The Broadway church of Christ needs to find a preacher to send to Clinton, Iowa. The Clinton area with its population of 50,000 people, has tremendous possibilities for the Lord's Church. The fertile agricultural area faces rapid industrial expansion, and it is expected that the church can grow simply because of the influx of Christians from other areas of the nation.

We would like to secure a man who would be able to work well with the small group now present in Clinton. The man's education should include the minimum of a bachelor's degree, preferably from a Christian college. Because of the fact that the Eastern Iowa area is a mission area, the man must be mature enough to withstand the pressures of this type of work.

The support for the preacher at Clinton will be provided in full by the Broadway church of Christ. Housing is provided by the Clinton church. No fund raising for support will be required for the man to begin work.
