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

# Book fair to be at academy




The fair is designed to help spur student interest in reading and building home libraries. Profits from the event will be used for PTA projects at the Academy.



The Harding Elementary P.T.A. will meet Monday night, November 2, at 7:30 p.m. in the Elementary Auditorium. The program will be presented by Dr. James Dusenberry, professor at University of Arkansas Medical Center. Discussing the drug problem, Dr. Dusenberry's presentation will be entitled "It Happens in the Best of Families." Dr. Dusenberry is chairman of the Governor's Council on Drugs and Drug Abuse. The public has been invited to join P.T.A. members in the Harding High School Auditorium at 8 p.m. to hear Dr. Dusenberry.

# Lecture on drugs open to public

The lecture on drug abuse scheduled by the Harding Elementary PTA has been thrown open to the public, Dr. Bobby Coker, president, has announced, and officers of the organization have invited all persons interested in the program to attend. Dr. James Dusenberry, professor at the University of Arkansas Medical Center and Chairman of the Governor's Council on Drugs and Drug Abuse, will speak at the open forum Monday, Nov. 2 at 8 p.m. in the Academy Auditorium.

"We originally set the lecture for a regular meeting of the PTA," Dr. Coker said, "but we feel that many others will be eager to hear the discussion and we would like for everyone to come."

The president explained that a short business meeting of the Harding PTA would be held at 7:30 in the Elementary Auditorium, but the group will be dismissed to re-assemble in the Academy Auditorium for the address.

Dr. Coker urged all PTA members to be on hand for the 7:30 meeting and all others to attend the lecture.

# LECTURE ON DRUG ABUSE TO BE OPEN TO PUBLIC

Dr. James Dusenberry, chairman of the governor's council on drugs and drug abuse, will speak at an open meeting of the Harding Elementary PTA Monday, November 2 at 8 p.m. in the Harding Academy Auditorium. The address is open to the public without charge and all interested persons have been asked to attend. Dr. Bobby Coker, PTA president, will conduct a short business meeting for Harding PTA members at 7:30 p.m. in the Elementary Auditorium.

#### PREVENTATIVE DRUG ABUSE

## SUGGESTED DISCUSSION TOPICS

- . Health and sickness: What keeps us healthy, what makes us sick?
- . Use of medicines for prevention and cure of sickness.
- Dangers of improperly used medicines,
- Hazards posed by abuse of normedical substances such as glue, gasoline, etc.
- . Manner in which boys and girls are introduced to drug abuse.
- . Handling situations in which drugs or other abusable substances are offered.
- . The importance of not "going along with the crowd" or "taking a dare."
- . Effects of drug abuse on general health and social behavior.
- Relationship between drug abuse and juvenile delinquency and crime.
- mpact of addiction on one's future.
- . How students can assist in solving drug abuse problems.

## OTHER ACTIVITIES

- . Have students collect newspaper and magazine articles dealing with accidental poisonings, safe use of household products and medicines. Have them make scrapbooks or arrange articles as a bulletim board exhibit.
- Dramatize a situation in which a student is urged by his friends to take a dare and ingest an unknown substance.
- Have students make posters warning about drug abuse.
- . Have students write essays on the value of medicines properly used -- and the dangers of drugs improperly used.
- Install a question box in which students might submit problems for discussion.

## TOPICS FOR STUDY

Depending on the grade level, one or more of these topics may be suitable for special projects in the form of booklets, including graphys and pictures, or as oral reports. Classes may be divided into committees.

- . The story of drugs in medicine
- Nareotics in medical use.
- . The effect of narcotic and non-narcotic drug abuse on the body
- . What local community agencies do to cope with drug abuse and addiction

# Harding second graders relive By-gone days

The second grade class of Parding Elementary School and Mrs Betty Alston, teacher, turned back the pages of time and avtended school in the little school building that was erected about 1885. This little school house is located now on the White County Fair Grounds. This building was originally used at Little Red, seven miles east of Pangburn, It had two stories originally with a masonic hall above. Jack E. Porter, administrator of the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program at Little Rock visited the school that day, also.

He spoke briefly to the children. Mrs. Oran Vaughn served as chairman and hostess. The children from the Harding Elemen-

tary School attended at her invitation. The school had many visitors that day.

Mrs. Groth was one of 19 delegates to the 4-day conference held in Washington, D.C., December of 1970.

Mrs. Groth repeatedly stressed that the conference was managed by the people in Washington. The recommendations of the delegates were overlooked. Those presented by the president were the ones printed in the Eastern papers. The Arkansas delegation had prepared reports to present to the conference. At the conference the delegates were scattered among the 4,000 representatives and felt their influence was of little effect. The conference was workshop structured to facilitate communication among representatives.

Some of the topics discussed at the conference were individuality, learning, health care, parent and family living, and community environment. Three concerns expressed were the need for comprehensive family oriented child care, elimination of racism, and the need for a basic guaranteed family income for needy families. All the repre-

sentatives felt there is a need for some group to lobby on behalf of children. They also felt there is a country-wide need for more child care centers and such centers should include the child's family in their programs.

In a question and answer period following Mrs. Groth's speech several interesting facts were brought out. Kindergarten has been recently legalized but the girl and Johnny Wood won the program has not been funded by the state legislature. Money that would have founded kindergartens was used for teacher's salaries. According to Mrs. Groth there are not enough trained kindergarten teachers in Arkansas to make a statewide program operable. Currently there are 20 kindergartens in the state operated by various colleges and universities. A move has been made by the Arkansas Council on children to have the Arkanmore often than every 10 years as it currently does.


