Dear Bob:

I regret being unable to attend the meeting in Detroit this past week. I believe it is very important that we conserve whatever funds are being made available so that they can go directly to you and to the actual work being done.

In view of the many "unknowns" I believe it best for you to push forward in your own work with rallies and youth programs gaining whatever experience they will provide. This in turn should start making clear ways and means for research projects and other materials for youth work. It may be best for Youth Outreach to be a local organization of men in Fort Wayne who will handle all funds and provide you the necessary salary and expenses to be free to work as you are now working without trying to move into any extensive research projects.

I do want to encourage anything that will materially affect the future of our youth and will look forward to future developments.
