Dear B. F.:

I was quite surprised when early this week Brother Estill Staggs told of his conversation with you recently. I was very happy to learn that you were interested in the work here.

After talking with the elders and telling them of your work, they too are happy that you would place yourself in a position to consider coming and working with this group. I am writing this letter as a means of encouraging you to consider seriously coming to this area. The congregation here is a proven grower. At least three times within the last ten years they have overflowed our present facility, the result being two other congregations. When the same condition arose, it was decided that rather than starting a new congregation, that the group here would build a larger building, thus allowing themselves to become large enough to carry on a greater program of work.

It is my opinion that one could do a tremendous amount of good and see an unusual rate of growth with this group. It is because of my personal knowledge of this situation and of the prevailing attitude and spirit of the group that I encourage you to seriously consider it.

Give my regards to your wife, and we hope to see you here before too long.
