Dear Randall:

I was informed by M.L. Robbins that you had contacted him. He appreciated your interest and has taken proper note of it.

Our whole situation is in an unusual stage. The planning committee has completed its work. The final report and recommendations of this group have been presented to the Elders. As so often is the case, the Elders have not acted. It is my opinion that they will approve the report and implement the recommendations but at this period everything is in flux.
