tell her of the peace I have gained through God as you know it through my letters this would make her very huppy and hills ease her pain from all this, I know I Sound Selfish, for I knew you to be elery berry, but when I see her us write her I con't express myself as well as I wish to, In closing may I thoub you for your kindness of heart in writting for you have brought me great comfort when I needed it most. I only wish there were more like you in this world.
