Dear Dr. West:

I am extremely regretful to have to inform you that I will be unable to attend the extension classes at Murfreesboro this semester. My work with the Broad Street Church is making increasing demands of my time. The work on my M.A. at Tennessee Tech is demanding, my family is to have an addition within the next few days, other considerations and obligations during the next two or three months make it imperative that I not engage in the program.
