Dear Sister O'Dell:

We have all been highly concerned about your condition. Several have asked me during the last few days about your operation and its results. I certainly hope that this letter finds you rapidly improving and planning to be back among us soon.

I had wanted to call on two or three different occasions but being out of town during the last three weeks almost constantly prevented me from doing so.

Your letter just prior to the operation suggested that your neighbor would call when she received a report from you. I have received no message and therefore wanted to write expressing the best wishes of the congregation and myself for your rapid recovery. Last week I was in Nashville for four days but driving back and forth every night prevented me from visiting with you or learning of your condition.
