1. Article by Billy Graham. <sup>note: one "condition" God cannot forgive.</sup>

2. Does the Bible teach: a sin is possible which God cannot + will not forgive?

*Note: Sin = transgression of God's LAW, or omission, neglect or reject the LAW. any unrepented of sin is unforgiven sin. One, has no forgiveness. non-penitent.*

ch. 12: a. apastles accused of violating the Sabbath day. (Pharisees, the adversary.) 1-8.

ch. 12: 2. a paralytic healed on the Sabbath in the synagogue. 9-13.

ch. 3. Jewish leaders "out to get Jesus." Hunting for something. ⊕ 14-15.

(3) a. Healing:

4. A devil-passessed man - blind & dumb. Heeded sight & speech. Was instantaneously healed & the people acknowledged Jesus as Messiah.

5. The Pharisees' response: Blasphemy! against Christ.

6. Study of Blasphemy: "an impossible condition." Explain to others!

a. Gr.: to injure (with words). Abusive speech. Defaming. Railing. Revile. Evil-speaking. "speaking contemptuously of sacred things."

b. when & why Jesus was accused:

(1) Matt. 9:1-8. Cured a palsied man! Blasphemy: a false (words) claim. Usurping God's exclusive sin - forgiving prerogative! man claiming God's powers.

(?) Couldn't these people SEE? Reason? Believe?  
V. 8. People did! (2) Matt. 12:14-16.

Compare: Mk. 2:1-13. Tremendous following.  
Lk. 5:15-26. " "

(2. Jesus on trial: Matt. 26:63-68.  
(Mk. 14:59-65 - same!)

(3. John 10:21-33. a man claiming to be God. O.T. prophecies predicted a coming Messiah! Why not NOW!!  
(no other explanation! Why not just accept the facts: (things done! per empirical evidence (human-observation)

c. Blasphemy against the H.S.: "is/was to ascribe the acts of the H.S. to an evil source - the Devil."  
(Chas. R. Roberson. p.84.)

(Mc Garney. P.303) Blasphemy against the Spirit consisted in saying that Jesus had an unclean spirit. a lie. Linked Jesus to Satan. False.

- Note: Blasphemy can:
1. begin in ignorance or error of the mind & heart. (thoughts)
  2. Continue in hurtful words against God's work - any part of it or person!
  3. Conclude with harmful acts against God's anointed. (prophets, priests, preachers or teachers.)
  4. Note: "General": "any sin revealing constant QUOTE:"

7. How is/was Blasphemy against Jesus blasphemy against the H. S.?

a. Matt. 3:13-17. H. S. anointing was God's way of Power-giving.

<sup>Led controlled!</sup> Jesus "overwhelmed" by the H. S.  
<sup>was</sup> John 3:30-36. most powerful of all.

b. John 14:26-27. H. S., reinforces gospel of Jesus! all does.
