Dear Lynn:

I was glad to read of your plans to go to British Columbia within the next few months. You may not know that after my second year at Freed-Hardeman I went to Prince George, B.C., for a summer's work. Of course I am still vitally interested in the work in that area. You will notice that three major towns in the interior need a great deal of work for the Lord. Prince George, Quenel and Dawson Creek could all be worked with Prince George as a base.

I still entertain thoughts of returning to British Columbia and helping the people of that great area. The brethren in Prince George at the time of my visit numbered only about 9 or 10 and I was not able to help them much due to my own limitations. Because of that I still feel an obligation to go and work in that area.

One of the main members was a family, the Bruce Manns, they now live in Victoria, 1380 Harrop Rd. Victoria, B.C. Please give them my personal regards. Another one of the members though less faithful is Jim Wlast#z, 728 Harper St., Prince George, B.C.
