Either Dulles International or Washington National are easily accessible from our apartment. Cab fares in this place are exorbitant, so call us. Our rates are cheaper. We hope you will have some spare time for sightseeing and visiting. Try to wait and go back on the 11th if you can.

We're sorry that we were so slow in answering, but the letter first went out to our friends in Vienna and we have only recently dug out our envelopes and stamps and cleared a path to the typewriter.
