Dear Joe:

I hardly know where to start. Things have been happening here so fast that I have been unable to stay on top at all times. First, let me express my sincere apologies for not answering you sooner.

The next day after you called our baby was taken to the hospital. For several days we did not know which way she might go. During all this time I was going to school three hours per day, preaching every night, and staying all night with the baby. Obviously, I did not have an opportunity to talk with the Elders. Only in the last three days have I had any time to see or talk with them.

The consensus among them is that we will be unable to hire anyone under any circumstances right now. I also learned that there are no school openings much less openings in the grades you indicated. So, it appears that once more I do not get what I would like to have. However, if anything develops I want you in on the ground floor. If you do move please keep me informed of your address, etc.

Please excuse this delay. Give my regards to your wife. This typing job is not too good but I just made myself take the time to write.
