Sister Morrison is the wife of brother Woodie Morrison, a gospel preacher who most recently has preached for the Collegiate Heights congregation in Dayton, Ohio, and is now completing his baccalaureate degree at Pepperdine. I know the Morrisons well and recommend them highly. I believe that sister Morrison has represented the matter accurately and that the young man ought to be offered an opportunity to apply for help if you have anything open.
