FINANCIAL AID: more than 80 per cent of Harding students receive some form of financial aid. The Student Financial Services Office exists to help students and their families plan the financing of a college education. To initiate the aid process all applicants must complete the Family Financial Statement (FFS), which can be obtained from the Student Financial Services Office. Write or call the Director of Student Financial Services for further information.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Fifteen (15) high school units with a minimum of three (3) units in English and nine (9) units from other academic courses such as mathematics, science, social studies, and foreign language are required. A "C" average or better is required and a score of 18 on the ACT or 750 on the SAT is recommended. Transfer students need to have an overall "C" average or better on all work attempted at other colleges or universities.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Each year Harding selects from among its most outstanding applicant candidates for academic scholarships. Included are:

Harding Academic Scholarships — Students must send the ACT or SAT test results to Harding. Those with ACT scores of 22 or above or SAT scores of 840 or above will receive scholarships.


Valedictorian or Salutatorian Scholarships — Students must have their high school officially notify the Harding Director of Admissions of their award to be considered.

We can be thankful for the medical mission work being done in Nigeria and Ghana, West Africa, supported by churches of Christ in this country. These are areas of the world presently very receptive to the gospel of Christ and, at the same time, greatly in need of medical help.

The medical programs in these two countries alone will care for more than 40,000 patients in one year and will minister to their spiritual needs as well.

The African Christian Hospitals Foundation is a non-profit organization made up of 57 active members of the Lord's church, whose purpose is to promote mission work through the use of medicine administered by Christian doctors and nurses.

The ACHF:

avoids being a missionary society by insisting that all missionaries be sent by a sponsoring church.

has as its goal to present Christ in every phase of its work.

receives and distributes funds, medical supplies and equipment, recruits doctors and nurses, and seeks churches of Christ to assume their oversight and support.

is currently involved in two works—the Nigerian Christian Hospital and the Kumasi, Ghana, health care center.

endeavors to serve as a resource center for Christians interested in any of the medical works of our brotherhood.

takes seriously the judgment scene of Matthew 25, "Inasmuch as you did it unto the least of these, my brethren, you did it unto me."

In order to carry on this work we need *your* assistance.

- An administrator for the Ghana clinic work will be needed soon. A husband whose wife is a medical professional would be ideal. Opportunities for evangelism are abundant.
- A business manager will be needed early next year for the Nigerian Christian Hospital. Teaching opportunities abound for husband and wife.
- A good handy-man, mechanic, electrician, cement block-maker/mason/carpenter is needed at the Nigerian Christian Hospital.
- Nurses are needed for Ghana and Nigeria.
- Monthly contributions are needed to help with medical supplies and equipment.
- Please send names and addresses of all medical professionals in your congregation.
- Invite our president, Dr. H. Glenn Boyd, to speak to your congregation on medical missions and its scriptural basis. (A video or slides can be shown.)
- Churches are needed to sponsor and help support those willing to go to the mission field. This is especially attractive to congregations with several medical professionals.
- Pray for the missionaries who are faithfully serving, healing the sick, exposing themselves to diseases, depriving themselves of the luxuries which most of us enjoy daily, in order to demonstrate the compassion of Christ.

Harding University College of Bible and Religion

The Harding University College of Bible and Religion serves all students through the required Bible courses in the liberal arts curriculum. Students are required to enroll in a Bible course during each semester of their residence at Harding University.

Many students are served more specifically by this academic division as they major in biblical areas of study and participate in student groups that are a part of the College of Bible and Religion.

The College of Bible and Religion seeks to equip each student with a knowledge of the Bible so that the student's life will be firmly founded upon a personal faith in Christ. It seeks to help the student integrate biblical truth and life experience in whatever field of study he has chosen.

The twenty-two faculty members include a visiting professor of missions who comes directly from a mission area to share his experience and firsthand knowledge with students. Many students participate in mission campaigns each year.

Harding confers the Bachelor of Arts degree or the Bachelor of Science degree on students who complete the required curriculum in Bible. Majors offered include Bible and Religion, Biblical Languages, Missions, Religious Education, and Youth Ministry. During the 1988-89 school year, 131 students declared majors in Bible and biblical languages.

The School of Biblical Studies, located on the Harding campus, is an intense program designed to train men who are over twenty-one years of age in the field of preaching and missions. A diploma is conferred upon successful completion of this two-year program.


Harding exists to serve Christ and His church throughout the world. In addition to the structured classes and programs mentioned above, an effort is made to fulfill a broader mission to the church through lectureships, seminars, and workshops.

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
