The meeting was opened by a prayer led by George Keiffer. Bussiness discussed was as follows:


1. The Harding Movie was recommended by the council to be shown. Many of the new students had not seen the movie at all and some of the old students had never seen it since the sound had been changed. The council wishes that the movie be shown either in chapel or some Saturday night.

2. Paul presented a letter from Dr. Benson and also letters from others interested in the student and school's welfare asking us to be cautious in accepting the NASC. Paul had previous to the meeting talked with several teachers who had been acquainted with the NASC and its constitution and works. We, the council, again read over several passages ~~in the constitution~~ which were contrary or seemed to be so to our beliefs and high ideals of Harding. Dr. Benson said that he did not wish to say that we could not become a member and wished that we would reconsider the information and decide ourselves against it. We, the council, voted against becoming a member. Paul Magee is to speak to the student body and explain the situation to them. It is to be left up to the students whether the election will be held or not.

3. It was announced that pictures for the Petit Jean would be made Tuesday afternoon at half past four o'clock.

The meeting ended with a prayer led by Charles Pitman, graduate school represenative.
