Dear Brother Cawyer:

As we make plans for the coming year and especially for the time when I will move to Abilene, which now appears cannot be earlier than August, I do want you and the committee to keep in mind the tremendous need that I will have for a researcher once I have moved. I am concerned that my willingness to allow the one we have been using to be dropped is not misinterpreted to mean that there will not be a great need for such help once I have begun working full-time with the program.
