

SPECIAL MEETINGS. A number of special dinners and luncheons are scheduled in connection with the lectureship. Some of these are included within the program, while others will be announced at lectureship assemblies. All elders are invited to attend the annual elders' and preachers' dinner Thursday. Dow Merritt will speak afterwards.

EVENING LECTURES. Each evening there will be two speakers. One will be speaking in the College Auditorium while the other is speaking in the College Church Auditorium. The College Church is located at 712 E. Race Avenue, two short blocks north and one block west of the main campus gate.

LECTURESHIP PARKING. There is parking space behind and on the west side of the College Church building in the church parking lots. In addition to the large parking lot adjacent to the College Auditorium there is a larger new lot across the railroad track from the regular parking entrance. Guests are free to park wherever they desire during the lectureship.

MEALS. Meals may be obtained on campus in the school cafeteria in the American Heritage Center as well as in the College Inn in the Ganus Student Center. Many fine restaurants are also available in the city proper, just a few blocks from the campus.

HOUSING. Housing is available in local hotels and motels. Because of dormitory conditions at the college this year, it will not be possible to furnish free housing to guests. Many people, as in the past, will continue to make their own arrangements with friends in Searcy.

TAPE RECORDINGS. All lectures in the College Auditorium will be tape recorded. When possible, lectures in the American Heritage Auditorium will also be tape recorded. Guests are asked not to bring any tape recorders to the College Auditorium. Copy tapes will be available as soon as possible after the lectureship at a cost of \$3.00 per 1,200 foot reel. Any two lectures may be duplicated on each reel. Please specify the lectures that you wish duplicated. All lectures are recorded on double-track equipment, and payment should be made when you receive the tapes. Arrangements must be made with Clarence Sanders, Director of Audio-Visuals, by calling 268-6161 and asking for Extension 353 at your earliest convenience.


