I was troubled by the enclosed script when I first heard it on radio and then when I read it. I would like for you to read it and respond in any way you see fit. Your response, however, should be directed toward those with whom it might count. If you have a close relationship with Batsell and feel strongly enough about it, you might write to him. If you would like to share your observations with Bob Scott, who is in charge of script production of both radio and television, you might write him. If you want to direct yourself directly to Clois Fowler, who is co-ordinator of all Herald of Truth radio and television, you might write him.

You may, however, feel that this does not warrant any special action - if so, feel free to act as you choose. I did want to give you this message and to let you know of the general direction that Herald of Truth radio and television is taking.

You should be very discreet in any letter you write these men so that I am not further cut off from effective ways of relating to them. You need not indicate the source of your copy of this lesson unless directly germane to what you are saying. Otherwise, I would think it good judgment that my name not be included in the letters you write to responsible parties.
