LECTURESHIP PARKING

MEALS

Guy Petway, manager, American Heritage-Alumni Center, will take reservations for that building on a first-come, first-served basis. Because of dormitory conditions at the college this year, it will not be possible to furnish free housing to guests.

All lectures are recorded on double-track equipment, and payment should be made when you receive the tapes. Arrangements must be made with Jerome Barnes, Director of the Educational Media Center located in the Old Science Building.
