I deeply regret the unfortunate circumstances in which you now find yourself. I read carefully your letter and felt very deeply for you. I can sympathize with the burdens you are bearing, especially in view of some of the recent findings by our Subcommittee on Administration of Justice-Law Enforcement of the Governor's Committee on Human Relations.

Unfortunately, there is nothing I can do in a material and concrete way at the moment on your behalf. We are attempting with further hearings to get at what it will take to provide fair and more equal justice for every citizen in our state. Your letter will make a valuable contribution in seeing that this does take place.

I thank you for having written and I assure you that our efforts continue to allow citizens to move with complete freedom and lack of fear.
