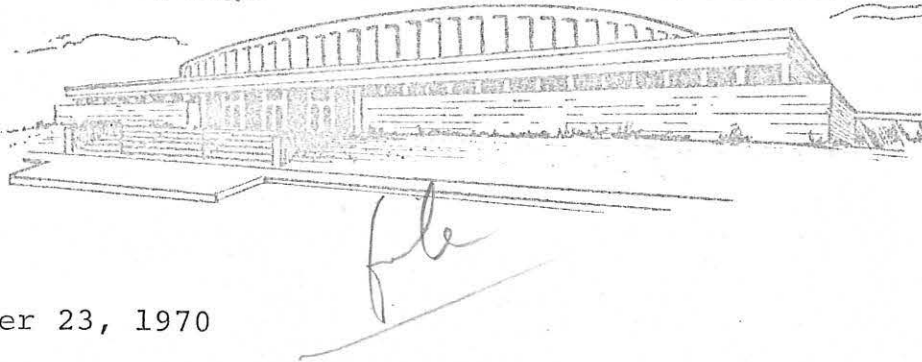

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

More than two years ago I had at least two serious and lengthy conversations with Doug Dalzell regarding his convictions about participation in war. I have counselled with more than fifty young men struggling with the same concerns. I found Doug Dalzell to be one of the most serious and thoughtful, if not the most serious, of all the young men with whom I have discussed this matter.

I knew Doug Dalzell as a very young man and have watched him grow to young adulthood. His entire life to date, as I have observed it, testifies to an attempt to live consistent with convictions he considers personally valid and true.
