Dear Dr. Arnold:

Paul Williams, in a recent letter, tells me of the great work you have been doing with him in the congregation in downtown Monrovia. I had the privilege of spending two weeks in Liberia in 1969 with Paul and a number of other brethren from the states. Needless to say, I have been interested in the work there ever since.

I am so pleased that you are working with Paul. There has, at times, been an understandable tension between the missionaries from the states and the work being done in downtown Monrovia. I have been an observer of these tensions since the beginning of the work in Liberia. I have difficulty knowing how to deal with it because of my close personal friendship with Roosevelt Wells and Andrew Hairston, as well as my respect for the faith and service of Billy Nicks and his wife.

I believe your working with Paul in the congregation there is one of the solutions to this tension. I pray that God will continue to bless and direct your efforts with them.
