Dear Dale:

I am sorry that I have not written you sooner but my responsibilities here did not release me until a few days ago to go to Nashville and visit with the officials at David Lipscomb. There seemed to be some agreement on their part in allowing you to live with some family in Nashville, even though no definite decision was made, for as you know this is highly irregular. The big factor with them seems to have been your past academic record in high school. They suggested, however, that if you would send a transcript of your high school grades to them they would review it and make a decision.

I am now suggesting that you would probably be able to get in at the Harding Academy, Harding College, Searcy, Arkansas, with greater ease than you are at Lipscomb. If you would direct a letter to Mr. Mason, President of the Academy, requesting admission you would probably receive a favorable reply.

Please be assured that I am thoroughly concerned about you and your future. You can be a great force in the Lord's Church. It will depend entirely upon your ability to surmount the obstacles that are placed before you and to continue steadfastly in your faithful obedience of the Lord's commands.
