3. "Dictator" - One with Supreme Power & Authority.

✓ old Greek study method: enthymeme, then bombardments of proofs
I Jesus, nor anyone else, ever used this term. It identifies the Lord's role on earth and in Heaven perfectly.

A. Note: a "benevolent Dictator," like a benevolent monarch, is the best possible governmental arrangement. ~~possible~~
why? Only God is meted out by the one in Supreme authority.
