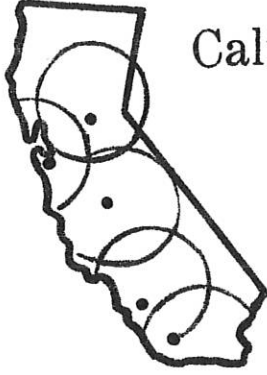

Thank you for your letter dated November 10 relative to the questionnaire. It was my pleasure to help in any way possible regarding the Herald of Truth programming.

I also appreciated your telephone conversation concerning Charles Collins. I talked with our elders and it was just as I thought. Charles does not have any authority relative to payment to Fidelity or any other firm. In fact the only payment that had been held was on the billboard advertising with Foster and Kleiser. They did not fulfill the total number of billboards that had been billed.

Stockton's problem really has nothing to do with our Sacramento Campaign or Charles Collins. It is their own personal involvement with Fidelity. I am sure this will be handled to the satisfaction of both parties.

Brother Collins does have problems, we know it perhaps better than anyone. He stepped out of his bounds and there is very little we can do to correct this with the exception of curtailing future events where he is concerned. He tries to be sincere and enthusiastic about his involvements and even an intimation that it was otherwise could bring about another mental breakdown. Therefore, please keep this confidential because the only real problem was his comments to Fidelity which was not authentic nor authoritative.
