Dear Bob:

No individual feels better than when he is convinced that he is wanted and needed. Your recent letter concerning the work at Huber Heights was deeply appreciated for that reason. I deeply appreciate the interest and time you took to write such a letter. The fact of the matter is that our work here will be slow and difficult with as many internal as external enemies to fight. I also know that I can never expect to be remunerated to any degree near what the brethren there are willing too offer. This obviously is an important matter. The fact remains however that I have an obligation and must meet it if at all possible.

I am more convinced than ever of the future of the Huber Heights group. I know of no place that I would rather work or where greater co-operation and success can be enjoyed; but I must decline the offer at least for the time being. I may however be fired any day.

We send you and all of the brethren there our most sincere prayers and deepest best wishes.
