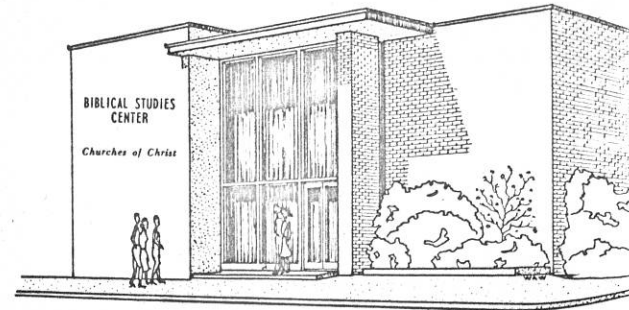

Dear John Allen:


We really appreciate you here in Austin and your recognition of what communications means to the mission of the church.

I really did appreciate what you said at Southside the other night. Especially the implications of your remarks about the communication industry and what it communicates by its very existence as well as its misdirected purposes at times.
