Dear Mr. Taft:

Due to several reasons, I have not reported the condition of our Bond Sales Campaign. You are aware of the position in which the Churches of Christ place their preachers. I would certainly suggest that you write Mr. Pittman to receive an official report on the campaign.

It is my unofficial understanding that all the Bonds have been taken care of, either by purchase or actual sale. It is interesting to note that a recent personal and confidential report showed that I had been able to sell and deliver \$25,000 of the Bond Issue personally.

The Building Program is progressing almost on schedule. Negotiation for the sale of our present property is progressing nicely. Even though I have been sadly disappointed with the efforts of the general chairman in successfully completing the bond sales, it is my general impression of all the work done in the area of bond sales and building program is a favorable one.
