87,737 and have steadily grown to the present level in excess of \$296,000. The largest annual contribution ever made by alumni came after the 1971 PHONOTHON during fiscal 1971-72 when \$386,664 was given.

Commenting on the report Paul Gardner, director of annual giving, said, "We are happy to see the increase in financial support by our alumni. We need the support of alumni as never before in the school's history and we know that many people are sacrificing to help us continue our work of educating young people."

He pointed out the increase in the

average contribution and its significance. "As alumni receive promotions and higher salaries they are also increasing their donations to Harding," he said. "We hope that all alumni will realize the need for the continual annual contributions. Alumni contributions have increased significantly during the Decade of Development, but during that same period college expenditures increased from \$3.8 million to \$9.5 million."

Explaining the reason for the decrease in the number of alumni contributors he cited the large number of alumni who had completed their commitment made during the 1971 PHONOTHON. He noted that the number of contributors would increase substantially after the 1974 PHONOTHON, which was completed in November.

Commentator **Schedules Appearance**

Paul Harvey, news commentator for the American Broadcasting Company, will speak at a presentation April 3 sponsored by the American Studies Program. The presentation will be held in the college's main auditorium at 7:30

Often referred to as the "burr under the saddle of the American conscience," Paul Harvey has the largest one-man news network in America. He is heard on 600 radio stations and seen via 100 television stations, and his columns appear in 300 newspapers.

His broadcasts and newspaper columns have been reprinted in the Congressional Record more than those of any other commentator.

Approximately one million people hear the ABC personality each year in his more than 90 personal appearances. His presentation in April will be his first visit to the Harding campus.

Announcing the scheduling of the program Dr. Billy Ray Cox, vice president, said, "Paul Harvey is noted for his critical and penetrating examination of the news from within our own country and from around the world. Esquire magazine called him 'the voice of the silent majority' and certainly he is the spokesman for many in our nation. We are very happy he will be a part of our 1975 American Studies Program."

The visiting lecturer has been the recipient of nine honorary degrees, has been named Radio's Man of the Year by critics of his own industry, and has been elected to the Hall of Fame in his home state of Oklahoma.

Other honors include nine honor medals and certificates from the Freedoms Foundation, selection as Commentator of the Year, and inclusion on the Gallup Poll's list of America's most admired men.

Campus Topography Was First Challenge

Jeanne McGraw was valedictorian of her high school class and completed her first year of college with an enviable 3.84 grade average. What makes this all rather special is that Jeanne has been blind since the age of four and one-half months.

Thirteen years of schooling at the Arkansas School for the Blind in Little Rock apparently prepared Jeanne for college. Her freshman year was spent at Abilene Christian College where the biggest adjustment was to the large size of the campus.

"I went from a school with a graduating class of nine to a college with a total enrollment of 3,300," she said. The Little Rock school contained a total of 190 in grades kindergarten through twelfth.

In April before the end of her freshman year, Jeanne decided to transfer to Harding — much to the delight of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Wallace McGraw of Little Rock, who had been making the 500 mile journey to Abilene every five weeks to see their daughter. The size of the Abilene campus plus some problems with the "scramble system" of the school's cafeteria helped influence her decision.

"There was no line," she explained. "You just sort of go around and pick up what you want. If it's crowded, you just can't make it by yourself."

Harding's campus has proved easier to adjust to. "It is so much easier to get around because the campus is smaller and more compace." At the time of enrollment, Jeanne was assigned a "mobility instructor" to assist her in learning the layout of the campus.

Jeanne is not the first blind person to adapt to the Harding surroundings. David Ransom, a 1973 graduate, and Sharon Geddes, a 1974 graduate, each spent four years at Harding earning their baccalaureate degrees. Ransom is currently enrolled in Harding's Christian Communications Program preparing himself to preach.

The one disadvantage Jeanne has found ironically also comes with a smaller campus. That is, there are more people concentrated into a smaller area. "You are with people more of the time," she explained, "especially with three girls in each dormitory room."

Nita Benge, one of Jeanne's two roommates, does not see any particular problems or conflicts other than those that would normally arise from three college girls living together. Rather, for Nita, "living with Jeanne has been a real inspiration."


"She is totally independent, does all of her own work, studies very hard, and makes grades I only wish I could make!" said Nita.

"I wouldn't trade anything for the experience I have had of getting to know and live with Jeanne."

Curriculum-wise Jeanne cannot tell much difference in Abilene and Harding. "I haven't really had enough experience with my classes to draw a comparison between the two schools," she said. "Like any school, some courses are harder than others."

The tools Jeanne employs for study and class preparation are her own alert mind and a tape recorder. Some class lectures are taped and later transcribed with a Braille writer, built similar to the typewriter. A unique slate and stylus system is used for punching out Braille notes. Many of her textbooks are in Braille or on tape. For classes with texts not available in these forms, Jeanne hires fellow students to read class lessons to her. Such methods must work quite well, for she has managed to maintain the high academic average earned last year. In fact, her mid-semester grades indicated she had maintained a 3.93 average at Harding.

Her fall semester includes 15 hours of classwork in basic math, Western civilization, Bible, sophomore literature and music appreciation — her favorite

class. Her love of music extends both in and out of the classroom, for one of her hobbies is classical music.

Math is not as pleasurable as music, for Jeanne readily admits math is her most difficult subject. But, judging from class performance, it seems to be one of her best. Dr. Steve Smith, her math professor, wishes he "had more like her in class!"

"Jeanne is always in class and seems to do more work on her own than most of my students," Smith said.

Her math textbook is in Braille and she uses the slate and stylus for writing notes and problems in class. For mathematical calculating, Jeanne uses the age-old

abacus. Dr. Smith recalls one lesson when Jeanne's use of the instrument came to particularly good use. "One of our class lessons dealt with the abacus, so Jeanne gave us an expert's lesson in multiplication on the abacus."

Class exams are taken orally and apparently offer no problem. "Jeanne is one of my best students," said Dr. Gary Elliott, her English teacher. "She makes one of the highest grades."

Both Smith and Elliott agree that Jeanne appears to have no particular problems or insurmountable difficulties in either class.

In addition to her hobby of classical music, Jeanne also collects recipes and delights in creating "dishes that are easy to prepare." One good friend from school days who is now married and living in Austin, Texas, corresponds regularly and serves as a main source of recipes. There are two or three other classmates who write, but in Jeanne's words, "they are pretty busy, like me, with college right now, so we don't write too often."

Through the Library of Congress she subscribes to the Reader's Digest, Ladies Home Journal, Newsweek and other magazines in Braille. Because no newspapers are written in Braille, she depends on radio, television and news magazines for the news.

University Professors and the American Heart Association. She was recently inducted into Phi Delta Kappa, a national fraternity in the professional field of education.

In addition to working with Dr. Carr developing and initiating the nursing curriculum, Mrs. Warren is responsible for the acquisition of qualified teachers in the nursing profession for the Harding faculty. Current plans are for hiring three new instructors holding master's degrees and five with bachelor's degrees. Mrs. Warren has stated the desire to have one instructor for every 15 students in the department.

Presently she is working with committees on the official uniform design for nursing students at Harding, which will include the student uniform, the cap, the pin and the ensignia.

"The graduate of the baccalaureate program is prepared to accept positions in hospitals and other community agencies," Mrs. Warren said. "The program will have the necessary academic foundation for advanced study in nursing.



Harding currently has 83 students enrolled in the new program, five of which are males. In previous years students enrolling in Harding's prenursing program received degrees and licenses from other professional schools.

Students enrolled in the nursing program are taking pre-requisite courses

required of all Harding students. Professional courses scheduled to begin in the fall include classes in clinical, medical-surgical, pediatric, psychiatric and obstetrical nursing credit. Professional courses begin on the junior level of college standing.

According to Carr, "Harding has the enrollment, the admissions and the curriculum structure sufficient to graduate 30 baccalaureate degree nurses by 1976, and to sustain or surpass that output in ensuing years."

As the first four-year degree program on a Christian college campus, Harding's degree program is expected to aid nursing students, both male and female, in the medical missions and is expected to draw students from throughout the nation, according to Carr.

Another factor in initiating the program at Harding is the extreme shortage of professional nurses existing in Arkansas and additionally the overall contribution that the new project will make toward improving health delivery services in the North-Central Arkansas area.

Campus Notes

AFAC Selects Board Chairman

Dr. Clifton L. Ganus Jr., president of Harding, was elected chairman of the board of the Arkansas Foundation of Associated Colleges for 1974-75 at the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees in September. Elected Vice-Chairman was Dr. Roy B. Shilling Jr., president of Hendrix College.

The AFAC was founded 20 years ago. During these two decades, corporations and individuals have contributed \$3,841,846 to the Foundation to be distributed among the seven member colleges, Harding, Arkansas College, College of the Ozarks, Hendrix, John Brown, Ouachita Baptist University and Southern Baptist College.

Theme Chosen For Youth Forum

The eleventh annual Harding Youth Forum will be held on the college campus March 28-29. Attendance is expected to be the largest ever, according to Fred Alexander, director of admissions.

"The Way Home" has been selected as the theme for the lectures by James Woodroof, minister of the College Church of Christ in Searcy. Woodroof devotes much of his time to talking with and counseling young people.

Three topic lectures will be: "Two Words and A Teen-ager," "How Can We Know the Way?" and "The Returning Love." Last year's forum broke all previous records with 2,500 students and sponsors from more than 21 states registered.

Housing requests may be made through the admissions office. Dormitory rooms will be provided through advance arrangements where space permits. Sponsors may also request housing accommodations through the admissions office.

Muncy Elected To Association Post

Dr. Raymond Muncy, chairman of the history department, has been elected secretary-treasurer of the newly formed Arkansas Association of College History Teachers. The organization is composed of professors of history and social science who teach in Arkansas junior and senior colleges.

The charter group grew out of meetings held by the chairmen of history departments in Arkansas colleges. As members of the Arkansas Historical Association, the men and women met once a year to discuss common problems within their profession. Discussion eventually led to action, and AACHT was born.

In their October 5 meeting, members of the historical society voted for officers for the new organization. Dr. James Chase, University of Arkansas,

Math Organization Elects Vice President

Dr. Bill Oldham, associate professor of mathematics at Harding College, was elected vice president of the Arkansas Council of Teachers of Mathematics for 1975-77 at a meeting of the organization in Hot Springs Nov. 26. At the meeting he read a paper on "Applications of Algebra."

Also at the meeting, held at Jones High School, two others from Harding made presentations. Mrs. Jimmie Clark of the Academy presided at a general interest section on Relevant Mathematics for Non-College-Preparatory Senior High Students. Dr. Dean Priest, chairman of the mathematics department, read a paper entitled "You, Too, Can Make Fibonacci Discoveries."

Application Deadline Adopted

Admissions applications for the 1975-76 school year must be received by July 15, according to Fred Alexander, director of admissions. Applications cannot be accepted after this date.

Two factors have made the deadline necessary. The admissions staff must have ample time for processing applications in advance of each fall term. School officials also need sufficient time to arrange housing for a specific number of students.

Completed applications include the application form itself, a high school transcript and ACT scores from those who have never attended college or who have less than 24 hours of college credit, college transcripts from transfer students, a \$25 room deposit fee, a \$15 application fee, a health certificate, picture and three references.

The deadline date is designed to assist a proposed enrollment limitation

of 2,600 students during the 1975-76 school year. "No official action has yet been taken to establish the limitation, but the possibility does exist," said Alexander. The proposed action would limit the number of incoming freshmen to 700. There were 750 freshmen in the fall enrollment of 1974.

Alexander said his office personnel and counselors will be ready to work with any prospective student in completing admission requirements.

Annual Forum Scheduled For March 4

"The Relevance of the Restoration Plea" will be the theme of the seventh annual Harding College Preachers' Forum Tuesday, March 4, 1975.

Approximately 500 ministers from across the nation are expected to attend this one-day lecture-forum series, according to Dr. Allan Isom of the Harding Bible department, who with Bible chairman Jerry Jones coordinated this year's program.

"The purpose of the forum is to examine various questions in the minds of preachers in an informative format" Isom said. "We hope to present issues which preachers are having to deal with in their everyday ministry."

Featured speakers will include Cecil Wright of the Freed-Hardeman College Bible department, lecturing on "The Restoration Principle" and J.D. Bales of Harding's Bible faculty speaking on "The Denial of the Restoration Principle by Certain Leaders in the Church of Christ."

Afternoon lecturers will include Tom Gaumer, minister of the Northside Church of Christ in Fort Worth, discussing the topic, "Revelation: A Continuing Process?" Earl West of Harding's Graduate School of Religion in Memphis will discuss "Restoration or Reformation, Which?" and Reuel Lemmons, editor of Firm Foundation magazine, will present a lecture, "The Future of the Church of Christ and the Restoration Principle."

The one-day program, which will begin with an 8 a.m. registration and welcome by Harding's President Clifton L. Ganus, Jr., will feature two open forums during the day's activities. These forums open the floor to members of the audience who are free to direct questions to the lecturers.

Musical Presentation Concludes 50th Year

The 50th Anniversary series ended as it began in a flourish of pomp and splendor when the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra, college and academy choruses and three guest soloists presented a musical extravaganza Dec. 7 and 8. More than 300 artists were involved in the concerts performed for appreciative audiences both nights.

The lofty music of "A Sea Symphony" by Ralph Vaughan Williams included the talents of Miss Marion Cawood, soprano who has sung opera in Europe, and Arthur Shearin, a Harding alumnus in doctoral study at the University of Colorado.

Dr. William White, a Searcy physician, sang "The Gettysburg Address' by George Lynn. Men from the three choruses provided choral renditions with the orchestra on "The Testament of Freedom" by Randall Thompson.

To undertake such a feat called for extensive planning and arranging, but the background work and cooperation of many persons resulted in what Dr. Kenneth Davis Jr., A Cappella director, termed "almost a moment of complete satisfaction."

Members of the three choruses spent weeks in rehearsals on campus and joined the orchestra in Little Rock only once just prior to the performances.

Maestro Kurt Klippstatter, a native of Austria who is in his second year as conductor-musical director of the 85-member symphony, was high in praise for the quality of the chorus and he especially was appreciative of the stage crew for their cooperation in setting up and preparing for the performances.

Professor Klippstatter paid the chorus perhaps the greatest compliment of all by inviting the group to join the symphony in Little Rock for a future appearance.

President Clifton L. Ganus formally declared the 50th year closed with the presentation of the college's commemorative medallions and copies of the anniversary magazine to the conductor and soloists.

Belles & Beaux Schedule Tour To Far East Bases

The ten members of Harding's Belles and Beaux, set to embark late in January on their sixth overseas tour of military bases, have behind them a history of success. From their organization in 1959, the group has repeatedly won tours sponsored by the USO and National Music Council, entertaining servicemen on three continents.

Also, they have crossed the United States several times, performing for audiences large and small. The singers have been acclaimed by commanders of bases, they have assisted in raising money for the college, they have cheered lonely individuals far from home, and they have built a reputation as a wholesome group of young people with a mission in song.

The forthcoming 56-day tour will be the first under the direction of Clifton L. Ganus III, who assumed the position this fall from the organizer of the troupe, Dr. Kenneth Davis Jr. The tour will likely include performances in Japan, Okinawa, Korea, Philippine Islands, Guam and possibly Taiwan. But the uncertainty of destination — which is determined by the sponsors — will not be unsettling to the group, which can adapt to extenuating circumstances.

The show employs a variety of musical instruments, stage settings and types of songs. The performers include novelty skits, comedy routines, contemporary songs and classic hits in their presentations. Part of their tradition is fast-change artistry with a variety of set adaptations and rapid fire succession of acts. Nearly all performers are on stage for each number and managing set and costume transitions is a tricky business.

A standard show is planned, but each presentation can be adapted to the occasion or the audience. Each year the available talent is utilized for the show. Some of the numbers are originals with members of the group. Arrangements are often offered by Dr. William Hollaway, associate professor of music. This year's show features a Wizard of Oz medley, an accordian solo and comedy monologue.

Selected for the 1975 tour, in addition to Director Ganus, are Terry Beck of Irving, Texas, Debbie Ganus of Searcy, Betty Green of Neward, Delaware, Joy Lynn Henley of Dumas, Lisa Parham of Memphis, Pam Powers of Troy, Ohio, Billy Pullen of Aberdeen, Mississippi, Kathy Roberts of Fort Worth and Joe Roper of Bartlesville, Oklahoma.

In 1959, the group toured the Fifth Army in the mid-central United States. In 1960 and again in 1968, the group spent several weeks touring the Far East. In 1962, they won a nine-week tour of Europe and in 1964 went island hopping to the Pacific Command. The most recent tour was in 1969 to the Northeast Command, touring Greenland, Labrador and Newfoundland.

Dr. Davis, professor of music and director of the A Cappella chorus, organized the group in 1959. He toured with the group and occasionally performed as a part of the chorus or in presenting a solo.

Ganus, now an assistant professor of music, sang with the group during 1963-66, playing the role of the king in the melodrama Fatal Quest, which is still included as a part of the show.

The idea of the group came from Brig. Gen. William P. Campbell (U.S.A. Ret.), who formerly was vice president of the National Education Program. He helped raise money for costumes and other equipment, also.

Survey Reveals Students' Opinions

A survey of Harding juniors and seniors has revealed that 94 percent of the college's students are satisfied with the school's overall performance, according to a report of a faculty committee.

This finding and others are contained in a 19-page section of an institutional self-study made for the North Central Association, a national accrediting organization. A team of educators from the association will visit the Harding campus during the spring semester for a periodical evaluation of the institution.

In the random survey of the Harding students, 48 percent expressed complete satisfaction and 46 percent were satisfied with the college. Only two percent of the students included in the sample indicated overall dissatisfaction and none indicated complete dissatisfaction.

Students were queried as to their reaction to policies, practices, facilities, services, instruction, purposes and goals, and the development of a Christian philosophy. The response of Harding students was compared to the national response in private educational institutions which administered the ACT Institutional Self-Study Survey.

A majority of students indicated agreement with each of the six statements made about academic matters. Eighty-three percent of the students indicated agreement with the statement that teachers are generally available to assist students.

Evaluating the college's rules and policies, 58 percent agreed with the constructive rules for student conduct. Sixty-four percent agreed that academic probation and dismissal rules were sensible, and 56 percent agreed that disciplinary procedures and policies were fair. Similar affirmative responses on the national survey in the respective categories received only 23 percent, 49 percent and 24 percent ratings.

Cultural programs, recreational facilities and social programs were among the non-academic programs which received more than majority approval from the students.

Student ratings of instructors were equal to or significantly higher than national norms for 13 of the 14 factors evaluated. Harding students indicated that a majority of instructors give students ample opportunity to participate in discussions and ask questions, give interesting and enthusiastic lectures, are confident, treat students with respect, give organized and thoughtful treatment at lectures, are concerned that students learn the material, give reasonable out-of-class assignments, emphasize major ideas as opposed to less important details, and are basically "in touch" with student life.

To measure student opinion regarding experiences unique to Harding, the faculty committee administered 23 questions especially relevant to the college. Eighty-

seven percent of the students polled indicated they understood the goals and purpose of Harding College and that they believed the college is achieving these objectives. A substantial majority of students also believe the spiritual needs of students are being met, believe Bible classes are meeting student needs, and believe the spiritual emphasis on campus is centered on the weightier issues of man's spiritual needs. Ninety-five percent of Harding's students believe the administration and faculty set the proper spiritual example for students to follow.

Harding students assigned above average importance to 10 of the 12 selected activities as they affect their personal development of a Christian philosophy of life. In order of importance assigned by students, the following activities were rated as very important by at least a majority of students: college worship services, relationships with other students, church Bible classes, Harding academic classes, relationships with faculty members, chapel, social clubs, relationships with administrators, and religious organizations.

Members of the faculty committee who administered and evaluated the survey were Dr. David Burks, assistant professor of business; Dr. Jerome Barnes, associate professor of education; Dr. Faye Doran, assistant professor of art; Virgil Lawyer, associate professor of history; Lew Moore, assistant professor of psychology; Dr. Nyal Royse, professor of education; Dr. Bill Verkler, professor of sociology; and Mrs. Beth Wilson, assistant professor of home economics.

Commenting on the results of the survey, Dr. Burks, chairman of the committee, said, "The overwhelming positive response toward the college in the survey is indicative of the school's success in achieving its goals. Examining the response of Harding students in comparison to national norms reveals a significantly more positive attitude by students toward Harding than the attitude expressed by students at other private educational institutions."

He went on to point out the value the students have placed on a Christian education at Harding. "The statistic that 94 percent of the students are satisfied with Harding is very encouraging, but the basic fact which causes that response is the students' belief in Harding's Christian education experience. The far more significant statistic is that 87 percent of the students understand the goals of Harding and believe it is achieving its objectives.

"An educational institution is evaluated on the basis of the caliber of its students and the students' response to that educational institution. This survey clearly reveals that these (students) who are most closely involved in Christian education at Harding overwhelmingly believe in the college and the way in which they are being taught to serve God more effectively," said Dr. Burks.

Cage Team Begins Season With Early Surge

Harding's basketball team has jumped off to its best start in recent years by posting an early 5-1 record in intersectional play.

Coach Jess Bucy's Bisons, who posted a 15-13 record last year, are considered to be a darkhorse challenger for the 1974-75 Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference Crown.

With All-AIC and All-District sophomore Butch Gardner setting the scoring pace at 19.8 ppg., the Bisons have posted five consecutive victories after an opening game loss to David Lipscomb by a 59-45 count.

In a return match Harding defeated Lipscomb 85-83. Other victories have come over Trevecca Nazarene College, Baptist Bible College (two) and Evangel College.

"The season's still very young and we don't think we've really been tested thoroughly," Bucy stated. "We're pleased by the best team depth we've had in some time and are extremely optimistic about the season."

Bucy's optimism was tempered by an injury to senior guard Tim Vick of Valdosta, Ga. In the second game with Lipscomb, Vick severely injured his ankle and will be lost to the team for at least six weeks. The Bison team captain, Vick averaged 13.9 ppg. last year and has scored 1159 points in his

At the time of his injury Vick was averaging 13.4 ppg. and his loss will be crucial to Bison title hopes. Junior Gary Baker, a 6-8 forward from San Diego, is

carrying a 12.6 average and Tony Sneed, a junior from Memphis is scoring at an 8.0 ppg. clip.

Teamwise the Bisons are shooting a torrid .511 from the field. Through six games the Bisons are averaging 83.3 ppg. while limiting the opposition to only 68.8 ppg.

Three Bison Football Players Receive Conference Honors

Harding closed out the 1974 grid season with a rain-soaked 7-7 tie with State College of Arkansas as the Bisons posted a 5-4-1 season mark and finished third in the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference race.

Three Bisons, defensive tackle Barney Crawford of Mountain Home, receiver Jack Barber of Fort Myers, Fla., and linebacker Bubba Hopkins of Fitzgerald, Ga., were named to the All-AIC team as selected by the conference

In addition, that trio, along with split end Perry Brown of Maud, Tex., guard Jerry Chism of Childress, Tex. and defensive back Rock Long of Pascagoula, Miss., were named to the All-AIC team as selected by the Arkansas Democrat.

Crawford, Barber and Hopkins also were first team selections on the NAIA District 17 All-Star team.

"We're especially proud of the recognition of our athletes," Bison head coach John Prock stated. "They did an excellent job for us."

Throughout the season the Bisons were hampered by injuries to key personnel. They opened with successive victories over Northwest Missouri and Northeast Missouri but lost in a lastminute pass to Northwest Oklahoma State. Injuries began to take their toll and the Bisons dropped consecutive games to fourth-ranked Henderson State, Ouachita Baptist and Texas

In the season's final games the Bisons defeated Southern State and the University of Arkansas at Monticello before the headlock with State College in the finale.


"The way the boys fought back is a real tribute to the caliber of men we have in our team," Prock explained. "They kept coming back with good efforts and we came through the last third of our schedule without a loss."

Perry Brown, the junior receiver, won the conference pass receiving title by catching 28 passes for 296 yards. Barber was runnerup with 20 catches for 311 yards.


Quarterback Jeff Smith was runnerup in the league passing category with 60 completions in 136 attempts, good for 659 yards.

Harding defensive back Rock Long established a school record for career interceptions when he grabbed his fourth interception of the season against Texas Lutheran.

A senior co-captain, Long intercepted 11 passes since moving to the defensive secondary in his sophomore year. The old record was jointly held by Ron Rubio (1965-68) and Mike Conley (1968-70).




Tony Sneed goes up and over a David Lipscomb player to score two points after stealing the ball from the unwary opponent.
