Dear brother Lemmons:

I appreciated your editorial in the May 26 Firm Foundation regarding Campus Evangelism. With the exception of what I personally believe to be an overplay on the hiring of Dudly Lynch, I believe your article was extremely well balanced and incisive. As one who participated in all but three of the Campus Evangelism seminars, I believe that you have grasped both the urgency of reaching the campus and the overwhelming problems related to the thrust of present day churches of Christ to the campus.

I frankly know of no one who can span the gap between local churches and the campus, but I remember a man in the Old Textament who felt like I did and was very surprised by the Lord's announcement that 7,000 followers had not bowed the knee to Baal.
