A 1983 alumnus, Brad Bradley graduated from the University with a bachelor of business administration degree in accounting. He began his career with international accounting firm Arthur Young, focusing on real estate tax and audit services.

He was founder, chairman and CEO of Equifirst Corp., which began in 1990 as a small mortgage lender. Over the next decade, Bradley helped it grow from a company with less than \$5 million in annual volume to one with more than \$5 billion in 2004 and 1,200 employees.

Currently, he is the CEO of subprime mortgage company Senderra Capital, located in Charlotte, N.C.

Active in the community, he serves on the board of Harding's American Studies Institute, on the board of directors for Hope Cancer Ministries in Charlotte, as a cabinet member for Charlotte Pregnancy Care Center, on the board of advisers for the Witherspoon Fellowship in Washington, D.C., and on the board of directors for the Center for a Just Society in Washington, D.C.

Bradley met his wife, Teri Hazelip ('82), while at Harding. They have three sons, Charles, Mason and Bryce.

ARDING UNIVERSITY Chartered in 1924 as a senior institution of higher learning.

Harding University has a rich history of quality education. Harding was chartered as a senior college in 1924 when two junior colleges, Arkansas Christian College and Harper College, merged their facilities and assets, adopted the new name of Harding College, and located on the campus of Arkansas Christian in Morrilton, Ark. The school was moved to Searcy in 1934, and the Board of Trustees approved a recommended change of Harding to university status in 1979.

Harding was named in memory of James A. Harding, a pioneer Christian educator who founded Nashville Bible School (Lipscomb University) in Tennessee. He challenged his co-workers with an enthusiasm for Christian education that remains a significant tradition at Harding University.

At the charter, J.N. Armstrong, who had served five years as Harper's president, became president of Harding College.

In 1936, George S. Benson returned from mission work in China to assume the presidency of his alma mater. Benson directed the college from a deep indebtedness into a state of financial stability, national recognition and academic accreditation. He retired in 1965 after 29 years of tireless service.

Dr. Clifton L. Ganus Jr., a 1943 graduate, served as president from 1965 to 1987. A former history department chair and vice president of the college, Dr. Ganus kept alive his predecessor's drive for excellence by leading a plan of campus improvement and expansion. At his retirement, Dr. Ganus became Harding's first chancellor,

Dr. David Burks became the fourth president in 1987. A 1965 graduate, he has been a member of the faculty since 1967 and has served as dean of the College of Business Administration. Dr. Burks initiated the theme "Integrating faith, learning and living" as the goal of his administration. With this goal in mind, the University seeks to develop the whole person through a spiritual emphasis in academics, athletics, Bible classes and chapel. Thus, Harding's 5,602 students, representing 50 states and 46 foreign countries, are empowered for ministry, church leadership, and a lifetime of Christian service.
