Dear Sir:

Recently a Mr. Ralph T. Henley, 206 Elm Street,  
Rome, Georgia, was denied a visa to enter Israel as a  
missionary for the churches of Christ.

It is my sincere feeling that this action  
represents discrimination against this particular group,  
due to the fact that various other religious groups are  
now permitted to have representatives in your country.

Having a slight knowledge of the great and rich  
heritage of your country, it is beyond my comprehension as to  
the motive behind such arbitrary movement. I trust that  
further investigation will be made into this matter and that  
this investigation will result in the immediate granting  
of said visa.
