You are probably wondering by now what happened to Sue and me last Sunday evening. The story is a long one and only one thing is certain, we didn't get to call you or come by when we came through Dyersburg. Seriously, we were detained in Caruthersville after the services until around 10 o'clock. We had to wait for the ferry at Cottonwood Point for almost an hour. I also had my Aunt in the car with us who was coming to visit my Grandmother and she was anxious to get to Lexington. The late hour at which we arrived at Dyersburg coupled with the passenger we were carrying caused me to decide that I should not call.
