Dear Tom:

I am experiencing some difficulty with my "pint-sized" brethren here at Broad Street. The Finance and Administration Committee have made quite a point of determining whether we are using Broad Street supplies in our Herald of Truth work. They have also questioned postage expense and use of Broad Street letterheads for my correspondence.

Would it be possible to go ahead and have some letterhead made up with my name on it? Will it be permissible for us to buy the necessary materials, such as, legal pads, shorthand pads, etc. for our operation here? If this is agreeable, what procedure should we follow for billing?

I have written Brother Cawyer about this also sending him a bill for the quarter's lease on the typewriter my secretary is using. This only amounts to approximately \$38 but was a matter that my people here wanted to question since the typewriter was being used exclusively by Mrs. Castleman.

I regret having to mention these petty matters. The very fact that I have leaders who would be so concerned reflects on my work as well as on them. Any suggestions or help you can offer along this line will be appreciated. So far, I have heard nothing from Brother Cawyer; and when I mentioned this to Wally on the phone the other day, I didn't get any definite answer. So, old buddy, I've turned to you.
