Memo to: Dr. George Gurganus

I have just finished looking carefully at my schedule for 1970. I wanted to see how many Tuesday nights I had scheduled out of town during this first semester. As you know, I had not only planned to attend your class on Missionary Principles but I wanted to take it for graduate credit. It seems, however, that it simply isn't meant for me to get serious about more education. I have five Tuesday nights definitely scheduled in situations that cannot be changed between January 20 and May 5. I regret that this has happened but even with a tremendously limited schedule, I face these times when I would have to be out of the city as well.

I wonder if it would be possible for me to audit the class with the understanding that I would do all of the reading and with the understanding that I would have to be out on the Tuesday nights of January 20, 27, February 3, April 7 and May 5.
