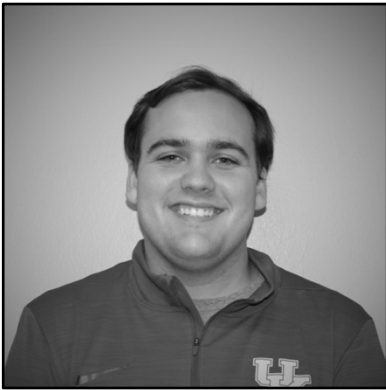
Eric Johnson—Copy Editor
