Thank you again for letting me be a part of the Lectureship. I appreciated it deeply.

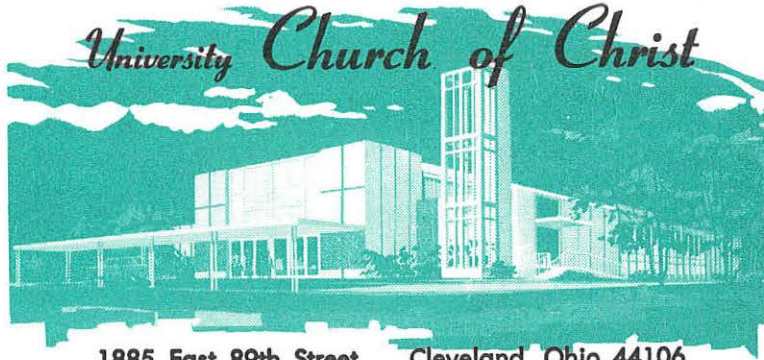

I am in receipt of your letter of April 13, with appreciation, as always it was good hearing from you. We are so thankful to have had you attend our Lectureship, and speak on the Program, your messages were so Gospel filled, and needful for the times of this generation. Thanks so very much for the copies to be used for our publication.

I do apologize greatly for allowing myself to become so engulfed in responsibilities I didn't have time to talk with you as I desired. I am sure that you can understand my role of responsibilities during the Lectureship. We consider that our Lectureship was highly successful, our registration was around 400, the day sessions carried about 500 and the night sessions 1,000 upward. We consider this to be exceedingly good especially in this section of the country, too this being the first time a Lectureship of this nature was conducted.
