Dear John Allan Chadk,

I received your letter of Dec. 3, 1969, thank you. I'm glad to know that you're informed of my disposition by Don Drummond. He & I have been corresponding since my days in the Lubbock County Jail.

Sir, it will be a year since I came to Rusk, this month (1-7-70) and as of yet have I to hear anything, from Lubbock, concerning my return to society.

I have told my attorneys that I was innocent of the crime, because of lack of data it was decided, by those "concerned," to send me to a mental institution. Why? Because a "scapegoat" was needed to cover up for the effectiveness of the authorities in Lubbock, then the injustice is continuing & I'm have no freedom.

In this hospital, which I'm at, my paper for certification are ready, i.e. I'm not considered sick. All is well here, but still no word from Lubbock, with regards to my release:

Spiritually I'm okay, but legally

I need help, I would be very grateful, I know you can help, if you would help, may be by getting in touch with Lubbock authorities & ask them to do me justice. I'm suffering for someone else's crime.

Hope to hear from you soon.
