Slate Appointed Dean Of University Division

Dr. Philip Slate, dean of the Graduate School of Religion in Memphis since June, 1986, has been appointed by President David Burks as dean of the newly-formed College of Bible and Religion. The appointment is effective June 1.

"Dr. Slate is especially well qualified to direct the College of Bible and Religion. He has experience in teaching, research, preaching and missions," said Burks. "I believe he brings to this position exactly the kind of experience we need in this most important position of leadership on the Harding campus."

The creation of the College of Bible and Religion integrates Harding's undergraduate and graduate Bible programs into a single administrative area. As dean, Slate will direct the \$2 million annual budget program that encompasses the training of 133 undergraduate Bible majors, 161 graduate students and 38 students in the School of Biblical Studies, as well as biblical instruction for the entire student body.

"I'm awed by the challenges before me, but I'm accepting the challenges because of the tremendous potential for service that I see in Harding's Bible program," Slate said.

"I have always been impressed with Harding's emphasis on preaching and missions. I'm pleased that Dr. Burks is giving me the freedom to develop an even greater emphasis in these two areas."

A 1957 graduate of David Lipscomb College, Slate holds the M.A. from the Harding Graduate School of Religion and the doctor of missiology from Fuller Theological Seminary. He has done special studies at London Bible College and Oxford University in England.

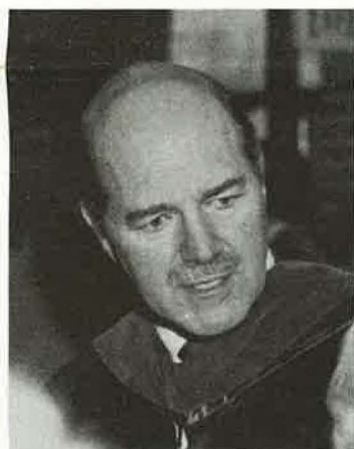
In addition to 10 years of evangelistic work in England, he has served as minister for churches in Nashville and Memphis,

Tenn., Wichita, Kan., and both London and Oxford, England.

A member of the Graduate School faculty since 1972, Slate will spend a minimum of one day each week in Memphis, teaching and assisting in the administration of the campus program. He is a professor of homiletics and missiology.

As dean of the College of Bible and Religion, Slate will supervise all aspects of Harding's Bible program, including the annual Bible Lectureship, the 13-in-1 summer workshops and the Mission/Prepare program.

Slate and his wife, the former Patricia Finch, have a son, Carl Philip, and two daughters, Karen Slate Guinn of Paris, Tenn., and Carla Slate Greenwood of Memphis.

Heritage Cafeteria Being Renovated To Accommodate Large Student Body

Choice and variety will be the key concepts for the new American Heritage Cafeteria when it opens for the fall semester following a \$900,000 renovation this summer.

Since 1965, the Heritage has been one of two cafeterias on campus, with a combined seating capacity of 700. With the closing of Pattie Cobb cafeteria for renovation into residence hall rooms, the Heritage cafeteria is expanding to take up the slack.

Temporary eating arrangements were made at Olen Hendrix to serve up to 250 students for lunch and

supper meals this spring. The Heritage addition began in March, with renovation of the original facility to begin in May.

When it opens this fall, the new cafeteria will boast 10 serving lines for quick service and a variety of choices for every food taste. At capacity, it will also have enough room to seat 1,100 students.

"Since all the students will be eating in the same cafeteria, it will create a camaraderie like we had in the old days when Pattie Cobb was the only cafeteria," said President David Burks.

The major consideration in making this change was efficiency. "By expanding the Heritage cafeteria, we are being more efficient than when we operated both cafeterias," Dr. Burks said. "We will be able to cut back the staff needed and the area necessary for food preparation and still serve more people."

Another important concept in the renovation is what Dr. Burks refers to as "de-institutionalizing of the dining hall." Plans are to replace the "stainless steel environment" with a more appropriate, modern

Pryor Scholarship Fund Will Assist Students

In honor of their influence and dedication to Harding University, Dr. David Burks has announced the establishment of the Dr. Joe and Bessie Mae Pryor Endowed Scholarship Fund.

"This fund will perpetuate their efforts and help more young people share in the Harding experience that the Pryors have invested their lives to provide for so many," Burks said.

"Few couples have touched the lives of so many young people as Dr. Joe and Bessie Mae Pryor. As a result, their 'family' spans the globe... For some 44 years, the Pryors have been heart and soul of campus activities that drew us

together. We all have our own reflections on their meaning to us," he added.

Dr. and Mrs. Joseph E. Pryor were married Aug. 16, 1946, in the reception room of Godden Hall on the Harding campus. Since that time, they have relentlessly served Harding in many ways.

Dr. Joe had already been teaching for three years in 1946. He became dean of the college in 1960 and was named vice president for academic affairs in 1972. He sponsored the *Petit Jean* yearbook for 43 years, taught physical science for 45 years and sponsored TNT social club since 1945.

Ganus Endowment Surpasses Goal

The Clifton L. and Louise Ganus Endowed Scholarship Fund has surpassed the \$1 million goal set when the fund was initiated in May, 1986.

To date the fund has received \$1,007,010 in gifts and pledges from more than 3,000 individuals, businesses and corporations.

The fund was begun on May 9, 1986, when Harding's Board of Trustees announced the creation of a \$1 million scholarship fund to honor Dr. and Mrs. Ganus. Ganus retired as president on May 10, 1987, and became the institution's first chancellor.

The Ganus Scholarship Fund is the largest en-

dowed scholarship fund in Harding's 64-year history. Interest earned on the principal of the fund will annually provide scholarship assistance to at least 100 students.

"We are extremely happy that the \$1 million goal has been reached. This scholarship fund is a significant way of honoring two individuals who have given more than 40 years of service to the school," said Floyd Daniel, vice president for university relations.

Daniel indicated efforts will continue to secure additional gifts for the scholarship fund. "Just because we've reached our initial goal is not an indication that this pro-

ject is completed," he said.

"Gifts can still be made to the fund. The Board did not set a limit on the Ganus Scholarship Fund. We would like for it to reach \$1.5 million or even \$2 million.

"Contributing to a fund that enables more students to attend Harding is one of the best ways I know to honor Cliff and Louise."

Harding experienced an unparalleled growth during the Ganus presidency. The enrollment grew from 1,472 to a peak enrollment of 3,084. Also during his presidency, more than \$35 million was raised in gifts and grants for capital and operational needs of Harding.

atmosphere.

"We will have tables of varying sizes and shapes to accommodate everyone's tastes," Dr. Burks said. "We will also change the lighting and decor and play soft background music. These changes should help to make the cafeteria more homey," he said.

To cut down on the noise level in the cafeteria, the large facility can be broken up into smaller sections through the use of operable walls. This versatility will allow for private banquet facilities as well.

Auditions will be held June 6 for "Curious Savage" and "Snoopy." "We Must Kill Toni" auditions will be July 11.

Tickets will be sold for \$10 per person. Discounts are offered for season tickets. Further information is available from the Department of Communication.

Many changes were implemented in Harding's food service when ARA Services was commissioned to supervise the program last fall. Students already have Mexican food, Italian food, sandwiches, hamburgers and cafe specialties from which to choose. A single meal price covers all charges for food and drink in the "all-you-can-eat" format.

Changes will continue to be made as Charles Liming, food services director, evaluates suggestions from students and ideas from other food services. "We plan a Treat Yourself Right Center next year for those who want a low-calorie, nutritious diet," he said.

Variety and choice are definitely in Dr. Burks' plans for the Heritage expansion. "Changes are sometimes painful, but it's something we have to adjust to. In this case, the rewards for adjusting should be well worth it!"

Searcy Summer Dinner Theater Announces Schedule for Summer of '88

Searcy Summer Dinner Theatre presentations have proved to be a popular entertainment medium for many in the community and for students in summer school. This year's slate of plays promise to maintain the program's popularity.

Scheduled for June 23-25 is "Curious Savage," followed by "Snoopy" July 7-9 and "We Must Kill Toni" July 28-30.

The plays are presented in Hammon Student Center on a stage specially designed to accommodate the limited area. Performances

follow a three-course dinner, served by members of the cast.

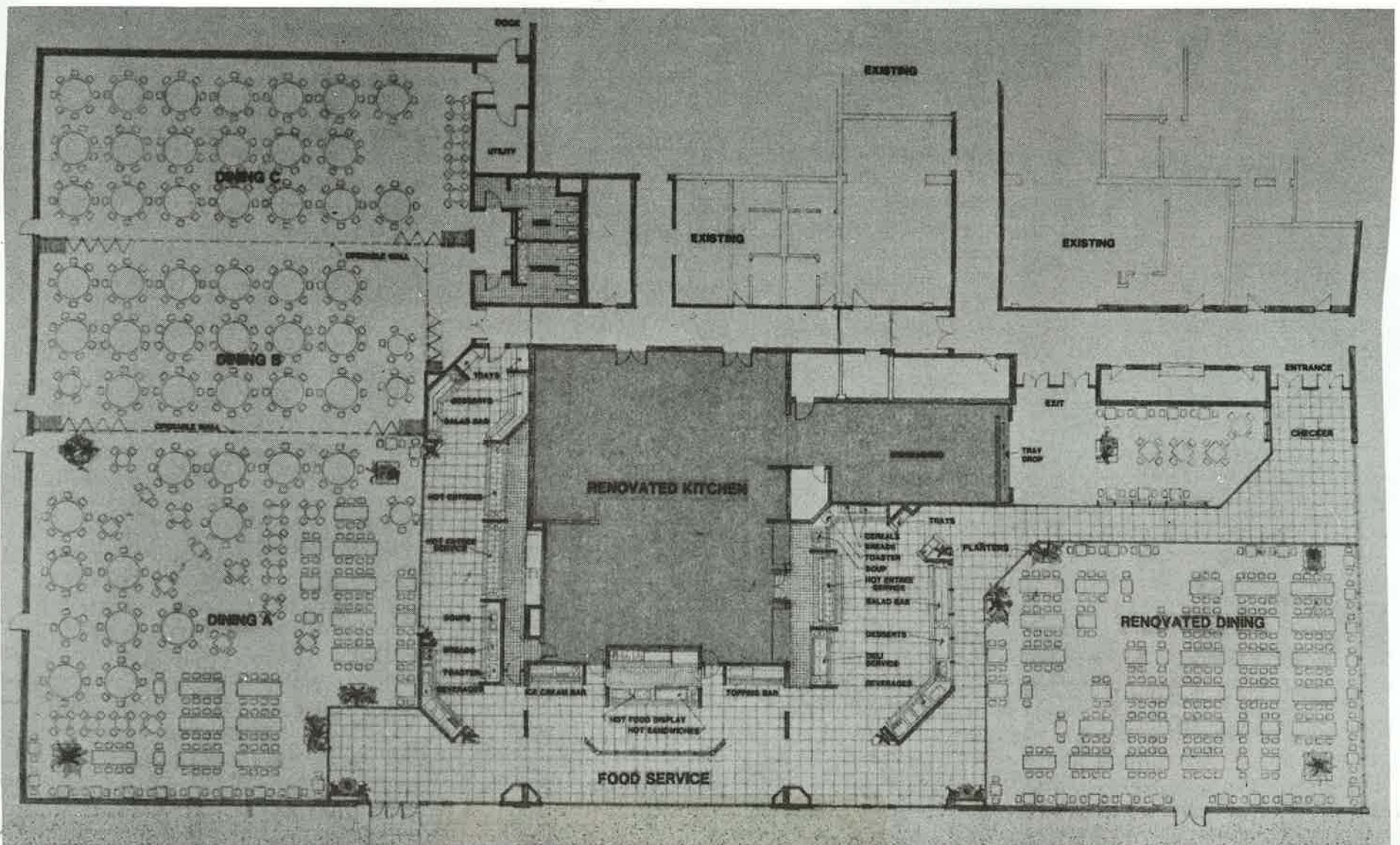

Alumni Return for Pattie Cobb's Last Meal

A special meal, complete with attendance certificates and reminiscences of the past, marked the end of the 54-year reign of Pattie Cobb cafeteria Jan. 31. Having prepared more than 35,400 meals since its opening in 1934, Pattie Cobb cafeteria closed its doors forever.

For more than five decades, the small, rectangular dining hall had served the student body and the community. Located in the bottom floor of the Pattie Cobb dormitory, the cafeteria could serve 300 students at once and had an enclosed dining room for special parties and banquets. The special dining room once served as a student center where students could check their mail, socialize and eat at the snack bar.

With 650 students enrolled, Harding opened a new, larger student center in the newly-built Ganus Building in 1951. Chancellor Clifton L. Ganus, Jr., a student from 1939-1943, has fond memories of the Pattie Cobb student center. "On alternating Saturday nights, Pattie Cobb was a dating place. We could go to the student center and play cards and board games with our dates. It was a special time because we didn't have a chance to date like the students do today."

The small room will be retained as a special meeting place with Pattie Cobb memorabilia in its decor when the entire dormitory is renovated for use as a women's residence hall this summer. "The outside entrance will make it the perfect place to have this special room of memories," President David Burks said.

With or without a "memory room," Pattie Cobb's years of service as a cafeteria have left numerous memories in the minds of those who ate there daily.

Cobbers will always remember the "saints and sinners" sides of the cafeteria. The saints' side was on the right (north) side of the cafeteria, and in that line one of the men students was asked to lead prayer about every 15 minutes. The sinners, of course, sat on the left side.

Another unforgettable memory was the "fill-up-the-next-table rule." Instead of receiving your food and choosing a desired seat, a hostess would seat you in the next available seat in a certain order. This meant that you could often get

separated from your friends and be seated with people you might not even know. The obvious purpose was to force you to meet new people, but students had various ways of getting around the rule.

Dwight Smith, a student in the class of 1959, recalled how 12 of his friends would steal chairs from other tables and all sit at a six-person table. If the manager started approaching their table, they would quickly grab hands and bow their heads as if they were praying. They would stay this way until she returned to the kitchen and then they would finish their meal. It was a creative method to dodge the rule (though perhaps sacreligious), but it was nevertheless effective.

Others, such as President Burks, used a more common tactic. "Sometimes we would just count back in line to determine what order to be in, or we could occasionally bribe the hostess and she would seat us together," he said.

Still others recalled different aspects of Pattie Cobb life. Bessie Mae Pryor remembers when they ate "country style." "Sometimes they would put all the food on the table and we would pass it. Other times, we would go through the line and get our meat and vegetables and the extras would be on the table. We were served milk by a hostess who would also bring our cornbread or tea when we held up our fingers: one for cornbread and two for tea," she said. "All of this personal service made Pattie Cobb a very homey place to eat."

Maybe *homey* is the key word for Pattie Cobb. In the past few years, students

have enjoyed talent nights, special meals and candlelight dinners, all giving Pattie Cobb that homey atmosphere.

For Dr. George Benson, president emeritus, Pattie Cobb was homey because of the four years that his family lived in an apartment there and ate all their meals in the Cobb cafeteria. But for most students, Pattie Cobb was home because of the camaraderie that developed. "It was such a small cafeteria and since we all ate in one place, we

developed a special bond," Dr. Burks said.

Despite the good memories which Pattie Cobb initiated, Dr. Burks felt it was time for a change. "The time had come when operating two cafeterias was no longer efficient. Last semester we had the smallest number of students ever to eat in Pattie Cobb — just under 300. Also, the facility was so old and so outdated that it would cost comparably more to bring it up to the acceptable standards than to

just build a larger Heritage cafeteria," he said.

Pattie Cobb is being renovated to include residences for 140 women students on the three floors of the existing building. The exterior will be restored to appear the way it did in 1934 when Harding moved to the Searcy campus from Morrilton. Interior changes will include new plumbing with bathrooms between suites, central air conditioning and new furnishings. After the renovation, Pattie Cobb is expected to be "the dorm of choice for women." The renovation project is scheduled to be completed by the fall semester this year.

Pattie Cobb cafeteria is perhaps lacking in sentimentality on the part of present students, but the hundreds of alumni who came to share in its last meal attest to its place in the hearts of many who attended Harding in the past. Life does go on, but memories of "the way we were" linger.

One of the most familiar settings in which students have found Dr. Joe is the scorer's table at Bison basketball games. Dressed in his striped official's shirt, Dr. Joe has been basketball scorekeeper, as well as football clockkeeper, for many years. He also served as faculty representative to the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference.

Dr. Joe has been famous with the Harding family for many years, but he has single-handedly brought fame to the wearing of a bow tie, a practice which he began in 1953.

In 1947, the Regina women's social club was formed and Bessie Mae Pryor became their sponsor. "After 40 years, Bessie Mae and Regina are part of the same breath. And she has been just as busy in other activities," Dr. Burks said.

Bessie Mae was a charter member of the Associated Women for Harding in 1965 and she has provided active leadership in that organization through the years. She has directed hundreds of weddings for Harding students and even taught

home economics for a while.

The Pryors' home, which has been in or near campus activity all these years, has been a haven of love and hospitality for those students who dropped in. "Her home has always been accessible and open around the clock, but mostly it was the gracious warmth and charm of Bessie Mae that beckoned our Harding fami-

ly into the Pryor living room and kitchen," Dr. Burks said.

Dr. Joe and Bessie Mae Pryor will be honored at a reception during Homecoming '88. Contributions to Harding's endowment in their honor will serve as a lasting tribute to the lives of a couple whose names have been synonymous with the spirit of Harding for more than 40 years.

American Studies Students To Tour Nation's Capital

Fifty-five Harding juniors and seniors will tour points of interest in and around the nation's capital April 8-16. A part of the American Studies Program, this tour annually takes students to cities where they can meet business leaders, government officials and educators.

Marketing Team Places Second In Southern Region Competition

The Marketing Strategy Case team from Harding University claimed the runnerup position behind Auburn University in Southern Region competition at Memphis State University Feb. 27.

Four senior marketing majors — Kiwanis Harvey of St. Petersburg Fla.; Sara Butler of Flint, Mich.; Salena Davis of Chattanooga, Tenn., and Brian Price of Tusculumbia, Ala. — won over Wake-Forest and Texas Lutheran in the competition which was sponsored by the American Marketing Association.

The team's marketing strategy was developed for the American Red Cross and included a written case and an oral presentation.

"The judges were complimentary of the professionalism of the students," said Charles Walker, faculty

advisor. "We were pleased with the performance of the team and felt that the group competed well, despite the loss by a narrow margin."

Harding's strategy included both cause-related and affinity marketing plans. Cause-related strategies for quick-service restaurants, gasoline service stations, hotels and theme parks were detailed. Affinity credit cards in which the Red Cross would receive

revenues for card applications and usage on credit cards that would bear the Red Cross logo and name were also described. The presentation included both a slide show and transparencies.

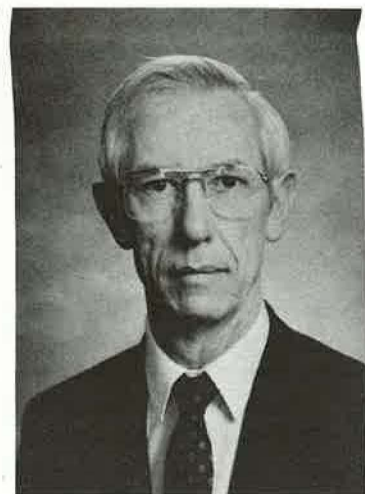
This was the second year for marketing case competitions through the American Marketing Association, the largest professional marketing organization in the world. James Ferguson also served as sponsor.

England Chosen to Head Department of Physical Science

Dr. Don England, three-time winner of the Distinguished Teacher Award, has been appointed chairman of the Department of Physical Science. The appointment will be effective Aug. 15 when Dr. W. D. Williams, chairman since 1963, steps down to pursue full-time teaching in the department.

Dr. Dean Priest, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, said, "Professor England's knowledge and expertise are well established. As chairman of Harding's Health Science Advisory Committee for the past 21 years, he has been largely responsible for the high rate of acceptance of Harding graduates into medical and dental school throughout the United States. Harding is fortunate to have a man of his caliber to lead the undergraduate program in the physical sciences."

Dr. England, who has been a member of the Harding faculty since 1960, holds the Ph.D. in medicinal chemistry from the University of Mississippi. A member of the Arkansas Academy of Science, he is co-sponsor of the Arkansas Collegiate Academy. He is the past chairman of the Central Arkansas section of

Society and he holds memberships in a number of professional societies. Having won the Distinguished Teacher Award the maximum number of times, he has been designated as a Distinguished Professor — the only such distinction at the university.

A folk music enthusiast, England often performs on his handcrafted dulcimer for concerts on campus and in the area. He is also a wood carver and his crafts have been shown in art exhibits.

Mrs. England is the former Lynn Alexander, an alumna who is an assistant professor of home economics. They have two children, Donna, a junior at the university, and Mark, a senior at the Academy.

England also serves as an elder at the College Church of Christ.

anxiety and its long-lasting effects is not always consistent with the seriousness of the child's illness or the length of the hospital stay." Child Life programs deal in training of such matters and the number of Child Life Specialists employed in outpatient facilities is increasing.

Annual Youth Citizenship Seminar Schedules 32nd Edition for June 12-17

Each year, Harding University hosts a Youth Citizenship Seminar which is designed to help hundreds of high school juniors and seniors to learn more about democracy, free enterprise and the American way of life. The 32nd edition of this seminar will be June 12-17.

Sponsored by Civitan clubs, Kiwanis clubs, Lions clubs, Arkansas and Tennessee Farm Bureaus and the university's American Studies Program, the seminar has a two-fold purpose. "The program is designed to inform the young people about our

country's heritage and goals and to encourage them to take active roles as citizens and leaders in their communities," said Dr. Bob Reely, director.

A primary part of the program involves numerous speakers whose experiences portray the principles of democracy and Americanism. Included have been Oddvar Berg, former missionary in the Belgian Congo; Col. Joseph E. Hickox, former attache to the U.S. Embassy in Moscow; Eldridge Cleaver, former Black Panther activist; Charles Plumb, former prisoner of war in

Vietnam; Jeremiah Denton, U.S. senator from Alabama; and Danny White, professional football player and active participant in community affairs. Harding University Chancellor Clifton L. Ganus, Jr., is also a featured speaker.

Students from Arkansas, Missouri, Alabama, Florida and Tennessee spend the week in various activities and projects in addition to the lectures. A formal banquet closes the week's schedule as students display their talents and make presentations of what they have learned during the seminar.

QUESTION: What about Searcy as a place to go to college?

ANSWER: Searcy is a small town (about 15,000 residents); in fact, many of our nation's most prestigious institutions are also in small towns. Searcy is located at the foothills of the gorgeous Ozark Mountains. Within just a few miles of the campus are some beautiful hiking trails, parks and sparkling rivers. The Buffalo National River, a short distance from Searcy, is visited by many student groups during the year for float trips. Some of the sites on the river rank among the nation's most scenic. Then, of course, if someone wants to visit a large metropolitan area, Little Rock (the state's capital) is less than an hour away.

QUESTION: How does Harding's cost compare to other private and even public colleges and universities?

ANSWER: Harding, compared to other private schools, is very reasonably priced — a little more than some and less than many. If you look at public colleges and universities, Harding would be somewhat more expensive. Because Harding is a private university, the institution is not subsidized by the state — so a student must bear more of the cost. Tuition, fees, and room and board at Harding total about \$6,000 per year. The tuition, fees, and room and board cost range for most private schools is \$5,000 - \$15,000 per year, so you can see Harding is relatively economical. At most state institutions, those same fees run \$3,000 - \$8,000 per year. For the money, Harding is a great value.

QUESTION: Is financial assistance available to students at Harding University?

ANSWER: Absolutely. Harding has an outstanding financial assistance program for students. Students who have a strong academic record in high school usually qualify for an academic scholarship. Students who demonstrate a financial need have access to an extensive array of loans, grants and work opportunities available.

A word about scholarships. Some students are disappointed when Harding cannot match another institution's offer to them. Be careful — because many schools will give students nice scholarship offers but cannot offer them the preparation they need for their career after college. Although not always the case, colleges and universities which lack a strong academic standing are often the most generous with scholarship funds.

Dr. Don Diffine (economics) attended a symposium in Washington, D.C. in March, hosted by the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge, Pa. Guests included recipients of the Leavey Award for Excellence in Private Enterprise Education, an award which he received in 1980. The theme of the symposium was "Non-Traditional Approaches to Teaching Private Enterprise."

Jeanine Peck (education) conducted a workshop for the Wilbur Mills educational co-op Feb. 27. Entitled "Let's Make Reading Functional," the workshop was attended by teachers of seventh and eighth grade students.

Finley Returns to High School Classroom

Dr. Lewis "Tony" Finley, assistant professor of education, recently got an unsolicited, but welcome refresher course.

During February and March, Finley taught at Judsonia High School, filling the junior and senior high science classes while the regular teacher was on maternity leave.

The assignment proved to be fulfilling from several standpoints. Judsonia principal Gene Sledge was pleased to have a well-qualified college professor fill the gap, and the professor was grateful for the opportunity to be in the high school classroom.

"I was concerned about finding someone who could pick up the reins so that the students wouldn't get behind on anything," Sledge said. "Dr. Finley stepped in and we had no problems. He's an excellent teacher and it's been a pleasure working with him."

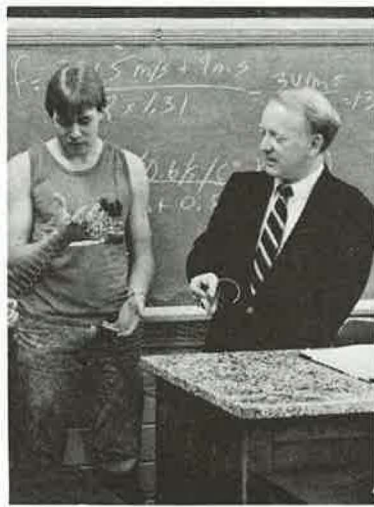
Finley had 20 years' experience on the high school level, both in classroom teaching and in administration at DeQueen and Hard-

ing Academy before he joined the university faculty in 1984. The university's accredited School of Education is diligent in seeking ways to prepare education majors for the classroom, and Finley seized the opportunity to relate theory with the practical.

"There is a big push for NCATE (the university's accrediting agency) to have professors get into the classroom," he said, because there have been many changes in requirements for standards, especially in the area of science. This is the first time, as far as Finley knows, that a college-level teacher has had such an experience in this area.

Dr. Bobby Coker, dean of the School of Education, said the arrangement required some shuffling of Finley's assignments, but added, "We were happy to accommodate, for this is a great opportunity. We're pleased Dr. Finley was willing to do it."

Finley drove to Judsonia early each day, taught earth science, physical science, physics and chemistry. By 2:00 p.m. he was back on

campus to supervise the 97 education majors who are student teaching this semester. That left late afternoon hours to begin preparation for the next day.

"It made for a full day," Finley says, admitting that he had forgotten how much preparation time is required. "I have a renewed appreciation for other teachers," he said.

As for the actual work, Finley enjoyed the teaching time with the prepsters. "It was a rewarding experience," he said. "I hope others will have opportunity for a similar experience."

Harding's School of Education has a unique responsibility — teaching students how to teach students. The program involves both undergraduate and graduate programs for elementary and secondary certification.

Courses which include everything from reading to psychology and from audiovisual aids to art culminate with the "block." Taken during the first half of the stu-

dent teaching semester, the block provides opportunity for student teachers to interact in relating content in classroom management, instructional strategies and other learning situations which they will encounter in the classroom.

"Our preparation was great," said Laura White, senior from Pasadena, Texas, who is student teaching at Sidney Deener this semester. "Especially in the

Award-Winning Teacher Enjoys Her Work with Students

"We are going to begin a story.... Jeff, sit down, please.... We do not need pencils; be in your seats.... Why is it important to read the introduction?.... I want you on target.... They got a picture of me getting on to you.... Row one, line up — quietly...."

Typical one-liners in the life of a schoolteacher? For Kinsey Smedley, yes!

Imagine having 24 students ranging in ability from exceptional IQ to handicapped all in the same

classroom. Imagine having all these students working successfully at their own levels of ability. Imagine two reading groups working simultaneously, one directed by the teacher and the other working quietly at their seats.

That's Mrs. Smedley's fourth grade class at Watson Elementary School in the Little Rock School District.

A 1985 graduate of Harding's School of Education, Kinsey Butler Smedley was one of 100 first-year

teachers nationwide to receive \$1,000 awards as outstanding new teachers in 1985-86. She was nominated by the school district through written evaluation of the school principal.

"Classroom discipline really came naturally for me. My teachers at Harding were well disciplined and expected a lot from us ... and I started out expecting a lot from my students."

"I was teaching second grade then and was recognized primarily because of good discipline in the classroom," she said. "It really came naturally for me. My teachers at Harding were well disciplined and expected a lot from us (at times I thought too much), and I just started out expecting a lot from my students."

Kinsey uses bulletin boards, science projects and art lessons which she prepared for classes and student teaching aids while at Harding. "We had to produce so much, but all of it has been extremely helpful in my classroom."

One of Kinsey's most obvious characteristics in the classroom is her openness. "I call parents frequently to

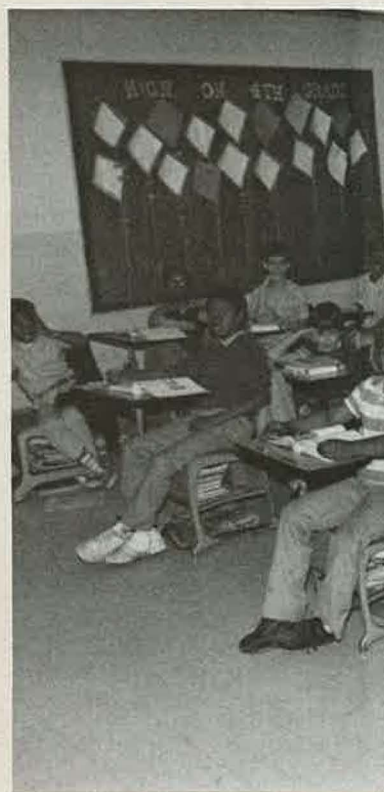
let them know how things are going. I think when you're honest and have nothing to hide, you have a much better working relationship with students and their parents," she said.

Watson Elementary is one

of four schools in the district that are considered *literature* schools. "We teach reading through literature and do lots of writing," she explained. "Harding's stress on language arts was a real plus in preparation to teach this way."

Kinsey cited her experience at Harding University in Florence as an important background for her work in teaching. "Although it was not directly related to the education program, my travel experiences in HUF have been invaluable in teaching about other nations. My students are also impressed with personal examples of people from all over the world that I knew while I was in college," she said.

One of the fourth grade classes Kinsey Smedley.

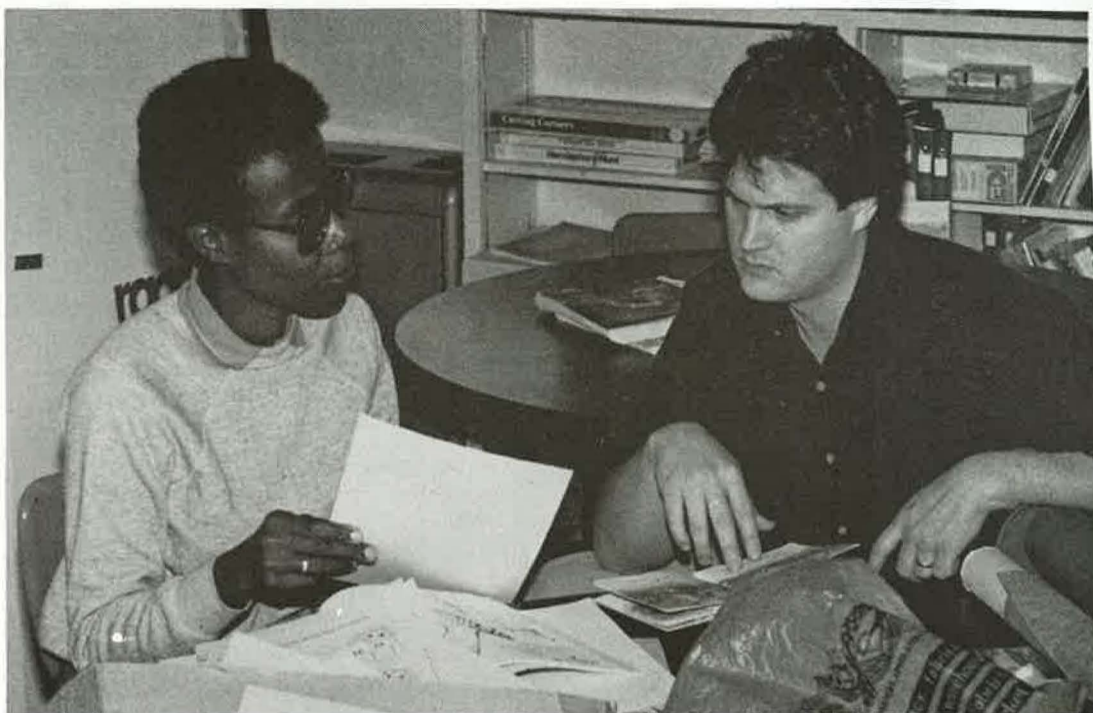
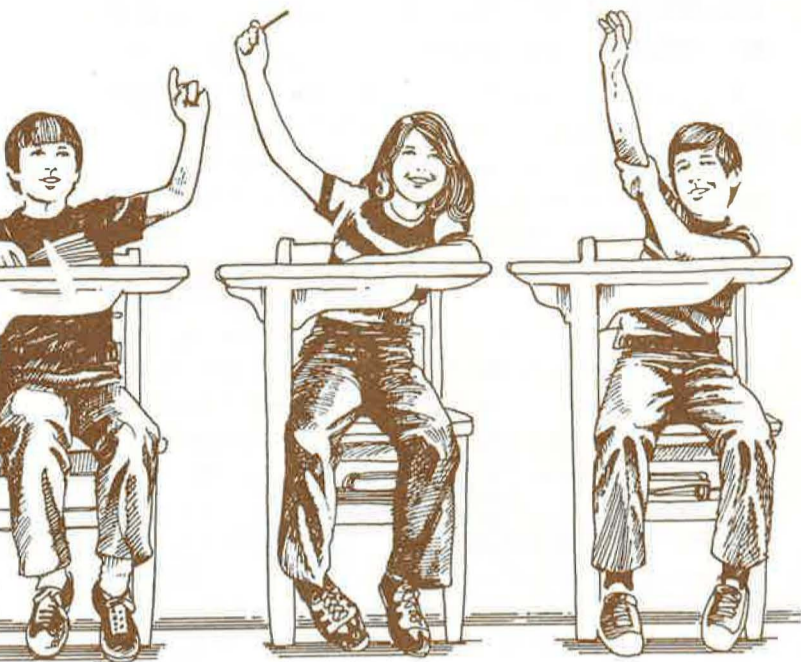
thusiasm in the classroom give the impression that Kinsey was born a teacher. Quite the contrary, she did not decide to teach until her junior year in college.

"I was an audiology/speech pathology major, but Harding did not have all that I needed to take. So, I changed my major because I wanted to stay at Harding to graduate," she said.

"It was an easy transition — most of my hours were applicable to education.

Education Prepares Classroom Teachers

block, we learned to work together patiently and to develop the perseverance required to finish the jobs we start."

Kelly Fuchs, a student teacher at Searcy's McRae Elementary from Yucaipa, Calif., agrees. "We were very well prepared for our teaching careers in Harding's education program. As a special education major, I was particularly impressed with the preparation

I got from the course in behavioral management. It always helps in teaching to know how to deal with student behavior."

Harding's teacher education program is not only structured to meet the needs of students preparing to teach, but also to assist experienced teachers who need additional preparation. Undergraduate elementary preparation is for teaching kindergarten, grades one

through eight or special education.

Secondary teachers are prepared to teach in the fields of art, biology, business, chemistry, driver's education, English, French, general science, health education, home economics, journalism, mathematics, music, physical education, physics, social science, Spanish and speech. Students may also be certified to teach in middle school and in speech therapy.

About one-third of those who graduate certify to teach. Many students, both full-time and part-time, are in the graduate program, working toward the Master of Education degree.

The undergraduate teacher education program is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE).

National Teachers Examination

Harding University requires all students to pass the National Teachers Examination in their teaching specialties to qualify for teacher certification. Harding's record for passage of the NTE by teacher education graduates has been exceptional.

In the last two years, Harding graduates who took the exam and passed has been 100 percent and 99 percent, respectively.

Since educational standards for the state of Arkansas were revised in 1983, prospective teachers are required by the School of Education to have a 2.50 grade point average overall and to take a pre-professional skills test before admission to the teacher education program. Student teachers must also have a cumulative average of 2.50 in their major subject before they do student teaching.

Alumni and Friends Network

Dr. Bobby Coker, dean of the School of Education, has expressed Harding's commitment to progress in teacher education. "We want to keep our student programs current and relevant, and we want to help our alumni and friends in education to be informed about trends in the profession," he said.

One of the means to accomplish this commitment is the recent formation of an education network. Designed to enlist Christian alumni and friends in education into a network with the School of Education, the program will help to funnel information about the impact of specific trends in the field. In turn, the network will assist Harding in staying up-to-date in its preparation of teachers.

The network, a professional resource, communication and support partnership for Harding alumni and friends who have an in-

terest in education, has the potential of becoming a nationwide resource. As Harding's School of Education serves the entry level needs of new teachers, the network will provide the vehicle for satisfying the professional needs of practitioners in the field.

Coker Appointed to NCATE Board

Dr. Coker's expertise in professional education, teaching, research and evaluation earned him an appointment recently to the NCATE Board of Directors.

He is one of 70 professionals on a 250-member national board. Directors were selected through a discriminating process which identified individuals who are exceptionally qualified to make judgments about the quality of programs that prepare school personnel.

Acceptance of this appointment involves a three-year term which begins with a week-long training session this summer.

Christian Stewardship And Estate Planning

"Remainder Interest in a Personal Residence or Farm"

With respect to material possessions, life generally contains three phases: accumulation, maintenance and distribution. Generally, years of accumulation are essential to provide the necessities for the maintenance phase. The distribution phase often covers years of systematic planned gifts with the ultimate distribution of the entire estate taking place at death. Since Christians are managers of God's possessions, accumulation, maintenance and distribution of assets are spiritual decisions.

A home is a key asset in most estates. Though it takes a lifetime to purchase, it too will be distributed before or at the death of the owner. For those who have considered a gift of their home through their will to advance the Lord's kingdom, a very beneficial tax law encourages the gift of a remainder interest in a personal residence or farm by deed during life.

A gift of the remainder interest in a personal residence or farm is a simple transaction to complete and works this way. A lawyer prepares a deed wherein a residence or farm is conveyed to Harding. In that same deed, the owner retains the right to use the property for the rest of his life. Without any expenditure of cash or reduction of income, the donor will have made a very significant gift, and the Internal Revenue Service will allow him to take a large, charitable deduction against his income. Very few situations in life present such attractive benefits at little or no cost.

Perhaps an example would be helpful to explain this unique charitable estate planning tool. Suppose that Mr. Jones, who is 70 years old, owns a home worth \$100,000 which he wants Harding to have after he dies. He could leave it to Harding in his will and Harding would derive a great benefit. However, Mr. Jones could also receive a great benefit if he would transfer the house to Harding in a deed and reserve for himself the right to live in the house and use it for the rest of his life.

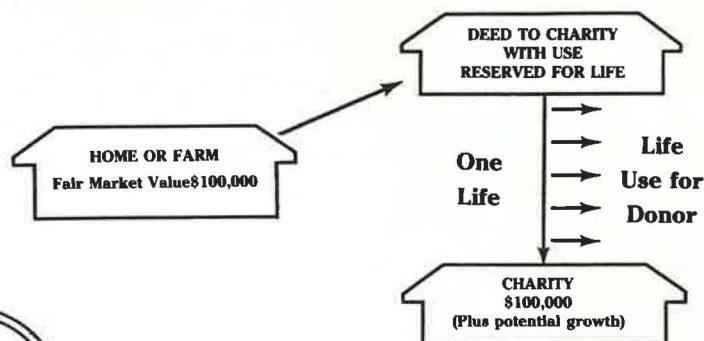
By conveying the property to Harding and retaining a life estate, Mr. Jones would be entitled to an income tax deduction of nearly \$34,000. This deduction could reduce Mr. Jones' income taxes and save as much as \$9,500.

For Mr. Jones, who plans to live in this house for the rest of his life and then donate it to Harding, the gift of his home with a retained life estate produces nothing but benefits. He continues to use the property just as he did before the gift. In addition, he receives a substantial savings in income taxes, a rare situation in life where "you can have your cake and eat it, too."

If Mr. Jones were married, he could retain the right to use the home for the rest of his life and for the duration of his wife's life as well. It is also interesting to note that the house need not be the donor's principal residence. It is necessary only that the property be a personal residence. Thus, a vacation home will qualify.

After carefully considering the excellent benefits from the gift of a home or farm, a number of Harding's friends have deeded their homes or farms to Harding and retained a life estate. The retained life estate is an exceptionally fine charitable estate planning tool.

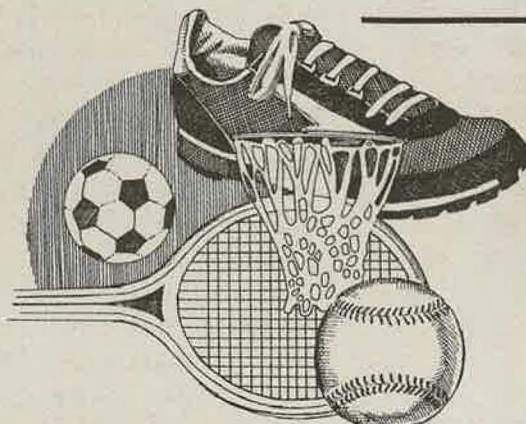

Roundballers End Regular Season With Six-Game Winning Streak

The Bison basketball team shook off a slow start by winning five of its final six games before losing a heartbreaking battle in the opening round of the NAIA District 17 tournament.

The defending District 17 champions fought through a strong Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference with a lineup that included just one senior and three sophomores in the starting five. In the end, the Bisons posted an 8-10 AIC record, good enough for sixth place, and a 13-15 overall mark.

"We had talent on the floor, but we were extremely young," head coach Jess Bucy said. "When you start three sophomores, you sometimes find it difficult to reach your expectations, especially on the road. We had very high goals for the season, but we couldn't overcome that youth."

It was in the opponent's home gym that the Bisons struggled the most. Excluding the late season flurry, the Bisons won only one AIC battle away from home, and only a total of five on the season. Two of the five wins in the year-ending rally were on the road.

Perhaps the most disturbing loss of all came in the District 17 tournament.

Seeded sixth in the eight-team bracket, the Bisons faced a University of the Ozarks squad that had riddled them in the schools' two previous meetings, 86-72 and 88-57. The Eagles were seeded third in the tourney and held the home court advantage in the game.

After trailing by six points at halftime, 35-29, Harding's men rallied in the second half to stay in contention. Sophomore guard Corey Camper of Brinkley, Ark., tied the game at 59-59 on a three-point shot with 14 seconds to play, only to see the Eagles' Roger Kendrick put his team ahead 61-59 on an off-balance 10-foot jumpshot with six seconds left.

Controversy marred the final moments when the timekeeper allowed the clock to expire after it appeared the Bisons had called a timeout with three seconds remaining. The officials agreed to put one second on the clock, and Camper threw a court-length pass to sophomore postman Rolando Garcia of Little Rock. Garcia's 30-foot desperation shot at the buzzer glanced off the rim, giving the Eagles the emotional win.

The sophomore trio of

Camper, Garcia and David James of St. Louis, Mo., were the Black and Gold's floor leaders. Garcia paced the team in scoring (14.63 points a game) and rebounding (7.3 per game). His 60 percent field goal efficiency led the conference, and he ranked fourth in rebounding.

Camper barely trailed Garcia in scoring, averaging 14.60 points, while James averaged 10.3 points a game. James was prolific from the free throw line and the field, shooting 54 and 78 percent, respectively, to rank among the league's top 10 in both categories.

Senior guard Tim Smallwood of Tulsa, Okla., and junior forward Carl Collins of Valley Springs, Ark., rounded out the Bisons' top five. Smallwood proved to be effective from the three-point circle, hitting 38 percent of his long-range shots. He averaged 9.8 points a game. Collins, who came on strong in the second half of the AIC round robin, averaged 5.8 points and 4.3 rebounds a game.

"We're definitely a team of the future. We'll return four starters plus a herd of very capable reserves next year," said Bucy. "I really feel the best is yet to come for us."

Harding's track and cross country coach Ted Lloyd has been named an assistant coach on the American team that will compete in the IAAF World Junior Track and Field Championships July 26-31 in Sudbury, Canada.

Lloyd, who is currently serving as president of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Coaches Association (NAIAC), will serve as an assistant under Guy Kochel, head track and field coach at Arkansas State University in Jonesboro. Also assisting Kochel will be Carl Wallin of Dartmouth College.

Three Bison tracksters earned NAIA All-American honors after finishing in the top six in their events in the 23rd annual NAIA Indoor Track and Field championship in Kansas City, Mo.

High jumpers Bill Baker of Mt. Dora, Fla., and James 'Te' Howard of Clyde, Texas, cleared 6-9 to tie for sixth place in their event. Also garnering the honor was freshman pole vaulter Jimmy Sloan of West Memphis, Ark., who vaulted to 13-8 for fifth place.

"All three of these men did outstanding jobs at the national meet," Bison track coach Ted Lloyd said. "Both Bill and Te were going against some very stiff competition, and they've been jumping close to each other all season. Jimmy vaulted his career best, which is what you want at the national meet. He has outstanding potential."

Several other Bison and Lady Bison performers also fared well at the national meet. Shot putter Olester Bernard of Nassau, Bahamas, barely missed individual honors by placing eighth with a 51-0 toss. The distance medley relay foursome of Eric VanMatre, Harold Hall, Mark LaValley and Jon Murray also placed eighth in a school record 10:30.1

The Lady Bisons' two-mile relay of Teresa Durham, Margaret Eoff, Jodie Murray and Cheryl Bednosky placed 11th in 10:00.8, while the same quartet finished 12th in the distance medley relay in 13:04.2. Both were school records.

Harding will host a summer basketball camp for junior and senior high boy athletes, according to Bison head coach Jess Bucy.

The senior high camp will be held July 10-15 and the junior high camp is set for July 17-22. Bucy will serve as camp director.

Waterbuffaloes Set Records in Swimming Meet

Success in sports, so say the soothsayers, is not found in numbers but in improvement. With that thought in mind, consider the performance of the Waterbuffalo swimming and diving team in the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference championship meet a great success.

Plagued by a lack of depth, the Waterbuffaloes finished a distant fourth in the AIC meet at Hendrix College. But considering the number of school records established, the Harding swimmers came home smiling.

"We were very pleased with the team's performance," head coach Jack Boustead said. "We knew we wouldn't win the meet, but we set 10 school records and qualified for nationals in six events, so I couldn't be more pleased."

Only six Harding swim-

mers competed in the meet, which was won by Henderson State University. Of the six, only one, freshman Brian Gainey of Baton Rouge, La., captured a first place.

Gainey won the 100 yard backstroke in 55.81 seconds, breaking his own record set earlier in the season. He also captured the 200 backstroke in 2:07.31, again breaking his own standard.

Event winners are automatically named All-AIC. Two other Waterbuffaloes, senior Gary Ashley of Bonita, Calif., and freshman Kirk Woltman of Kansas City, Mo., were also named all-conference based on their performances. Ashley was the only senior on the team.

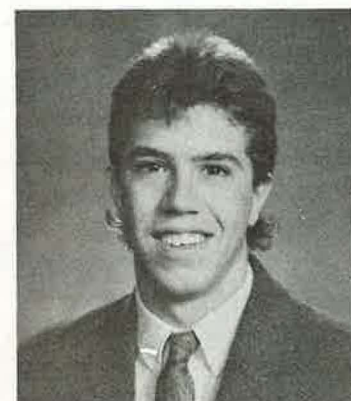
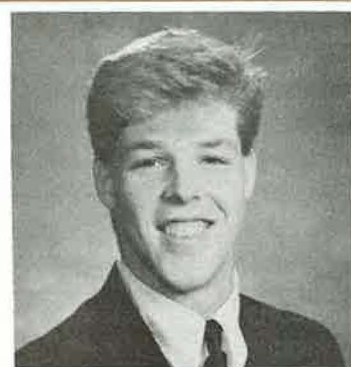
"We're definitely a team of the future," said Boustead, who receives assistance from Richard Denney. "Brian is an

Harding's spring sports teams are off and running with a full slate of competitions remaining on their schedules.

The Bison tennis team has jumped out to a fast start, posting an impressive 3-0 record in its season-opening matches. Coach David Elliott faces the task of replacing his top two singles players after winning the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference title last spring, and he'll lean heavily on the play of five experienced netters.

Heading the list is senior Judd Sanderson of Wills Point, Texas, and juniors Jorge Woog of Mexico City, Mexico, and Mark French of Nashville, Tenn. Sanderson reaped All-AIC honors while competing in the middle singles spots last year. Both Woog and French earned All-AIC Honorable Mention, with French also receiving Academic All-America laurels.

Junior Arturo Martinez of Mexico City, and sophomore Todd Gilliam of Sherwood, Ark., are two others Elliott will count upon heavily. Martinez, who came on strong late last season, was a key cog in the conference championship, as was Gilliam. He captured the Class AA state championship his senior year in high school.

Newcomers have also had an immediate impact on the Bison netters' success thus far. Freshman Carlos Ferreiro of Col. Del Valle, Mexico, has looked impressive at the number one singles spot. Sophomore Richie Roberts of Shreveport, La., and freshmen David Griner of Freeport, Ill., and Keith Olree, Lee Mackey and Kelly Barden of Searcy will lend support.

A mixture of experience and youth will also be a

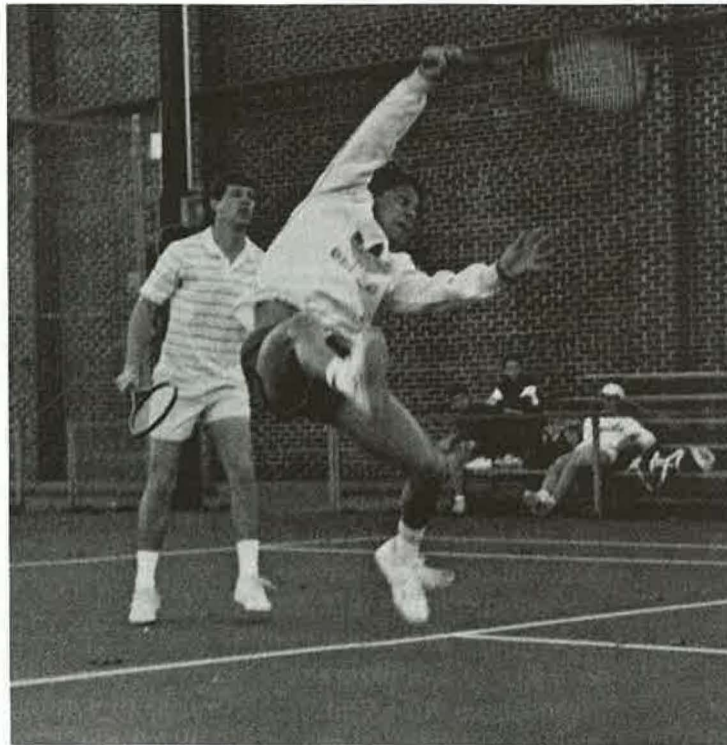
key for the Bison baseball team. Head coach Dick Johnson will combine eight returning starters with what he calls, "one of our best recruiting classes ever."

Tri-captains Marty Spears of Searcy, Dennis Mitchell of Kensett, Ark., and Perry Parr of North Little Rock will shoulder much of the leadership responsibilities. Spears, the lone senior on the squad, is a steady southpaw pitcher who went 2-3 from the mound last year. Mitchell, who tops the Bisons' returning hitters, is the fastest of Harding's fleet-footed base runners. Parr, at third base, may be the Bisons' best defensive player.

Three other returnees have positions locked in. Catcher Tom Hull of Ft. Recovery, Ohio, shortstop Andy Kinser of Middletown, Ohio, and second baseman Daron London of Grubbs, Ark., were regulars on last spring's 15-18 team. Spears will be joined in the rotation by David DePew of Dayton, Ohio, and John Kodatt of Hiawasee, Ga.

Newcomers who could see extensive action include outfielders Gary Barnes of Ozark, Mo., Robert Cooper of Melbourne, Ark., and Brandon Harrell of Searcy, and infielders Larry Cheshier of Newport, Ark., John Labas of Columbiana, Ohio, and Pat McGaha of Searcy.

In golf, coach Phil Watkins faces the monumental task of building around only two returnees. Senior Toby Taylor, an All-AIC honoree last year who finished eighth in the league's individual stroke competition, joins sophomore Brett Biggs of Martin, Texas, as the only Bison linksters with college experience. Watkins will look to Bald Knob, Ark.,

natives Jason Nier and Alex Addington, and former football players David Escue of Memphis and Scott Corbin of Searcy for support.

Prospects are excellent for the Bison and Lady Bison tracksters to have good seasons. Coach Ted Lloyd's thinclads should enjoy good depth, especially in the middle and long distance events.

The Bisons will also be strong in the field events,

where three indoor All-Americans compete. High jumpers Te Howard of Clyde, Texas, and Bill Baker of Mt. Dora, Fla., joined freshman pole vaulter Jimmy Sloan of West Memphis, Ark., as point earners in the NAIA indoor championship meet (see related story). Shot putter Olester Bernard of Nassau, Bahamas, barely missed making All-American in the meet.

In the middle distance

races, half-miler Eric VanMatre of Rolla, Mo., set an indoor school record in the 400 and 600 meter dashes and is the conference favorite in the outdoor 800 run. Distance men, Jon Partlow of Portland, Ore., Marty Koonce of North Little Rock, Jon Murray of Carthage, Mo., and Rich Lockhart of Grand Blanc, Mich., head a strong group of runners.

Transfer sprinter Harold Hall of Fitzgerald, Ga., set indoor school records in the 200 and 300 meter races, and should be the favorite in the sprints.

For the Lady Bisons, the distance events will be their strongsuit. AIC cross country champion Cheryl Bednosky of Shelter Island, N.Y., and runner-up Melynda Davis of Gresham, Ore., are expected to be the top two distance runners among the AIC ladies this spring. They'll be pushed by teammates Tracy Parks of Pensacola, Fla., and Margaret Eoff of Rogers, Ark.

In the sprints, Florida State transfer Kara Hutchinson of Quincy, Fla., has college experience and Lloyd is looking for fast times from her.

Lady Bisons Finish Competitive Season Looking Optimistically to the 1988-89 Season

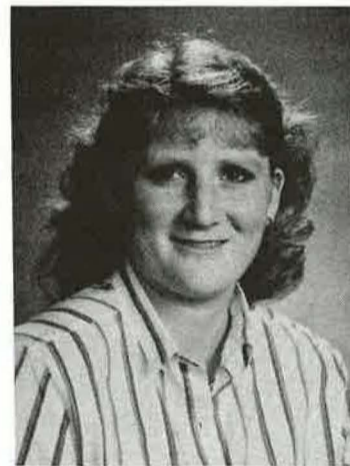
The sweet smell of success that every athletic program seeks may be just around the corner for the Lady Bison basketball team, if the 1987-88 season is an indication of things to come.

Facing their most competitive schedule in the five-year history of the program, the Lady Bisons produced their winningest record yet with a 7-18 mark. The numbers are deceiving, head coach Phil Watkins says, because of the unyielding competition.

"When you consider that five teams we played were top 20 caliber, it puts things into perspective," said Watkins, who has been with the team from the beginning. "Our girls didn't lie down for any of them. We really played them tough, even against the top teams."

Seldom did an opponent overwhelm the Lady Bisons. In fact, five of their first six losses were by seven points or less, including three one-point defeats.

Ten of the 18 losses came at the hands of the highly ranked teams. At different points in the season, four Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference squads reached the NAIA top 25, proving that the Lady Bisons had their share of capable opponents.

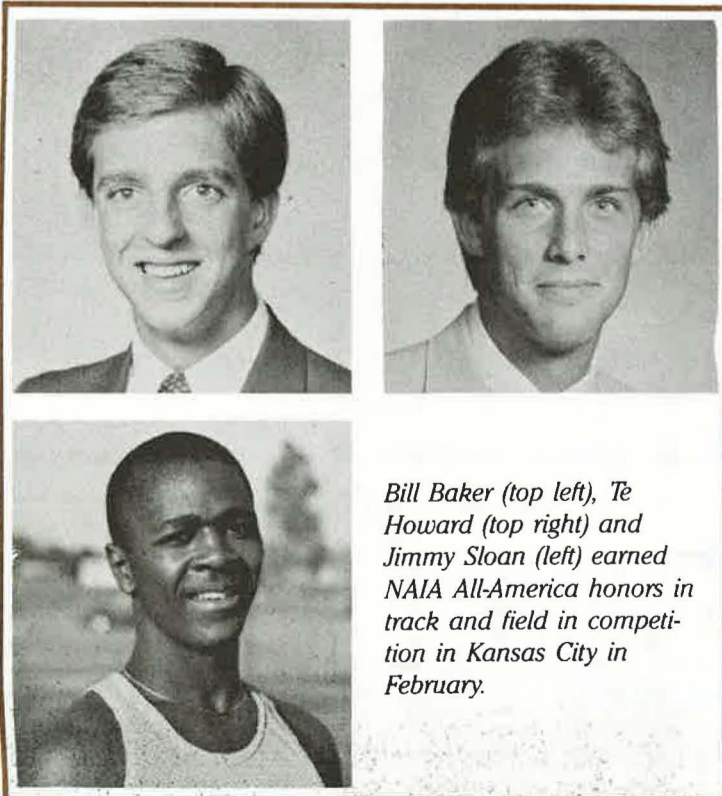
"We're in the toughest conference in the nation at our level; there's no doubt about it," said Watkins. "You can look at the national statistics. The AIC's top

three scorers are ranked in the nation's top 15. That shows the talent of this league."

Three outstanding seniors provided leadership for Harding's ladies. Forward-guard Teri Loven of Clinton, Ark., led the team in scoring with a 14.5-point average, and topped the steals category with 54 thefts. Forward Stephany Smith of Brookhaven, Miss., averaged 11.0 points a game while leading the squad in rebounding with 8.7 boards an outing. Point guard Shawn Bradford of Bee Branch, Ark., averaged 11.9 points and dished out 64 assists, a team high.

Newcomers played a vital role on the team as well. Freshmen Tomi Cragwall of Lebanon, Tenn., and Lorie Hoofman of Judsonia, Ark., stepped in and did yeoman jobs as regulars. Cragwall established a team record 54 blocked shots, while Hoofman was fourth on the team in assists and steals.

Other key players included sophomores Syrena Burch of Madison, Tenn., and Lisa Kirk of Springdale, Ark., and junior Julie Roddy of Bradford, Ark.

Johnson to Give Reins to Smith at Season's End

For 19 years, Dick Johnson has laced up his spikes and led the Harding University Bisons on the baseball diamond. But after this spring, he'll hang them up permanently.

The 62-year-old Johnson announced in February that he'll take advantage of early retirement at the end of the current semester and step down as head baseball coach and associate professor of physical education.

The Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference and NAIA District 17 Coach of the Year in 1975, 1984, 1985 and 1986, Johnson said the decision was a hard one to make, but it was right for the time.

Johnson is coaching the Bisons through the spring season. Dr. Steve Smith, chairman of Harding's math department and assistant coach to Johnson the last eight seasons, has been named as Johnson's successor.

"I'm delighted that Steve has agreed to take the program after this season," Johnson said. "That was a key in my decision to take the early retirement. I wanted to be sure that the program would be in good hands, and I know it will be

under Steve. He and I have been together for a long time, and I've never treated him as an assistant coach. He has been a co-head coach. He's had a great impact on the program and has been very instrumental in our success the last several seasons."

"We're grateful to Coach Johnson for the outstanding job he's done the past 19 years," said Harding Athletic Director Harry Olree. "We hate to lose a coach of his knowledge and ability, but we are extremely fortunate to have Steve Smith to take the team.

Johnson has enjoyed great success since the Bisons moved to Jerry Moore Memorial Field on campus in 1981. In 1984, the Bisons won the AIC championship and in 1985 and 1986 the NAIA District 17 title. His 1975 squad finished runner-up in the District 17 tournament.

An avid outdoorsman, he plans to spend more time in his boat and out in the woods. "I'll be able to visit more with my grandkids and do a little more work around the house. Of course, the fishing and hunting and grandkids will come before the garden

work."

A 1960 graduate of Harding, Johnson is a native of Memphis who began his baseball career as a speedy third baseman at Whitehaven High School. After high school and American Legion play concluded, he played minor league baseball, reaching as far as Class A with the Little Rock Travelers of the

Southern Association.

He attended Harding and played one year with the Bisons before they competed in the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference. He served as a student assistant under Olree for a season before his graduation.

In 1960, he was named head baseball coach and assistant football coach at Dykes High School in Atlan-

ta, Ga. In his six seasons at Dykes, he won three regional titles and, in 1965, won the Georgia Class AAA title. He was named Region 3AAA Coach of the Year in 1963-64-65, and state Coach of the Year in 1965.

He went to Jefferson, Ga., in 1966, where he was head baseball coach, and won one regional title before coming to Harding in 1969.

"It was a dream that I had had the nine years I was away," he said of the opportunity to come back to Searcy. "I told the folks here that if they ever had an opening, I'd like to be considered. I knew before I came that I'd take it if they offered me a job."

"I'm looking forward to this season, since it will be my last, and I'm excited about the program with Steve leading it," he said further. "I'm sure I'm going to miss it after it's over but it hasn't hit me quite yet. I'm sure it will when I start packing away my office."

Olree said of Smith, "Steve works well with young men and is highly respected by the baseball players. We believe he's eminently qualified and feel that he will do an excellent job in leading the team."

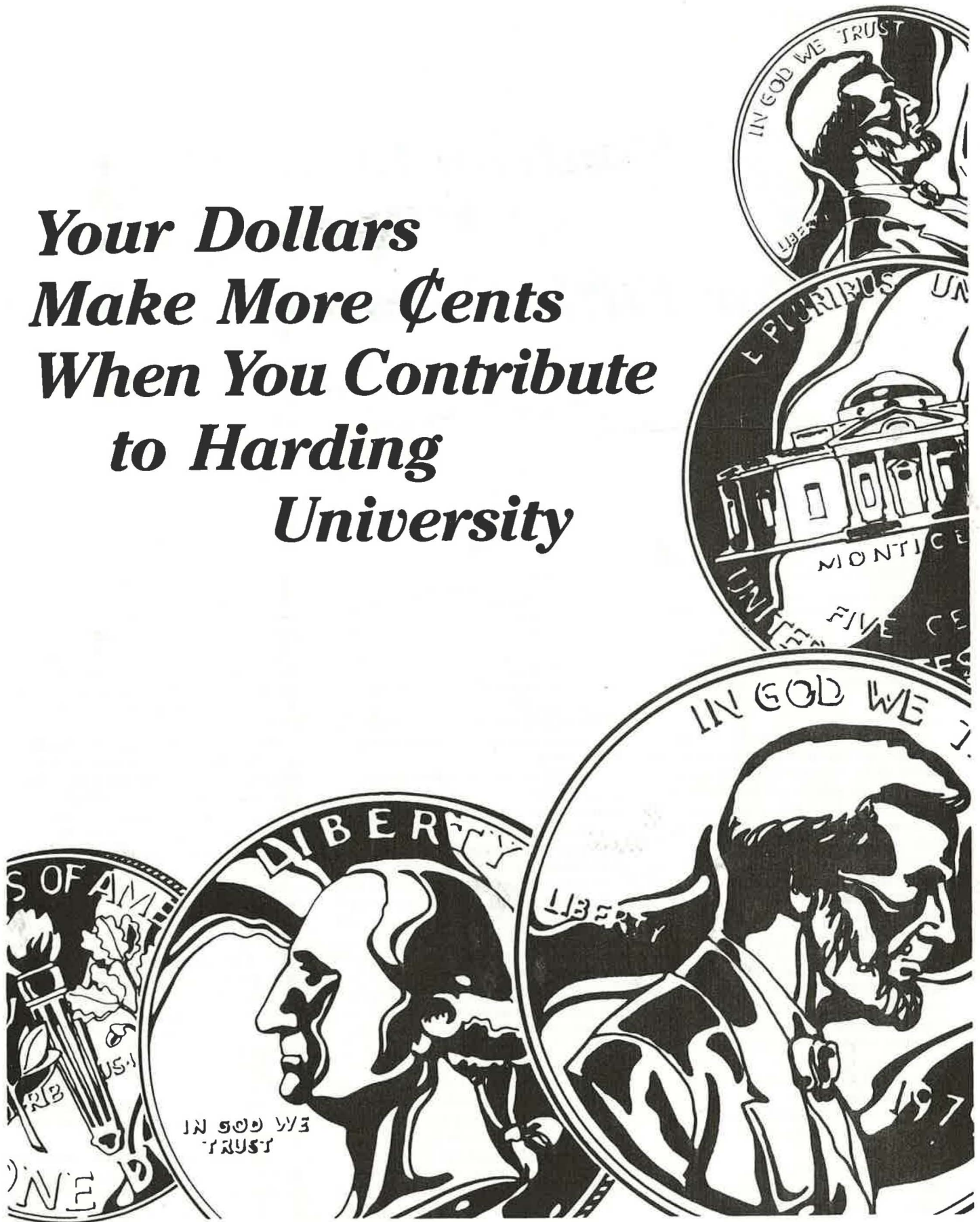

Contributions Surpass \$3 Million Mark For Fifth Consecutive Year

Donations and other financial gifts in 1987 helped Harding top the \$3 million mark in fund-raising for the fifth consecutive year, according to Floyd Daniel, vice president for university relations.

Contributions by individuals, corporations or other individuals totaled \$3,385,008 for 1987, Daniel said. Of that amount, \$885,813 was donated by alumni, representing the third highest annual figure ever given to Harding by former students.

"We continue to look to alumni, parents and other close friends for financial leadership," Daniel said. "We get gifts of all sizes and amounts, and they are all important. Each gift represents an expression of support from individuals who are important to us."

One area showing a dramatic increase in the past year has been the direct mail fund-raising efforts. A record \$132,000 was sent to Harding by alumni and friends responding to one or more direct mail appeals, easily eclipsing 1986's record \$77,000 and 1985's \$49,000.

"Harding family members and other friends of Christian education make it possible for us to do what we do for young people by responding as they do to these needs," Daniel said.

"Our students continue to need financial assistance through scholarships, and we are trying to do everything possible to keep the cost of education to the student at a reasonable level. These donations are the offsetting factor. Without this financial help, we would have to charge students a lot more to pay for what it costs to provide their education.

"That's why each contribution is so important — because each student who benefits is important!"

More attention will be given in the future, Daniel said, to encouraging more alumni to support the school financially. Some cor-

porations would donate more money to Harding if the alumni giving percentage were higher.

"Approximately 20 percent of our alumni sent us a gift in 1987," Tim Bruner, director of alumni relations, reported and that's great. A lot of schools would love to have a 20 percent alumni giving percentage.

"Only recently we received a notice from a company that would match its employees' gifts to Harding, one-for-one, for all gifts. Then the company added that it would match the employee gift three-for-one if we have an alumni giving percentage of 50 percent or more.

"This concept is becoming popular among corporations who want to help institutions who help themselves by having the support of their major constituency — their alumni.

"In 1988, we want to appeal to our alumni to help us meet that challenge," Bruner added. "Other funds are being made available if our alumni will rally behind us and help us qualify for it. Few colleges have alumni more loyal and supportive than ours; that's why we're confident we can dramatically increase that percentage.

"And to achieve the increase we're looking at — from 20 up to 50 percent — we need help from everyone. Some people are sometimes hesitant to send in a smaller gift. But considering the additional funds you might be helping us receive from corporations, you will multiply your gift considerably."

The year 1987 was a good year in fund-raising according to Daniel and Bruner, and 1988 has promise for better, "...because a real challenge exists, and the Harding family always rises to a challenge."

Classes which topped the 20 percent mark in 1987 included '25, '31, '35, '36, '40, '41, '42, '43, '45, '46, '48, '49, '50 and '74.

More than 2,800 of the 1987 donors qualified for membership in Harding's donor recognition program. Participants in the seven gift clubs contributed \$3,352,747.

The donor recognition program includes the Founder's Fund, Trustees' Circle, President's Forum, Heritage Fund, Century Club and Harding Friends.

Forty-five donors were 1987 members of the Founder's Fund. Their contributions were \$1,965,261. Membership at this level is for individuals or organizations contributing \$10,000 or more in a calendar year.

The Trustees' Circle in 1987 enrolled 55 donors, up from 47 in 1986. This group contributed \$326,305. Membership in the Trustees' Circle recognizes gifts between \$5,000 and \$9,999.

Membership in the President's Forum was at 324 in 1987. Donors in this group contributed between \$1,000 and \$4,999. Last year this group contributed \$580,797.

Members of the Heritage Fund contributed \$171,506 in 1987. There were 270 donors at this level giving between \$500 and \$999.

Donors giving between \$200 and \$499 were designated as members of the University Fund. During 1987, this gift club gave \$171,435.

Those giving between \$100 and \$199 are designated as members of the Century Club. In 1987, there were 781 participants at this level, giving a total of \$94,873.

Harding Friends is the designation for donors giving \$50 to \$99 annually. During 1987, a total of \$42,567 was given by 709 donors.

In addition to the gift club members, there were another 1,836 donors who contributed \$32,261.

The purpose of the donor recognition program is to recognize the many individuals, corporations and organizations who annually provide financial assistance to Harding.

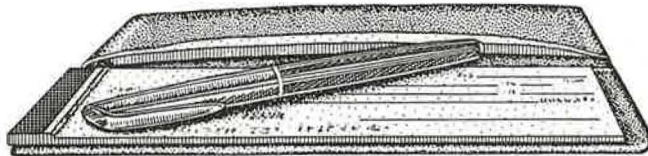

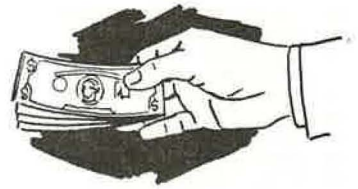
