Dear Congressman Evins:

I have just read with happiness the announcement of your new responsibilities in Congress. The people of this District are extremely fortunate in having a man of your dedication and ability to represent them. I am, also, happy to have learned through Dick Mitchell of his new responsibility. Dick has been a strategic person in our work here at the Church and will be missed tremendously.

The Broad Street congregation is now in the midst of planning for the next fifty years in our service to the community and in the presentation of the gospel. Involved in this important planning is the need for some basic information which we hope your staff will be able to send to us. If at all possible, we would like to know of any population studies that have been made relative to our area. We are interested in such things as projected population over the next 75 years, birth rate, average size of families, and break down into youth, mature, and elderly or other categories. Any information akin to the suggestions I have just made will be deeply appreciated by the membership and leadership of this congregation.
