Dear Harold:

I have no knowledge of the missionary whose name you mentioned in your last letter. I have read reports from him on various occasions and would have to assume that he is a good man. You might write Dr. George Gurganus at the Harding Graduate School of Religion for more information regarding this man.

My plans remain that I will be in McMinnville on Sunday, June 4, to begin our gospel meeting that continues through Friday evening, June 9. I am looking forward to being with you and with the members of the Arlington congregation. I hope during that week to get to see a number of people whom I can personally thank for their continued support of our radio and television ministry. Present reports of baptisms and response from listeners seem to indicate a continually increasing response to our programs. We really haven't begun the real work, I believe, that will bring even greater response in the months ahead. Pray for this ministry in which you have such a vital interest and to which you have given such unselfish support.

It will be a pleasure to be with you that week in McMinnville. I would like to keep my days as free as possible. I can understand if the brethren strongly insist on noon meals; otherwise, if we could work it out, I would rather have only one meal out each day at the evening meal, but I am leaving that entirely to your discretion. If I can have the days for study and work that I need to be doing, it will be extremely helpful to me. Of course, I can understand any visits we can make with prospects and others that may need to respond to the invitation each night; otherwise, I hope you can help me keep my days as free as possible. Thank you so much for a friendship that has meant a great deal to me.

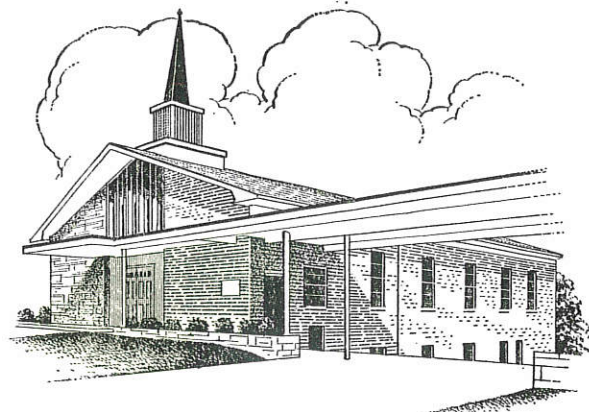
