We thoroughly enjoyed the pictures you sent with your recent letter. It helped us recall such a pleasant evening celebrating Janice's birthday. We were so pleased to be a part of your family gathering at that special occasion. Our entire family still remembers it with great delight.

Now for the big news. I have resigned the Highland pulpit as of May 31, 1971. On that very day, Monday May 31, I will enter the University of Texas Law School at Austin. I will go to school for 27 straight months, finishing my law degree at the end of that period. We have already purchased a house in Austin and everything seems to be going very smoothly regarding all of the details of our leaving here and moving there.

Following Law School we have no plans at this time. We could, at that point, come to California, or go any one of another dozen places. We will simply be sensitive to what the Lord wishes for us. We will want to find the best situation for our ministries to others. This could mean my going back into the pulpit. It could mean my either practicing or teaching law. It could mean any one of a dozen other things. We are very much at peace about the decision and believe that the Lord will make it very clear at the proper time what we should do with this additional training and experience.

We regret that we will not be near Janice again next school year and yet there will be many occasions for our returning to Abilene when we will get to see her, should she choose to come back here next fall. We certainly want this move to in no way diminish our friendship with all of you there. We
