Dear Jerry:

I have just finished your "REPORT FROM QUEBEC" which was passed on to me by Sister Buford Smith. Brother Smith is one of our deacons here. It was certainly good to hear of the work you are doing there. I knew that you had moved to Montreal but had not had the opportunity to learn directly of the work.

We moved to Cookeville the 1st of February and I am now in the process of finishing my school work at Tennessee Tech. It makes it somewhat difficult working full time with the congregation and going to school but things seem to be doing fairly well. I was especially happy to have the opportunity to complete my college work and may be able to get my Masters before I leave here.

Your work attracted me from the standpoint that I am now in the midst of doing two years of work in French. It would certainly be a proving ground to be able to preach some in French. Maybe sometime in the next few years that could be possible.

I would like for you to put me on your mailing list. We are not in a position now to render any assistance due to our full support of R.C. Walker, Sr., in Radford, Virginia. This amounts to \$541 per month. Last year this congregation spent one third of its budget on mission work....Give my best regards to your wife. We send you our prayers.
